Parish Council Notes

Parish Council Notes – Council Meeting 3rd April 2019

Tree works: In response to our article last month, all comments submitted by residents in respect of proposed tree works at Melville, or who requested the inspection of trees at Springvale, have been forwarded to Glos. Highways for their consideration. The Parish Council has confirmed to Highways that it supports the inspection of Springvale and other trees to ensure the maximum benefit can be obtained from any planned works. We'll keep residents posted with any updates from Highways as soon as received.

Local Elections: There was an uncontested election for Bourton in that only 9 residents came forward to fill the 11 vacancies on the Parish Council. Those residents have been returned unopposed, and the Council will be seeking permission to co-opt to fill the remaining 2 vacancies after the May elections. Please keep a look out for further details in the next edition.

Youth provision: The Council will shortly be starting the process of consulting with local young people and their families as to what type of youth provision they would like to see in Bourton in the future. The consultation will seek feedback from students and pupils at the local schools, as well as local youth groups, amongst other actions. A formal timetable and Action Plan for the consultation will be established in May and details will be posted on our web-site and on so-cial media so young people and their families are aware how they can be involved.

Speeding: Data produced by the recently installed Automatic Number Plate Reader equipment on Rissington Rd confirms a significant and continued drop in incidences of speeding, and the Council will consider the possible purchase of additional equipment next year.

Bye-Laws: The Council did not receive any objections or representations to the new bye-laws during the consultation process, and is now able to make these bye-laws which will come into force on Monday 13th May - please see the separate article on page 14.

Defibrillator: A new defibrillator has been installed on the outer wall of the Community Centre, by the Police parking bay which is visible from Moore Rd. S.W. Ambulance has been advised of, and has inspected, this equipment, which is now operational.

Tourism Survey: All comments received from residents will be sealed on the deadline for response, and responses will be collated and put into a report by an independent assessor. The report will be publicised as soon as available, following which the Council will consider comments and establish what actions can be taken.

Angela Panrucker was the Speaker at our meeting on 9th April on the subject of 'Curious, Quaint and Quirky Gloucestershire'. She brought photographs of some of the many unusual and surprising sights, both small and large, and which I expect most of us miss when driving or walking around the County. Angela said that one of her interests was pub signs and their history but often when out she would also spot something else which she would photograph - not all old and not all necessarily quirky.

She said that Churchyards and Churches were a goldmine for quaint and curious sights but which were sometimes well hidden away. The Green Man often appears in Churches and also on Pub signs, and in Bisley there is a Poor Souls Light which I had certainly never heard of before. There were photographs of maypoles, unusual village signs, stocks and lockups, trade signs, octagonal pillar boxes which are quite uncommon, mile stones and finger posts for directions, and then topiary in various shapes and sizes. All in all it was a fascinating view of what is all around us.

Our next meeting is on 14th May at the Victoria Hall when Helen Plumb will be talking about 'Just Gems' which promises to be very interesting.

Angels 10k – 7th April

Six members from Bourton Roadrunners visited the village of Ashleworth, near Hartpury, for the Angels 10k; the third event in this year's Gloucestershire AAA Road Race Series. First home for the club was Darren Long in a time of 37:41 - good for the challenging course – 5^{th} overall in the



race and 1st MV45. Next was John Gibson in 48:35 – 1st MV65, who was being chased all the way by Susan Hunt (50:27) who was 1st LV50. David Turnbull won a fine battle to the finish line with a fellow vet-runner to finish in 51:05. Liz Hulcup and Gill Carrick were within seconds of each other, with Liz just having the edge, finishing in 54:22 and 54:31 respectively.

Standard Distance British Duathlon Age Group Championships – 7th April

At Bedford Autodrome, Margaret Hollamby competed in the Standard Distance British Duathlon Age Group Championships. Winds of 19 mph made the course tough, particularly the bike section, and resulted in overall slightly disappointing times. However, Margaret managed to come home with a Gold Medal in her new Age Group, having completed the 10.2km run, 38km bike and final 5.3km run in 2:33:39. Her next challenge is the World Duathlon Age Group Championships in Pontevedra, Spain at the end of April, as a member of the GB Age group team, where competition will be stronger.

Highworth 5 miles - 7 April.

Ian Tolfts (supported by Jo on her bike) was the sole club entrant for the Highworth 5 mile race. The race had a small field - just 151 runners as the date clashed with the Angels 10k - but was a well-run event. A chilly start and a keen headwind for the first couple of miles focussed the mind! As ever, the "hump" - the hill into Highworth - caused the legs to work hard. The winning Male time was 27:53 and wining female time was 32:29. Ian completed in 39:37, a PB, placing him 64/151 and 14th MV50.

THE SECOND SHARON LAWS SPORTIVE AT THE COTSWOLD SCHOOL A ROAD CYCLING EVENT TO RAISE MONEY FOR TWO CHARITIES

Following the success of last year's event, the second Sharon Laws Sportive will be held on Saturday 6^{th} July 2019 —a celebration of the 43 years of Sharon's fantastic life and the sport she loved so much.

The main route is 43-miles long honouring every year of Sharon's short life. There will be a longer 76-mile route and a short 14-mile loop for younger cyclists. At the end of the Sportive, those wanting a few extra miles can take on an additional circuit (not part of the Sportive) and complete an epic 80-mile or 88-mile ride through the beautiful Cotswold Hills.

Sharon Laws, a former pupil of The Cotswold School, was a British professional cyclist who only turned professional at the age of 33, having previously competed in adventure racing and endurance mountain biking. She began riding on the road to train and it was at this time she was noticed and her ability confirmed. She quickly became part of the 2008 Summer Olympics cycling team in Beijing and also in 2008 she won the British National Time Trial Championships. In late 2016, Sharon was diagnosed with cervical cancer and from there underwent a year-long battle with the disease. She died in December 2017.

Bye-Laws

Notice is hereby given that Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council has made new byelaws which will apply to land owned by the Parish Council within Bourton, with the exception of the Cemeteries and Allotment Sites which are subject to separate Rules.

The laws will come into force on Monday 13th May 2019.

The objective of the new bye-laws is to revoke the existing byelaws established in 1966 and replace these with a set which are more relevant to modern day life. The new laws will also facilitate greater regulation of unauthorised activities on the Village Green, in particular. The scope of the new laws is deliberately wide in order to address all reasonably foreseeable circumstances to future-proof them against the need for further amendment in the medium to long-term.

The new byelaws are displayed in full on the Council's web-site www.bourtononthewaterpc.org.uk and are available in hard copy from the Council office; an abridged version is displayed on the Council's notice-board opposite the Village Green. Signage will also be displayed in and around the Green to raise awareness of the new laws.
