Parish Council Notes

Parish Council Notes Council Meeting 6th November 2019

Xmas Tree: The lights on the village Xmas tree will be turned on 1st December 2019.

Choirs from both schools in the village and the churches will be singing on the village green as from 3.30pm on 1/12/19.

Metal Railings for the village green: The order has been placed for the metal railings for one part of the village green and installation of the railings is planned for early December 2019.

Litter: The Parish Council is working with CDC on trying to improve the litter/bin emptying service within the village.

Youth Sessions at the Cricket Club: The youth sessions on a Monday evening at the Cricket Club are going well with attendance numbers picking up.

The Furrows: A meeting had been held at the GMCC with Linden Homes, Cllr P. Hodgkinson and residents of The Furrows to try and work a way forward to implement a footpath/pedestrian area and to address road safety issues.

Crime Meeting: A meeting had been held at GMCC with the Police Crime Commissioner to discuss crime related problems within the village. The Parish Council have requested a meeting with the Crime Commissioner every six months. See separate article page13.

Police Officer: There would be an additional police officer for the North Cotswolds, based at Stow-on-the-Wold police station and they would be designated to cover Bourton-on-the-Water's issues as from January 2020.

Drainage: GCC has been notified of the blocked drain outside De La Hayes chip shop and contractors have been out to clear the problem. A re-visit to complete the job was scheduled.

Disused Railway Line: Grant funding is being sought to get enough funds to open up the disused railway line from Bourton-on-the-Water to Kingham for a walkway/cycle route.

Melville and The Naight recreation grounds: The Parish Council is obtaining quotations for additional recreation equipment for the older children in the village. A consultation on the new recreation equipment is to be arranged early 2020 for children, parents and members of the public to provide feedback before the Parish Council make a final decision. Grant funding is being sought.

Christmas is a story of hope – the story of a baby born out of wedlock in the backwaters of the Roman empire who would reshape human history – a story that helps us trust that small and apparently insignificant events and actions can make a difference beyond our imagining. A story that reminds us that most real change and transformation begins in small and often unspectacular moments.

As Christians, we are a people of hope. As Rowan Williams, former Archbishop of Canterbury said: "I am neither optimistic nor pessi-

mistic about the future: I'm hopeful. An optimist says it is all going to turn out all right. A pessimist says it is all going to turn out wrong. A hopeful person says it's possible that we can make it better. I believe with all my heart that it is possible to make things better... decide what's a good thing to do today, and the future unfolds out of that."

Whatever your political views, it is easy to fall into optimism or be pessimistic about politics and thereby abdicate our responsibility for thoughtful action. This Christmas, choose instead to be a person of hope; who believes their actions can make a difference. Vote thoughtfully and prayerfully. Ask your candidates about their vision of a good society, what they value and how they hope to achieve it.

Engage hopefully this Christmas, knowing that hope finds its expression in small actions which together begin to tell or create a Good News story.



Rare Birds and Visitors Benefit from £25,000 Project

A new project hopes to save endangered birds at Whelford Pools, a Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust nature reserve in the Cotswold Water Park.

Birds such as teal, pochard, gadwall, shoveler, willow warbler, marsh tit and mistle thrush call this wetland haven their home, however all are on the Red or Amber lists of Birds of Conservation Concern (BoCC).

The Red list now includes many beloved British species that were once a common sight, including turtle doves, woodcock, cuckoo, nightingale and curlew.

Whelford Pools nature reserve has long been home to a vast range of birdlife, including rare wildfowl and waders. For many years Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust have managed the reserve for wildlife but have struggled to tackle bigger jobs that required extra resources.


The Better for Birds at Whelford Pools project team of staff and volunteers have been carrying out several large practical tasks, including improvements to the woodland, reedbed and grassland areas of the reserve.

Now, a brand new accessible hide has been installed, with a special low viewing area for visitors with limited mobility and push-chairs. This is a fantastic new facility that will help to engage the local community with wildlife right on their door step, by giving everybody the opportunity to view the stunning array of birds that visit Whelford Pools

"This project has not only helped us to improve the habitat management at Whelford Pools for many species of bird, but the new hide will be a terrific and accessible place for visitors to enjoy the sights arising from these improvements. A big thank you to our funders", comments Tim Bevan, Senior Reserves Manager (South) at Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust.

The hope is that not only will this project give declining birds a helping hand, but that it will also encourage more visitors to experience the wonders of this beautiful wild place, and the wildlife that calls it home.

