#### Parish Council Notes

#### Parish Council Notes Council Meeting 1<sup>st</sup> July 2020

**Proposed Trial Pedestrianization Scheme for the village:** Government had agreed to provide funds to County Council's to put in measures for assisting social distancing whilst in Covid-19 times. GCC and CDC had been working on a proposed trial pedestrianization scheme for Bourton-on-the-Water and had consulted with the Parish Council and the Emergency services. The Parish Council held an Official Parish Council survey to obtain the views from the residents and business owners of the village on the proposed trial pedestrianization scheme for the village.

An extraordinary Parish Council meeting was held on 14<sup>th</sup> July where the evidence of the survey had been compiled and the Parish Council voted on the proposal. The outcome of the vote was to not proceed with the trial pedestrainization scheme.

**Traffic Regulations Orders:** GCC is progressing with the new Traffic Regulation Orders for the village and notices have been put up in the village by GCC notifying the public of the procedure.

**Civil Enforcement Officer:** Additional hours for a Civil Enforcement Officer to be in the village are being investigated.

**Recreation Areas:** The Parish Council is to undertake a risk assessment of all three recreation grounds and put the appropriate signage in place before opening up the recreation grounds.

**Recreation Equipment:** New recreation equipment for the village is still being looked into.

**Byelaw Sign:** A design and locations for the new byelaw signs have been agreed by the Parish Council.

**Lloyds Bank:** The Lloyds mobile bank had resumed their service in the village and will be operating one day a week on Mondays from 10.30am – 12noon and 12.30pm to 2.30pm.

**Brian Father wooden bench:** The Parish Council thanked Donna Holland for arranging the repair and, payment of, the Brian Father wooden bench by the middle bridge alongside the village green.

**The Parish Council Office:** The Parish Council office remains closed to the public for the meantime. If anyone needs to contact the staff please either email or phone on the details below.

#### **Friday Club**


We hope to resume the club on Friday 4<sup>th</sup> September. Keep your fingers crossed! It would be nice to see you all again.


I only went along to help out with the teas and kept on going! We have a lovely afternoon and it's a good way to meet new people.

# Bourton Vale gardening Club "A garden is a friend you can visit anytime"

August is a time to reap the rewards in a garden, vegetables and fruit are ripening, ready to pick and enjoy. All of the earlier work, creating new beds, or preparing the soil, sowing seeds, planting and nurturing, should be coming to fruition in the last of the summer months. Harvesting your own produce, plot to plate is a special treat to savour and with luck a sunny August too.

For repeat flowering plants, deadhead, to ensure there are plenty of blooms through the rest of summer, but for others such as Poppies, Rudbeckias, Heleniums, Echinops and Nigellas leaving the seed heads on, gives structure in the borders and food for goldfinches, adding teasels to a wildlife garden will be especially rewarding.

If you are cutting hedges, double check, in case of late nesting blackbirds and thrushes, ensuring plenty of food and fresh water will help the parents. By August many birds will be looking slightly worse for wear as they shed or moult their breeding feathers and grow new ones, ready for the winter. The extraordinary Swallows nesting at Greystones are migratory birds; their moult process is very quick, to prepare for the long journey home.



Not quite so far for humans to travel, National Trust Snowshill and Hidcote have reopened with timed tickets bookable in advance and the National Garden Scheme, have both virtual garden visits and are adding even more Gloucestershire timed garden visits. Sezincote, Kiftsgate, the Roccoco gardens, Cerney gardens, Bourton House gardens, and Batsford, all have up to date visitor information on their websites.

Take care of yourselves and others too, stay safe. We hope your gardens are blooming and your garden wildlife is happy too.

telephone befriending and transport for critical medical appointments. In addition to supporting people directly Cotswold Friends has received over 30,000 phone calls, emails and social media contacts in the period, many of which were asking for help. Where appropriate some of these requests for help have been forwarded to Covid-19 community groups such as the wonderful Bourton Street Volunteers.

