**Riverside Walk**: At the time of writing works are virtually complete, bar minor snagging, and feedback has generally been very good. Memorial benches are being installed on new plinths as these are funded and "adopted" – if residents are interested in adopting a bench in memory of a family member please contact the Council for more details. We hope residents will find the area has been significantly tidied up and made more accessible and resistant to wear and tear. Works to protect the grass surrounding the Jubilee sign bench are also nearly

complete, and again wear and tear on the grassed surface should reduce as a

Around the Village: A new litter bin is being installed by the north-bound bus stop by The Furrows to address reported littering at this spot. A number of new grit bins have also been placed around the village to cover additional areas. However, the number of new bins that can be funded and maintained is limited to what can be achieved with Council's resources. We'd therefore ask residents to check the web-site for the map showing the location of their nearest bin for use as and when necessary. The Council is liaising with the local schools to ascertain whether all parties can get together to clear The Avenue in times of heavy snow, and will provide an update when discussions have progressed. Signage is being installed at each end of the Community Centre boundary verge on Station Rd to prevent pedestrian access along this route, which is extremely unsafe for both pedestrians and drivers. There is now a cut-through from the Community Centre to the new Co-Op and we'd encourage residents to use this safe route whenever possible. A ramp is being constructed in the Cemetery car park to increase accessibility to the Jubilee Garden of Remembrance.

**Silver Jubilee DVD showing**: A number of residents enjoyed the January showing of the film taken during the Silver Jubilee in 1977. It's been agreed there will be another showing one evening in April for those who weren't able to attend the day-time event - the date will be published in the next Browser. For anyone who was at the '77 event, or had family in the village then, it should be an interesting trip down Memory Lane. Sincere and grateful thanks to Joan Minchin who took the original film, for recording this fascinating slice of local history.

Youth: The Police team is aware of the recent rise in the number anti-social behaviour incidents and is responding pro-actively to ensure this problem is tackled swiftly. The outreach sessions commissioned by the Parish Council last Summer did appear to help reduce this type of behaviour; during the weeks when sessions took place; accordingly, the Council has agreed to fund additional sessions in 2018 and these will now run between mid-April and the end of August. Grants will be sought to offset the extra



We might decide to 'give something up' so we can fit into that favourite pair of jeans or 'take something up' like an online payment to sponsor a child.

We have had quite a spring clean at St Lawrence's in the last year. We've had to think about what we need to give up and as we look to the future, what we might like to take up. Lent is far more than just an opportunity to 'spring clean.' The Church sees it as an opportunity to get off the treadmill and not only think about the beginning of Jesus' ministry, when he was tested in the desert, but also to reflect on the meaning of his life.

Jesus encountered many challenges and temptations on his journey that could have led him off course. And as we are reminded of what happened on Good Friday we could be forgiven for thinking that it didn't go quite to plan, but God had other ideas.

As we journey through life, we too encounter challenges and temptations and sometimes it is hard to stay on course. We could be forgiven for wondering how we fit into God's plan. God didn't abandon Jesus and he hasn't abandoned us.

So this Lent, whatever you decide to 'give up' or 'take up', I pray that you find the opportunity to get off the treadmill, perhaps come and sit in our 'spring cleaned' Church and stop for a moment to think about the meaning of Jesus in your life.

It is with great pleasure The Cotswold School announces **The Sharon Laws Sportive** in association with British Cycling.

Born in 1974, Sharon Laws, a former pupil of The Cotswold School, was a British professional cyclist who only turned professional at the age of 33, having previously competed in adventure racing and endurance-mountain biking. She began riding on the road to train and it was at this time she was noticed and her ability confirmed. She quickly became part of the 2008 Summer Olympics cycling team in Beijing and also in 2008 she won the British National Time Trial Championships.

Other accreditations included:

Winning the Women's 2012 Momentum 94.7 Cycle Challenge Winning the 2012 British National Road Race Championships

Part of the Podium Ambition Pro Cycling's squad for the 2016 season Part of the ITV4 commentary team for the channel's coverage of the 2017 Women's Tour

Holding a MSc in Conservation and working as an environmental consultant to organisations including the British Government, the United Nations and for mining company Rio Tinto in Australia.

In late 2016, Sharon was diagnosed with cervical cancer and from there underwent a year-long battle with the disease. She died on  $16^{\rm th}$  December 2017.

In the run up to the Tour of Britain that ran through Bourton-on-the-Water last September, Sharon kindly took time out from her treatment to inspire students at The Cotswold School with talks about a life in the professional cycling world.

**Will Morgan, Principal comments**, "Sharon was a lovely lady, a fantastic cyclist and good friend of the School. She even took the time out to speak to our children before heading into Cheltenham for radiotherapy a couple of hours later. Amazing support and dedication. We are delighted to be holding this event, in our 30<sup>th</sup> year, but we hope to hold as an annual event, as a long-lasting tribute to Sharon."



#### Lions Fund 'School in a Box'

At their February meeting Northleach & Fosse Lions club members voted to fund a 'School-in-a-Box' as one of three charity contributions this month.

The £155 School-in-a-Box has become part of the UNICEF standard response in emergencies. The kit contains supplies and materials for a teacher and up to 40 students. The purpose of the kit is to ensure the continuation of children's education by the first 72 hours of an emergency.

Club members also voted to make a £150 donation to the Great Western Air Ambulance charity. Since 2008 the service has been providing emergency care to people who are in a state so critical that they require specialist medical skills at the scene of an accident. Although the GAA is part of the 999 response service and works closely with the NHS, it is a charity entirely funded by local people.

A third donation of £200 will be made to the Helen & Douglas House charity. Based in Oxford but supporting families from surrounding counties, the charity cares for terminally ill children and young adults in two special hospices and through an outreach service. At Helen House, the world's first children's hospice, babies and children up to the age of 18 are cared for. At Douglas House they look after young adults aged 16 to 35.

In fundraising plans for 2018, the Lions club has agreed to run a further four 'Lions Famous Coffee & Cakes' days at Victoria Hall in Bourton-on-the-Water on 1<sup>st</sup> May, 9<sup>th</sup> June, 31<sup>st</sup> July and 1<sup>st</sup> September. At these events all proceeds will go to community and charity causes.

Monthly car boot sales will also continue to be run in the car park outside the Countrywide store in Bourton on Sunday mornings. Proceeds from the car boot sales will go towards supporting the club's own funds to cover administration and future promotional activity. The first two dates agreed are 8<sup>th</sup> April and 13<sup>th</sup> May.

Local residents of the North Cotswolds area are encouraged to put forward ideas for community projects which might be supported by their Lions club, whether it be through community service or fundraising activity.

If an election is not called, applicants will then be invited to meet with Councillors later in March, with the aim of confirming an appointment at the Council meeting on 4<sup>th</sup> April 2018. Applicants are asked to provide brief details of their background and give reasons why they would like to be considered. If you have any questions about the role or its responsibilities, either the Clerk, Sue, or I will be happy to try to answer them.

It's hoped there will be a good response to this appeal for an additional councillor as we do need to be at full strength in order to take forward the many projects and issues being progressed.

#### Reaching Great Heights For Sue Ryder -Leckhampton Court Hospice.


