Parish Council Notes – Council Meeting 6th June 2018

Police & Crime Meeting: Cllr Paul Hodgkinson chaired the village's fourth public meeting on 24th May to review issues and actions arising from the previous meeting held in November.

Residents, members of the local police team and parish councillors discussed what could be done to address anti-social behaviour, action to cut speeding traffic and communicating with residents the best ways to report crime. The full notes from this meeting are available under the Police tab on the Council's website. The Gloucestershire Constabulary advises the public to report non-emergencies by completing an online form, by calling 101 or by emailing 101@gloucestershire.police.uk. For emergencies where a crime is in progress, life is at risk or someone has been injured, the public should call 999.

Sharon Laws Sportive: It is hoped that many of our local residents will be able to support the charity event on Saturday 7th July which is being organised by The Cotswold School in memory of Sharon Laws. The event is being held on Sharon's birthday date & the main cycle event is a 43-mile route, one mile for every year of Sharon's life. The Parish Council has commissioned a plaque to serve as a lasting tribute to Sharon which will be unveiled by Sharon's mum, Joy Laws, on the morning of the Sportive in the lobby of the Leisure Centre at 10 am.

WWI Victoria Cross Commemoration: The commemoration of the awarding of a Victoria Cross in 1918 to locally born resident, Major General Dudley Johnson will take place in the village on Saturday 10th November. This will include a History Society display in the Victoria Hall and an Army marching band to accompany the procession. On Sunday 11th November there will also be various local tributes that will form part of the nationwide centenary, namely beacon lighting on the Industrial Estate and Church bells ringing. Further details will be published as plans are confirmed over the coming months.

Chamber of Commerce: Council has been informed that, unfortunately, the Chamber of Commerce has been disbanded. Information contained within their website will be transferred to the Visitor Information Centre's website. Additionally, plans are in place for the Christmas tree and lights to be displayed as usual.

Community Centre: Works to refurbish the lead light windows throughout the Community Centre building and install bespoke secondary glazing to 14 of the windows to improve energy efficiency are scheduled to take place during July. These works have been carefully timetabled so that they will not impact on our room hirers, tenants or users of the Community Centre.

General Data Protection Regulation: Following the introduction of new legislation on 25th May, the Council is now compliant with the minimum statutory GDPR requirements. For further information, the Council Continued on page 2 column 2



- Preparing monthly/quarterly financial statements and reports to Council;
- Issuing and arranging payment of invoices;
- Preparing for the annual internal and external audits;
- Preparing and submitting quarterly VAT returns;

- Experience in a similar financial role using a financial accounting package;
- Knowledge of Scribe will be a distinct advantage as this is the council's current accounting package;

This is a newly created temporary, part-time position for 8 hours per week, with the possibility of more hours as the workload becomes established or as responsibilities increase. She told us the history of some of the heroes of the time and she also played popular songs of the time, the sweethearts, of course, being the singers. As she said these songs helped to push back the horrors of war and ENSA (Entertainments National Service Association) was formed by the Government to entertain the troops. Some of the heroes included Patrick Moore who enlisted aged 17 and joined Bomber Command as a navigator and Tommy Cooper who was called up and served in the desert. Roald Dahl, so well known for his children's books, joined the RAF in Nairobi and the film star David Niven joined the Rifle Brigade and then transferred to the Commandos. He also appeared in the film 'First of the Few' produced during the War.

Vera Lynn was always known as the Forces Sweetheart and we sang along with some of her most popular songs including 'A Nightingale Sang in Berkeley Square', 'Bless 'Em All' and 'Siegfried Line'. We also attempted 'Boogie Woogie Bugle Boy' with the Andrews Sisters, Anne Shelton's 'I'll Be Seeing You' and 'Lili Marlene', and 'Sentimental Journey' by Doris Day. Lynn also told us about some of the animals involved in the War including parachuting and mine detector dogs, as well the messenger pigeons and mules. We finished by joining Vera Lynn singing 'We'll Meet Again'.

Our next meeting is on 10th July when the speaker will be Lyn Bitterlin on the subject 'Hats from the Hat Shop'.

Message from the Church

aayubooven! tereta tulemast! kelang ka kgotso!

Visitors to the south porch of St Lawrence's may have seen the old sign saying Welcome! In over fifty languages, of which these three are perhaps among the most exotic. It reminds us of the universal appeal of Christ to 'every nation under heaven' as the Gospel says.

We forget how revolutionary this call was in the first century, and the Church has not always been true to its all-inclusive message of the unconditional love of God. As St. John says ' God is love and whoever loves is born of God'. Time and again circles of exclusion have been drawn, purporting to encompass true believers and seeing as alien anyone not filling the bill. (Catholics / Protestants / heretics/ atheists/ materialists.. depending on which team you played for). Jesus got into trouble with the religious thought police of his day by talking to undesirables and dining with society's outcasts. ' A wine bibber and drunkard who eats with publican and sinners !' they said, but ' the common people heard him gladly'.

