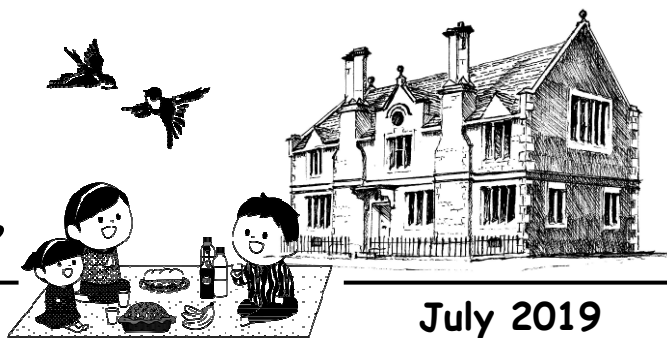

Parish Council Notes

Parish Council Notes – Council Meeting 5th June 2019

Village Centre: The pavement work adjacent to the village green is now complete. The Parish Council also agreed to install seven new cast iron bollards in various locations in the village centre to replace the rotten wooden bollards and these works should be completed in June. The yellow kerb blips will also be repainted. The hanging baskets and planters in the village centre have now been attended to.

Bye-Laws: An abridged version of the new village bye-laws is now displayed on the Parish Council notice board in the village centre. Updated signage will also be placed alongside the village green shortly.

Tourism: Comments received from the tourism survey are being reviewed. Please see separate article on page 5.

Youth Club: The Parish Council have made a proposal to hold the Youth Club at Bourton-on-the-Water Cricket Club as from September this year. This has to be approved by the Cricket Club Committee. Children are being encouraged to attend the Youth Club from Year 4 upwards.

Bloor Homes: Bloor Homes agreed to repair the boundary fence between Bourton Chase and Moor Lane.

Tourism

The Parish Council have undertaken an initial analysis of the community survey into Tourism and are now assessing the information to gather a more in-depth view of the community views and how best to address these.

In the meantime, the following provides an overview of the survey results:

Over 60% of respondents believe that tourism is good for the community.

Over 70% of respondents believe there are more tourists than in previous years, especially visitors on day trips.

Whilst 70% of respondents visit the village daily or 2-3 times per week, 86% said they avoid or go to the village less often.

The overwhelming response was in relation to the traffic and parking problems with respondents believing traffic is high [90%] and parking offences are not adequately enforced [71%]. With regard to parking duration, 59% of respondents would prefer this to be 30 minutes or up to 1 hour.

Presently, the Parish Council are actively pursuing traffic and parking challenges with Gloucestershire County Council Highways department and other authorities; we will continue to do this and our progress will be captured and shared in the minutes of normal council business.

We received 331 responses to the survey and are very grateful to those who took the time to give us their views. We welcome your comments on matters that affect you so please do get in touch with us.

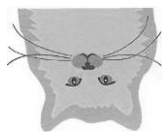

Last year a group of 40+ elderly volunteers and adult refugees, from St Chad's Sanctuary project from Birmingham spent the morning at Cold Aston relaxing and sharing a delicious halal lunch. Then to Bourton, some to explore shops, others hosted by Birdland and Greystones. Villagers helped them enjoy and understand these beautiful places. The day ended with tea and homemade cakes. They were so touched to receive a heartfelt warm welcome and experience of genuine British hospitality. All of us who took part from Bourton and nearby villages, gained immeasurably from having the chance to meet and connect with brave and interesting people from over 20 countries. It was humbling and emotional.

This year they will come by coach on Tuesday July 16th. Most of the refugees will be new. St Chad's work is to support people arriving freshly in Birmingham under the British Government Home office; help them start up their lives. St Chad's run a welcoming café, help with

English and our culture, and a hub distributing second-hand clothes (even underwear), shoes, etc.. Helping displaced people find the basics in a city. Many were rural before. Our goal for July 16th, is we reach out and learn from other cultures, give a sense of welcome and being appreciated as fellow human beings; who have experienced things we hope we never have to suffer.

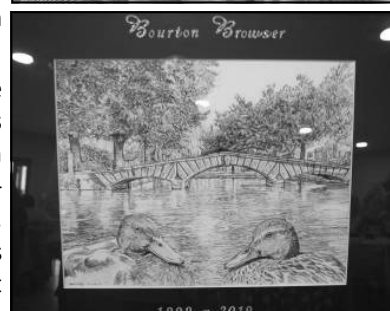

Residents at Edwardstow had the opportunity to chat to each other, the school children and the team about their memories of going to the British seaside and the times they have been abroad. 'Seven Years Inside' could have been the subtitle to Janine Kilroe's talk 'Working with some of the most Dangerous Men in the Country' at our June Meeting. She visited both closed and open prisons where some of the inmates had been convicted of terrible crimes.
