**Council:** Nine Parish Councillors have now taken their seats for a four-year term. Please see the separate advert on page five regarding the co-option process to fill the two remaining vacancies on the Council. Cllr Bob Hadley was

elected Chair for 2019-20 and Cllr Bryan Sumner was elected Vice-Chair. The new District Councillor elected for Bourton Village is Cllr Nick Maunder.

**Village Litter Pick:** A pleasing number of residents of all ages joined in the Spring Litter Pick in April, and grateful thanks are given to all who gave up their time on a Sunday morning. A number of residents do litter pick various areas around the village on a regular basis and it would help considerably if additional volunteers came forward to join this group. Please contact the Council Office if you're willing to help more regularly.

**The Furrows:** Linden Homes are to install new signage to indicate the shared space on the highway at the development in order to improve road safety. GCC are to install bigger shades on the Belisha beacons at the new pedestrian crossing to reduce the level of light entering nearby properties.

**Dropped Kerbs:** GCC will be installing dropped kerbs between Copins Court and the Bourton Chase Phase III development. An extended dropped kerb will also be installed by the Parish Council on the High Street pavement opposite the Cotswold Sheepskin shop.

**Parking:** The Civil Enforcement Officers' hours have been increased following a request made by the Parish Council to GCC Parking. When the new Head of Parking has been appointed additional hours will again be requested.

**Bye Laws:** New signs will shortly be installed near the village green reference the bye-laws to replace the 1966 signs.

**Planters & Flower Beds:** The village planters and flower beds will soon be planted with summer flowers and hanging baskets will be installed alongside the village green.

**Tourism:** The Parish Council received 331 responses to the recent tourism survey and will be undertaking a detailed analysis to decide upon a way forward. Further information will be shared with residents as soon as practicable.

**Annual Audit:** The Council has just closed and approved its accounts for the year ending 31st March 2019. The period for the Exercise of Public Rights to inspect the accounts will take place this year between 17th June and 26th July. Further information is available on the Council's web-site or from the Council office.

We look forward to hearing from you.



#### **Key Stage 2**



#### Special Summer Visitors: Swifts, Swallows and House Martins

In recent weeks a special sight has returned to the skies above our towns and villages.

Swifts, Swallows and House Martins are back here to raise new families after making their epic journeys back across Europe and the Mediterranean, all the way from central Africa.

It can be tricky to tell apart at first. However, there are some key differences between them.

The Swift has darker feathers (they are brown all over with no white) and have longer wings that make a more rounded, sickle shape that looks a bit like a boomerang. They also make a distinctive screeching call as they fly about in groups known as 'screeching parties'.

The Swallow has a white underside with red feathers around its head and beautiful, long elegant tail feathers. The House Martin has a white underside and a stockier tail and white under its face. You're most likely to see them early mornings or evenings as they hunt for flies. The House Martins also seem to enjoy flying around in communal groups and has a chattering call as it flies.

https://www.rspb.org.uk/birds-and-wildlife/wildlife-guides/bird-a-z/swift Sadly, the RSPB (and other conservation groups), say that we're losing these special summer visitors at an alarming rate. Reports suggest that their numbers have suffered a massive 51% decline in just the last 20 years!


How Can You Help?

Protect the nests of these birds who return to the same places to nest every year. You could say it's a little bit like us having a favourite place to go on holiday!

While Swallows seem to like barns and stables and House Martins like to nest in the eaves under our roof tops, Swifts make nests in small cracks and crevices in the roof tops. Swifts also like to nest in taller, usually older, buildings.

## Bourton-on-the-Water Women's Institute



Sparkling stones, we heard from Helen Plumb, the speaker at our May meeting, had fascinated her from a very early age. Having collected minerals as a child, she graduated from University with a First Class Degree in Geological Sciences and then worked in the oil industry for many years. But she still had an abiding interest in gemstones and had received awards from the Gemmological Association, and so in 2006 Helen set up her own jewellery business, Just Gems, which was the title of her talk. Helen told us particularly about inorganic gemstones, minerals formed in the earth's crust such as diamonds, rubies and emeralds, and explained the important properties of the stone – beauty, durability and rarity. She then went on to tell us about the current trends in gem set jewellery, big gaudy pieces designed to impress, and also talked about garnet which can be found in various colours, tourmaline and spinel. In 2017 Helen opened her shop, Just Gems, in Winchcombe where customers can, with the guidance of Helen, a qualified gemmologist, select gemstones and discuss their design ideas.




