Parish Council Notes

Council Meeting 9th January 2020

Precept: The Parish Council unanimously agreed a precept of £162,261 for 2020/21 at the January Parish Council meeting. This would equate to a Band D property for the village of £90.44 per year which is an increase of £7.37 per year. A full statement on the Council's budget making process for 2020/21 is available on the Parish Council web site, or the information can be obtained from the Parish Council's office at the George Moore Community Centre.

Xmas tree / Planters / Hanging Baskets: Bourton Parish Council would like to thank the businesses who have already contributed towards the xmas tree / planters and hanging baskets in the village.

Anyone else who would like to contribute please contact Bourton Parish Council on the details below.

Metal Railings for the village green: The metal railings around a section of the village green are a temporary measure solely to protect the village green and will be removed in March/April 2020. Protecting this portion of the green will save the Parish Council approximately £2,000.00 per annum in putting the village green back into a good condition for the Spring.

Melville and The Naight recreation grounds: The Parish Council have now undertaken a public consultation on the new recreation equipment and are now collating the information received before making a final decision on which recreation equipment to have installed and which site. Grant funding is being sought.

Village Maintenance Contract: Bourton Parish Council invite companies to tender for the contract to maintain the village green, footpaths, verges, cemetery, allotments, playing fields and other areas for 2020-2023. For further details phone 01451 820712 or email clerk@bourtononthewaterpc.org.uk



Message from the Church

The Wind Blows

As I sit and write, storm Brendan has just about passed through and the clean-up operation in various parts of the country is in full swing. The incredible power of the wind is both a marvel and a terror, especially for those people who have had property damaged or suffered injury in some way.

The cause of wind is fairly well understood, different parts of the globe heat up differently depending on whether it is land or water and how close to the equator the particular spot is. The warm air rises and is replaced by cooler air that is denser. When these differences are very marked, the wind speed (movement of air) increases.

As with most things, knowing how something works and coming to terms with the fact that it is your roof that has just been ripped off is a very different matter. Knowledge is not the same as experience,

knowing about something is not the same as having an encounter with it.

What is true of the wind is also true of a relationship with God. It is possible to know about God, to have read books on theology, to have studied at university etc. but to have never truly encountered Him.

That is why Jesus lived a normal life so that people could encounter God through Him. Jesus said of Himself, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No-one comes to the Father except through me."

Relationship is the key of Christian faith, relationship with God through Jesus. The third member of the Trinity, the Holy Spirit, often appears as a wind, and it is that wind that blows in us to enable us to have that relationship with our loving heavenly Father.



5 ways to helping wildlife through the winter

Shorter days and freezing nights make this time of year tough for many creatures. Whilst some hibernate through the worst of it, others face the daily challenge of finding food and water to get them through to spring. With many of our favourite species struggling due to intensive agriculture, habitat loss and other threats, there is a real need of our help.

Here are 5 simple ways we can all lend a hand to our fellow creatures:

Feed the Birds

Birds can use a huge amount of energy just staying warm during the night, this means that come the morning, finding food is top priority. Providing a consistent supply of energy-rich foods such as suet balls (without nets is best so no legs or beaks get stuck in them) or sunflower hearts, can make an enormous difference to survival rates. This is particularly the case with the smaller birds that have to almost eat their weight in food each day as they have very little body fat to draw on.

Provide Fresh, Clean Water

Although this past month or two has seen us inundated with rain and there currently feels like we've got no shortage of water, having a safely located (away from potential predators), shallow bowl or dish of fresh water can really help our birds and other small mammals. Birds need to bath n order to keep their plumage in tip top condition and all animals need access to fresh, clean water – especially the case if we get freezing temperatures.

Check for Hibernating Animals

Hedgehogs, frogs, toads, newts, bats and many insects spend the winter months hibernating. By leaving the odd pile of leaves or logs and smaller twigs in an area of your garden or land area, you are providing a safe and cosy space for them to



get through the winter. Please, please encourage anyone you see about to light a fire to check for creatures sleeping there. And, if possible ask them to leave the 'messy heap' alone! Nature does not like things as neat as we do — and for good reason!

Prepare for Spring

Use the late winter months, when things tend to be quieter in the garden and on the land, to prepare for spring. Clean out existing nest boxes and maybe consider putting some new ones up too!

Be a Nature Champion

As well as taking practical steps to help on our land and in our gardens, it's just as important to help spread the word among our friends, family and those we work with. Sharing the things you are doing helps encourage others to do their bit too!

And as the saying goes, 'ripples make waves' so as we all do our bit, the greater the impact we will collectively have as well!

For those wanting to join like-minded folk, perhaps consider joining a local wildlife charity such as Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust (GWT). GWT owns and cares for Greystones Farm Nature Reserve which is right here on our doorstep. They have a café and a visitor centre (winter hours apply) and do lots of fabulous work helping our local wildlife. They also hold regular events and talks on wildlife. GWT relies on membership income, donations and legacies to help fund their work.



Bourton 10k Sunday 23rd February

Bourton Roadrunners hosts its annual 10k road race at 10am on Sunday 23rd February. We're always very grateful to Bourton residents for their patience and tolerance around the disruption this causes to village life.

This year, we're expecting around 700 runners and their supporters so we can expect increased traffic before and after the race. Thanks for Cotswold District Council and Bourton Vale Parking Ltd, we've arranged free parking for runners at both the main car parks in the village. We hope this will help us to manage traffic and encourage people not to find street parking or park at the leisure centre.

We have permission to close the roads in the inner village loop (Victoria Street, Letch Lane and Sherborne Street) from 9.30am to midday and the High Street will be closed from 10am to midday. The Rissington Road will be closed from 10.30am to 11am (eastbound) and from 10.30 until about 11.30am (westbound).

We'd be extremely grateful if people could avoid driving at these times especially the route from Landsdowne to the Rissington Road. If you do need to leave the village, please follow the instructions of one of the many marshals who'll do their best to help.

For those wanting to watch the race, and some of Gloucestershire's finest athletes in action, we'd recommend walking along the Rissington Road for a longer, uninterrupted view. The middle of the High Street, where the race starts and finishes, can get very congested and we need to keep the route clear for finishers from about 10.30am to 11.15am.

Once again our 10k is sponsored by Highbridge Jewellers and this year we're supporting the Parkinson's UK and the North Cotswold Foodbank. We're hoping to have representatives from both charities on the day so do please come along and find out a bit more about the work they do.


