## Parish Council Notes - Council Meeting 4th April 2018

**Riverside Walk**: The older benches along the grass verge are scheduled to be re-painted as part of their ongoing maintenance, and to complete the "face-lift" for this part of the village centre. 5 new benches have been, or are being, installed on the vacant plinths – at the time of writing only one plinth therefore remains available for sponsorship of a new bench.

Community Centre: A number of commercial leases have been renewed and new leases established recently which secures the rental income stream for the Centre over the next 3 years. Interest in the public rooms for hire remains good, and residents are encouraged to consider the Centre when looking for a local meeting room or event location. You are welcome to look around to see if our range of accommodation would be suitable. The Council has recently instructed a significant body of works to repair and restore the roof, guttering and windows of the building; these works were identified prior to Council purchasing the building and will therefore be financed from earmarked reserves and grants. They are part and parcel of the work needed to maintain a building of this age and stature, and should ensure it remains in good and serviceable condition for the foreseeable future as a continuation of George Moore's original and generous legacy.

Youth Club: Interest in the Club remains good, and whilst the Royal British Legion Hall provides an excellent base for activities at present the Council is considering whether a more permanent home can be found in the longer-term that will enable the Club to meet on additional evenings, and to provide a winter base for Outreach sessions. Outreach sessions have now begun, and experienced Youth Supervisors go out into the community to engage with young people wherever they gather. The sessions will continue until the end of August, and it's hoped this regular engagement throughout the Spring and Summer months will have some impact in reducing anti-social behaviour.

**Village traffic and congestion:** The Traffic and Footpaths Committee had to postpone the meeting in March with Councillor Paul Hodgkinson and the Gloucestershire Highways Manager, Danny Taylor, however, this is now taking place on 19<sup>th</sup> April 2018. Once we have an overview of how we can proceed to address various issues, we will share this information with residents and take views as a final proposal is developed.

**Council Taxes**: The Council is pleased to note that the precept set this year has resulted in a 4% reduction, and has dropped us 2 places lower down the "League Table" of Council Tax payments in the Cotswold District. As an example, the annual sum of £75.72 which will be paid to the Parish Council in 2018-19 by a Band D household in this village is virtually half that paid by a Band D household in Stow.

Village Green: The Council has now approved the submis-





I stand under a sea-blue, May morning sky Where the Windrush Valley is high, And start to see here and there and there, Orange tip butterflies everywhere!









#### Charity warns on the danger of summer fireworks

If celebrating this year's royal wedding, the public should think twice before setting off fireworks, releasing balloons and lighting sky lanterns to ensure wildlife isn't frightened. The call for restraint comes from the RSPB, which says that innocent celebrations could cause more harm to animals at this time of year as it is in the middle of the breeding season. The group is hoping to highlight the problems fireworks, balloons and sky lanterns, also known as Chinese lanterns, can cause and ask people to think about alternative ways to have fun this summer for the safety of animals. An RSPB spokesperson, said: "We need to remember that it's a crucial time for wild birds and other animals that are right in the middle of the breeding season. Normally, firework displays happen in November, when they pose less of a threat to wildlife, but celebrations held this May could prove to be a lot more dangerous. Animals may abandon their young if they become unsettled by the loud noises or smoke close to where they're sheltering, and if live fireworks come into contact with birds and other wildlife they can cause severe burns and injuries resulting in death. Similarly, sky lanterns and balloons can have a detrimental effect on wildlife that ingest the remains or get tangled up in the debris, causing a slow, suffering death through starvation. We definitely don't want anyone to stop having fun, but we want to remind people that there are other, more wildlife-friendly ways to celebrate."