So does it not matter what you believe? I write

as a Quaker, a member of the Religious Society of Friends, to give us our formal title. Among Friends you will find a wide spectrum of theological views as well as some who may feel that dogmas are more divisive than inspiring, the frequent cause of tragic inhumanity in history. Friends have no formal creed but for three hundred years British Friends have worshipped in silence, experiencing the loving embrace of the Spirit, taking inspiration from the life and teaching of Christ but open to truth from whatever source it may arise. (the work of the Spirit, said Jesus, is to lead us into all the truth.) Welcome in any language is at the heart of our life together. Our common experience leads us to work for peace and equality across all the boundaries that humanity has made. It is the experience of many newcomers to Friends' Meeting that they have felt a sense of homecoming. In the words of St Paul ' we are no longer strangers and foreigners but fellow members of the household of God'...

A welcome awaits you.

It is also a chance to appreciate the School Council, led by Mr Ellis and by the Head Boy Sam Blackman and the Head Girl Eva Shoemark. Thank you to these three for their support and commitment to their roles.

School Council 2017/2018 Summary of Activities

- It is the largest School Council to date with some 20+ members.
- E-Safety is a big concern and in discussions with our E-safety Officer, Mrs Peake, it was made an agenda item for all meetings going forward, citing the importance of online and social media issues. E-Safety Ambassadors will be part of an ongoing Ambassador programme going forward.

- There was a campaign for a new House tie, and in discussions with key members of staff and Wreal Sports, the idea has evolved to have House badges for the new academic year.
- They have made suggestions to improve the House system, including ways to strengthen reward trips and promote individual houses through competition.
- They attended the annual Stow Christmas Tree competition at Stow-on-the-Wold Church a vital part of building relationships with the broader community.
- Year 7 council members participated at the recent Midcounties Co-operative Members Day, celebrating the support given to School as well as promoting sustainability.

Our Visiting Summer Swifts - Need Your Help!

RSPB / Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust member, Di Wheatley

Calling all school teachers, parents, children and residents: — please can you help protect some very special summer visitors to the village — the **Swift**. The **RSPB** (Royal Society for the Protection of Birds) is conducting a **National Swift Survey** to look out for, count and record sightings of these increasingly rare visitors from Africa.



Swifts, Swallows and House Martins travel thousands of miles from their winter homes in Africa and the Mediterranean, to come and breed and raise their families here with us during our summer months. They are all quite small birds and are incredible flyers to watch, a bit like aerial acrobats – wheeling, diving about to catch flies and calling to one another. 
Numbers in BIG decline! Sadly, the RSPB (and other conservation groups), say that we're losing our swifts at an alarming rate. Reports suggest that their numbers have suffered a **massive 51% decline in just the last 20 years!**

How You Can Help? Record Swift Sightings, Protecting Nests. Swifts (swallows and house martins) return to the same places to nest every year. You could say it's a little bit like us having a favourite place to go on holiday! They nest in small cracks and crevices in the roof tops and under tiles or building overhangs on our houses and taller, usually older, buildings. One of the reasons for the big drop in the number of swifts is loss of nest sites. We humans like to renovate our buildings, fill in 'holes' in our roofs. While that's good for us, it can mean that when the swifts come back from their epic journeys, we've literally removed their homes!

The RSPB (and other conservation groups) are asking that we help our swifts by not only protecting existing nest sites, or – putting up special nest boxes, but also that we look out for swifts this summer and reporting the birds we see to them. You can do this on a special survey on their website. https://swiftsurvey.org/Rspb/Home/Index

What Swifts Look Like. Swifts are about the same size as their cousins, Swallows and House Martins – however a key difference is their darker feathers (they are brown all over with No white) and their long wings that make a more rounded, sickle shape that looks a bit like a boomerang. Other than early morn-

ings or evenings they also hunt for flies much higher in the sky than their cousins. https://www.rspb.org.uk/birds-and-wildlife-guides/bird-a-z/swift



Where To See Swifts? If you are in Bourton village from June through to August, before school starts, just as the shops open or in the early evening

look up to the sky, you might well see the swifts screeching about in small groups of 4, 6, 10 or even 12 birds. They race about above your head, quite low in the sky calling to one another – these groups are known as "screeching parties" and the birds really do look like they are having fun! They're out catching flies - preparing to either go out for the day or to come in to their nests at night. If you're lucky, you may even see them dart back into one of their nests in one of the village's houses or other buildings. For more information, the RSPB has an excellent section on Swifts on its website. You can also find out more about Swift bricks (nests) that you can put up on buildings.

Quacking Matters: Bourton's Ducks

Another call out for help for our feathered friends. This time it's for our resident ducks. It may be a surprise to learn that our ducks (mostly a breed called, Mallard) are now on the RSPB 'RED' list. This means that the numbers of this type of bird are in big decline across the UK.

We can ALL help our resident ducks by encouraging friends, parents, grandparents, to ONLY FEED proper duck food and to not feed the ducks bread. The ducks may be partial to the odd bit of stale white loaf but it has little to no nutritional value for them, swells in their stomachs and can make them very poorly – or, in the case of very young birds, it can actually kill them.

In addition to which, the bread that goes uneaten doesn't do much to help the health of our waterways. There are shops in the village that sell proper duck food and we would encourage buying that or bringing with them proper bird seed, duck and swan food pellets .