As the Government lifts lockdown, including the end of shielding on July 31st, many people are feeling a little anxious about losing their Covid-19 support. For those people who will no longer receive food parcels and those people who have relied on community volunteers to shop for them and deliver their medicines, this could be a difficult time. Please don't worry. Cotswold Friends is available to continue to take your calls and provide support. We can provide a weekly visitor to give you someone to chat to for company and reassurance. In some cases your visitor can accompany you as you start to get out and about again and do your own shopping and pharmacy collection. Sometimes we all need a little extra support.

Some community groups, like Bourton Street Volunteers, are continuing over the transition period to provide on-going help to their community and where these groups exist we will continue to work together.

Many people have had hospital, and other appointments such as dentists, delayed because of Covid-19 and these appointments are now beginning to be booked again. Cotswold Friends Community Transport service continues to be available to take people to their appointments. For a small donation (50p) we will provide a mask for you to wear. We are also taking people to post offices and banks as we realise that many people now need to access these services. We will do our best to accommodate your hair appointments and family visits too!

#### **BOURTON STREET VOLUNTEERS**

Lynda Hicks writes "As more and more people come out from isolation, the SV are slowly encouraging them to start doing things themselves. We still have a number of people who need to shield for the rest of July, and beyond for some awaiting hospital admissions, and we will carry on supporting them and will continue, as needed.

The Co-op now has a "Phone and Collect" system they are trialling, which has reduced the requirement for our volunteers, but this is a good thing if it helps people to regain their independence, confidently. There is a team of drivers, all volunteers, who are still delivering Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, and will be, for as long as needed.

Carol continues to collect and arrange thank you Hampers, the collection cage is still in the Co-op store for your toiletries donations. Masks are still being made, animals cared for and items collected, shopping and prescriptions assisted.

We would like to thank all the SV and any neighbours again for all their help and care that they have been giving Bourton's residents who have needed support".

Amanda Davis writes "Volunteers who are caring for a specific person regularly, will often see something that could offer a positive solution or improvement to someone's quality of life. Most likely, the volunteer will contact Lynda, or myself, sometimes their neighbourhood volunteer coordinator. Lynda and I are becoming increasingly skilled, experienced, trained and supported to offer the correct signposting, phone number, email address or name to help such enquiries.

Amanda has just completed a 2 day Mental Health Crisis intervention course, and is already supporting people to do online suicide awareness and prevention training. A truly regrettable consequence of Covid19 lockdown has been the toll on people's mental and emotional health. This could be related to job stress, losing income, working from home, family members at home, daily routines changing, and worry about Covid itself. As social animals, being cut off from family, friends and work or school mates for long periods is not what we are used to.

Back in February, Bourton Parish Council was successful in gaining a grant for its Mental Health Project. We are now. de-

signing actions to help the Village become even more resilient. This means that we will be better equipped to support our family, friends, workmates and neighbours when their mental health or mental wellbeing is affected, for any reason.

This could be a mental illness, like depression or psychosis. It could be a brain injury like dementia. It could be following a bereavement of a family member or a much loved animal. It could be someone who may be thinking about suicide. It could be a domestic incident, or a relationship issue, alcohol, drugs, or so many other things.

Would you have a basic understanding of what people experiencing any of these situations are going through? Would you know how to react to help?

Just as with physical first aid courses, residents of Bourton can help in small but essential ways, with the skills they might learn from basic first aid (in mental health), or from more detailed courses and qualifications. Watch this space for more details, as the Parish Council, together with support from local businesses, develops a range of options for you to get involved with".

#### **SUICIDE AWARENESS TRAINING**

Parish Council is pleased to support the Zero Suicide Alliance prevention training.

This is for you if you would like to have a better understanding of suicide at a basic level, an idea of how to have a difficult conversation, and where to seek help. This is on-line training, it takes as little time as 20 minutes and is suggested as suitable for anyone aged 15 years upwards.




