Parish Council Notes

Parish Council Notes - Council Meeting 3rd July 2019

Councillor appointments: The Council is pleased to advise that Kathleen Cronin and Stephen Senior were co-opted onto the Council to fill the remaining vacancies. Both Kathleen and Stephen are welcomed on board, and are thanked for coming forward to help progress the various projects and day to day running of Council's business.

Traffic Regulation Order: Gloucestershire County Council is proposing to introduce new and revised parking restrictions on sections of various roads within Bourton-on-the-Water with the aim of improving safety for motorists, cyclists and pedestrians, maintaining traffic flow and providing more suitable parking arrangements where appropriate. Proposal plans were presented at public exhibitions in March, with the opportunity for people to make comments. Having considered all the comments received some revisions are now being made to the proposals. These revised proposals will be advertised in due course via notices on-site in affected roads and via adverts in the local newspaper, with the revised proposal plans being viewable at Bourton-on-the-Water Library and at Shire Hall in Gloucester and online at www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/highways/traffic-regulationorders-tro-and-traffic-schemes

Enforcement: The police have scheduled additional patrols here during the summer months. In addition, the Council has requested additional hours with parking enforcement in the village. The Council also plans to put in place temporary signage in the village centre so that enforcement of the updated byelaws can be carried out.

Funstival Event: The Funstival Event has been arranged for 21st September 2019 at the Leisure Centre, Cotswold School Hall and the car park area. This is a FREE community event with lots of activities for all ages which will showcase what's on offer locally.

Library: Gloucestershire County Council has agreed to purchase a hybrid-vehicle to deliver preselected books, via community pick up and drop off points, to people who are unable to access library services. This step is being taken as the existing mobile library has reached the end of its serviceable life.

Allotments: The allotments will be entered into the Moreton Show competition again this year and we wish our allotment holders all the best, particularly with this year's challenging growing conditions.



We do not have talk in August as its all hands on deck for the -

Annual Village Show on Saturday August 24th

In July our arranged guest had to cancel and very happily Clare Henderson from the Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust came along, entertaining us with insights into the Trusts work throughout Gloucestershire and at the Jewel in the Crown – Greystones. Clare emphasised the need to create green corridors of Nature Reserves for wildlife to travel along, as housing, roads and industry block and destroy habitats, breeding and foraging areas. help wildlife in our own gardens too, Hedgehogs have sadly declined a whopping 97% since the 50's, if you are lucky enough to have one visit, a hole in the bottom of fences allows them to travel between neighbouring gardens. Visiting wildlife needs shelter, a place to rear young and find food to survive – An adult Blue Tit needs to find 1,000 caterpillars every day to raise a brood of 10.

Growing your own? You will need an insect to transfer pollen. Its not just Bees - Moths, Butterflies, Beetles, Wasps and Flies are all pollinators and produce larvae or caterpillars for birds. Trees and shrubs become places for creatures to make home and shelter. "weeds" could become pollen and nectar rich wildflowers that we are nurturing instead of removing. Seed heads for winter food, ponds for thirsty visitors or pond dwellers and snails are keepers! The joyful sound of a now rare Song Thrush bashing a snail shell is worth the odd nibble. Encouraging wildlife to our gardens has benefits for us too, as watching insects and birds is good for the soul.




What is a youth club and why are they so important?

A comment on a youth club Facebook post got me thinking about what is a youth club all about. You see to me, (a youth worker and youth work manager for a Gloucestershire based CiC), I believe youth clubs are vitally important to young people and their communities. However to this parent they seem to be all about keeping young people out of sight, and off the village green. I had also, in the same week, had a conversation with a parish clerk for a council who commissions CMAS to run youth clubs, she was amazed at the sorts of

informal education going on in the youth club as she had thought youth clubs were 'just a place for young people to socialise'

Allow me to share why I believe youth clubs are so vitally important. Firstly, they are places for young people to find belonging. This has been proven as a protective factor against mental health problems and likelihood to commit crime and ASB. Secondly, they are places for informal education, no topic is off limits and if we can't answer a young persons questions we probably know someone or somewhere we can signpost for answers. Finally, they are a place where young people can come and find a safe stable adult relationship which is vital for overcoming the poor outcomes associated with adversity in childhood. Sadly, some children will not find this at home, or at school which is why the chance to find this at a local youth club is so important.

Helping Nature

With the dry and warmer months here again, wildlife can have a tough time finding enough water to drink from as the puddles or water in ditches and streams they usually rely on either dry up or are harder to find.

Why not help them out by putting out a shallow dish of water and keeping it topped up every day?

An easy option is to use a plant pot saucer – either plastic or ceramic are just fine. Depending on how deep the saucer is, consider putting a stone in the middle so that smaller birds and mammals such as hedgehogs, have something to help them get in and out of the dish.

Then, choose a place that's in the open so that any visitors can't be easily ambushed by predators (or cats).

If you live near the edge of the village, you might be surprised to see the wide variety of creatures that come to take a drink – or even have a bath! Birds, foxes, badger, deer, hedgehogs and insects may all stop by.

Don't forget to top it up with fresh water every day and do give it a good rinse at least once a week to make sure it's clean and won't spread any nasty bugs to the creatures who come to visit.

It was a very sobering thought to realise that this may be happening here in the UK although we should remember that it is not all that long ago that a woman was regarded as the property of her husband and in the marriage service were the words 'to love, honour and obey'.
