#### **Parish Council Notes**

Council Meeting 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2020

**Notice of Vacancy for a Parish Councillor:** The Parish Council can now coopt somebody onto Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council. If anyone is interested in becoming a Parish Councillor to help the Parish Council make decisions for the benefit of the village please contact the Parish Clerk for a form to complete. Applications must meet the criteria of either being a resident of the village for at least the past 12 months or have worked in the village for at least the past 12 months.

Dead-line to receive applications has been set for 22<sup>nd</sup> July 2020.

A Vision of Bourton-on-the-Water Post Covid-19: The Parish Council is working with GCC and CDC on a vision of Bourton-on-the-Water Post Covid-19 times. For a short measure GCC and CDC are working on pedestrianising a part of the High Street and implementing additional traffic signage to help the flow of traffic and to ease congestion in certain parts of the village.

GCC has already put social distancing signs on the ground and street furniture reminding people to keep to the social distancing requirements in the village.

**Recreation Equipment:** The Parish Council is still working on providing new recreation equipment for the village but the final project will be a bit later than planned due to Covid-19 times. In the meantime this gives the Parish Council more time to look for further grant funding.

**Youth Club:** With the unlocking of Covid-19 restrictions the Parish Council are in contact with CMAS looking into opening up the Youth Club at the Cricket Club in the village hopefully in September 2020.

**Traffic Regulations Orders:** GCC is still looking to putting the new TRO's in place by the end of 2020 / early 2021.

**Bye-Law Sign:** A design is being worked on for the new Bye-Law sign for the village and will be put in place shortly. This will give the police the power to enforce the rules of the village set by the Parish Council.

**Emergency Plan:** The Parish Council have updated their Emergency Plan and it is available on their website.

**George Moore Community Centre:** The Parish Council is working towards opening-up the George Moore Community Centre early July 2020 as long as the gradual unlocking of Covid-19 procedures continue to carry on as they are. If anyone is interesting in booking the rooms at GMCC or require any guidance/information then please contact Jo on the details below.

Police: The police have been regularly in attendance at the village dispersing large groups of people and encouraging people to keep to the social distancing rules.


Next Parish Council Meeting: The next Parish Council meeting will be held on Wednesday 1st July 2020 at 7.00 pm via Zoom.

#### Re: Last Month's Business Community Update, 1

Further to the business update column in the Browser, by Andrew Lund-Yates, where his frustrations are visible.

Many have much sympathy with local businesses that have, through no fault of their own, had their income decimated by direct and indirect effects of the pandemic. Those allowed to operate through lock-down, and have shown imagination and resilience, are to be commended, and have our sincere thanks. And those fully dependent on visitor contact and trade, such as hospitality, have to endure extended loss, drawing ongoing sympathy, and needing support through their resurrection. We do get it!

However, like social media or not, on-or-off the sofa views have some validity and convey a message. There is a well evidenced flip side to peak loads of visitors in 'normal times' in Bourton-on-the-Water as in many tourist spots, where limited infrastructure and facilities get easily overwhelmed, damaging the visitor and live-in experience. Just recently, in this exceptional period, we have seen worse effects, and this trend may continue during the Covid ease-up period, when processes and people need to go slowly. However, a one dimensional business reason, even on rebound, is not a reason to ignore the local fabric and feelings.

My upshot is, we need visitors and business in some balance, but this place is not just a cash machine. The health, safety, environmental concerns and interests of people who live here, and those who identify with them, ought to be respected.

#### Re: Last Month's Business Community Update, 2

In reply to Andrew Lund-Yates Business Community Update. A number of social media comments that infer that some business owners, and the now returning visitors, are complete pariahs may well be justified by many residents of the village.

Those businesses that were able to stay open through the 'lock-down' are the very backbone of the village summer and winter, unlike some hospitality or gifty outlets that often close down during the winter months when the visitor numbers are less abundant. To call those who show a little negativity to be shameful is absolutely shameful in itself.

Mr. Lund-Yates lists a number of reasons for moving to this part of the country, one of which was affordability of property. Is he not aware that there are almost five hundred 'holiday lets' in Bourton-on-the-Water? Many of the properties for sale are snapped up by purchasers from away as they see these as a great business opportunity, thus putting them out of reach of locals hoping to stay within the area or first time buyers, which many of the cottages could well have suited. This, by its very nature, deprives the village of a sense of community as there are so many empty properties throughout the winter months.

Visitors are now part of the everyday life of Bourton-on-the-Water and we all have to respect their reasons for visiting, but for Mr. Lund-Yates to suggest that 'keyboard warriors', sat on their sofas with nothing better to do, should refrain from venting their feelings via social media is quite frankly also shameful. These are the very people who can keep people like Mr. Lund-Yates abreast of the feelings held by many residents of the village.

#### Message from the Church

As I write today (15<sup>th</sup> June) Churches are now allowed to be opened for Private Prayer (but not public worship). This is not an automatic right; very strict hygiene and social distancing rules apply. In our case for the Catholic churches at Stow and Bourton, we have to fill in a lengthy compliance document for the Diocese before official permission is granted. Because of the strict organisational requirements, we are only going to open at Stow for the moment, for two 'sessions' per week: Wednesday and Sunday evenings, 5 pm – 7 pm. (Please check our website stow-bourtoncatholic.net in case times are altered). We have had to reorganise the seating and rigorous cleaning has to be carried out before and after each opening. There have to be at least two stewards in attendance.

Because of social distancing, the capacity of our Stow Church is reduced to 33 places, which is fine for Private Prayer visits, but it would not accommodate our Sunday congregation, so we have to think again when public worship becomes possible. St. Edward's Anglican Church is much bigger than our Church and the Rector of Stow, The Rev'd Martin Short and I are pursuing the *possibility* of the Catholic congregation 'borrowing' St. Edward's for our 9 am Sunday Masses when public worship is allowed. I am extremely grateful to Martin, his diocesan authorities and parishioners for considering this initiative. This is a very exciting Ecumenical project and one good thing to come out of the current situation.

Two well-known and much loved members of the Bourton Catholic congregation have died recently: Eileen Bryant and Lisa Dinardo. Both were well known in the village. May they rest in peace and rise in glory. We send sincere condolences to their families.



# Lions Clubs' £160k boost for local Air Ambulances



President of Cotswold Fosseway Lions Club, based in Northleach, Lion Keith Messenger, says: "We know that air ambulance charities have been busier than ever during the coronavirus pandemic. They've faced considerable extra – unbudgeted – day to day costs – at the same time as lockdown has affected fund-raising.

Now, thanks to an emergency COVID-19 relief grant from the Lions Clubs International Foundation in the US, we can provide immediate support for this emergency service that touches lives in all our local communities."

Working with Air Ambulances UK, Lions Clubs compiled a list of equipment and supplies needed by individual air ambulance charities – totalling £161,468.

The equipment and supplies the Air Ambulance requested, which has been funded by the Lions Clubs International Foundation grant, includes isolation capsules and decontamination units, separation screens, PPE, ventilators, respirators and hoods, a thermal screening camera and monitoring system, compression devices, fluid warmers, an ultrasound cardiac probe, and mobile connectivity devices.

Heather Benjamin, Chair of Air Ambulances, UK said: "The donation of equipment and supplies by Lions helps Air ambulance charities to support the COVID-19 response and their communities in these extraordinary times and beyond."