Being a parent has never been easy - it can be lonely, frustrating and overwhelming. Some of us have a fantastic support network of friends and family to help, but some of us don't. It is even harder for those dealing with additional challenges such as post-natal depression, rural isolation, multiple births or disability in the family. Home-Start Cotswolds train volunteers who visit families once a week and provide non-judgmental, compassionate and confidential support. This could involve anything from helping them access local services or get out to the park, to just offering a listening ear.

Sarah, a mum of three pre-school boys was helped by Trish, a Home-Start Cotswolds volunteer, but she says: 'I was worried about people talking in the town and judging me for not being able to manage.' When they first met, Sarah was also suffering from delayed post-natal depression. Trish explained: 'The family had just moved to the area and had a lot going on, with two of the children starting at a new school and nursery. Sarah wanted to be the 'perfect' mum and put a lot of pressure on herself'. Trish visited the family once a week and helped Sarah get out of the house, showing her places she could take the boys for trips out. Occasionally Trish would be with two of the children, so that Sarah could have some precious time with just one of them. All this helped boost her confidence and she started to enjoy being a mum.

Public Meeting on Crime - 21st October 2019 -

I called this meeting following the awful break in at the Post Office and a number of incidents of anti-social behaviour. Around 75 people came along – the biggest attendance I've seen for a meeting in the village recently. In attendance were Martin Surl, Police & Crime Commissioner, Inspector Simon Ellson and the Parish Council. Here are the key points: The police reported that the Cotswold District, and Bourton-on-the Water in particular, has one of the lowest crime rates in the country. However, no crime is acceptable and people have a need to feel safe.

Anti-social behaviour had increased in the last 3 months in various places in the Cotswolds. Effective neighbourhood policing is one way of combating this.

Good news - an extra Neighbourhood Police Officer specifically for Bourton-on-the-Water will be recruited in January 2020. There was a really positive response to this.

Drug use and reporting incidents - Police have had few reports of drug use but any observations should be reported either by using the 101 number for non emergencies, via email at 101@gloucestershire.police.uk, or by raising a community concern via the Gloucestershire Police website. Reporting enables Neighbourhood Policing to build up a picture and helps to enable more effective community policing on drug matters. There was concern expressed at the meeting that drug use was going unreported.

Youth provision - It was mentioned that universal cuts in youth provision had contributed to challenges with Parish Councils now funding local youth clubs. There was real praise for the work that the Parish Council has been doing with youth in the village. Grants from me (county council) and the Police and Crime Commissioner had helped, some of this has helped with new premises at the cricket club seeing an increase in attendance. It was agreed that regular local police engagement in the youth activities would have a positive impact.

PCSO visibility – whilst PCSO Charlie Symes' community alerts were very helpful it was also agreed to increase his visibility in the village.

Post Office raid – everyone recognised how the owners of the Post Office had coped admirably with the awful situation they faced. Martin Surl explained the significant complex policing activity going on into organised crime groups. These relate to high value crime such as the recent ramraids on ATMs. Success in countering this complex and dangerous activity does occur. However, only one person had been caught for the last 5 cash point raids. It was clear that we all want to see more police success in catching criminals.

Bourton Vale Gardening Club "A garden is a friend you can visit anytime"

The winter solstice on December 22nd marks the shortest day of the year, although light levels will then increase daily, temperatures still fall. Our garden wildlife will need plenty of help, by topping up bird feeders, keeping water bowls clear of ice, putting up bird boxes and cleaning those already in place.

Last winter with the help of a bird box camera gifted to me by my eldest daughter, I could watch fluffed up Blue Tits, sheltering during the winter months (a much appreciated and thoughtful gift if you are looking for Christmas ideas).

And when cutting garden greenery to bring indoors for festive decorations, it's a good time with secateurs in hand to take a few deciduous hardwood cuttings, although they could take up to a year to put roots down, it's easy and free. Cut lengths, 15 to 30cms long just below a bud joint, as that's where the roots will grow from and pot up into 50:50 mix of peat free compost and sandy grit or directly into your garden soil.

Visitors are very welcome to join us for our last meeting of the year on Wednesday December 11th. Seasonal and Festive is the theme, Pam Slater is coming along to entertain us with an evening of Holly and Ivy folklore and we are providing the mince pies and sausage rolls to have with a cup or two of hot mulled fruit juices, tea and coffee.

You may be able to purchase these kits at a discounted price from us at our events as well as through your local Neighbourhood Watch Scheme.

Check if valuables are on show

Check what valuables can be seen from the outside of your home. If there are items that may look tempting to a burglar remove them from view and make sure they are marked with a registered forensic marking liquid.

Wheelie bins, tools and heavy garden objects

Wheelie bins left out the front offer burglars help to get over your fences. Tools and heavy objects left out help them smash or force their way in. Put them away
