Parish Council Notes

Parish Council Notes Council Meeting 2nd September 2020

Co-opted Parish Councillor: Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council have Coopted Andy Roberts onto the Parish Council as a Parish Councillor and he will take his seat at the October Parish Council meeting.

Civil Enforcement Officer & new TRO's: A firm guotation is being provided to have a Civil Enforcement Officer to cover the whole of the village which the Parish Council will have to budget for and which will help to enforce the new TRO's in the village due to be implemented before the end of 2020.

Tourism Action Group: County Cllr. P. Hodgkinson had formed a Tourism Action Group where small working parties will be formed to assist in obtaining information required from the residents and businesses of the village. The information gathered would be passed back to the Tourism Action Group to progress forward in a plan to help resolve the issues we have in the village.

Public Health: The Parish Council has a meeting planned with Sarah Scott, Director of Public Health, to discuss various issues which we have in the village.

Proposed Electric Car Charging Station: The Parish Council has filed a strong objection to the Planning Inspectorate against the proposed electric car charging station planned for the old Gilders Yard on the A429.

Youth Club: Due to new Government guidelines the Parish Council are working on securing youth leadership to open the Youth Club as soon as the Government guidelines allow us.

Thriving Communities Bid: The Parish Council have been successful in obtaining a Thriving Communities Bid of £7,500.00. This fund is to provide training to help the young and the old communicate better, better parenting skills, communication skills for writing CV's and how to communicate with people with Dementia and active listening skills.

Safe Well Checks: The Parish Council has agreed to help publicise, with the Fire Service, that they operate a free of charge safe well check for the elderly or vulnerable. This check is to make sure that they have a working smoke alarm installed or, if they require it, any assistance/guidance on safety measures in the house.

Street Name Plates: Any damaged, missing or illegible street name plates please notify the Parish Clerk who will report this to CDC for replacement.

Lloyds Bank: The Lloyds mobile bank will now be operating on a fortnightly basis commencing from 14^{th} September 2020 - Mondays from 10.30 am – 12 noon and 12.30 pm to 2.30 pm.

Message from the Church

I am writing this article on 14th September, when many Churches celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. On this day we recall three historical events: The finding of the True Cross by St. Helena, mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine; the dedication of churches built by Constantine on the site of the Holy Sepulchre and Mount Calvary where the crucifixion of Jesus Christ took place, and the restoration of the True Cross to Jerusalem in 630.

In a deeper sense, at the other end of the year from Holy Week and Easter, Christians are again reminded on this day of the salvation of the whole human race by the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains that on the Cross on that first Good Friday 'Christ took upon himself the whole weight of evil and took away the sin of the world'.

What this means is that the permanence of evil and death was 'nailed to the cross' by Jesus Christ, whom death could not hold, for he rose again in triumph on Easter Day, preparing the way to immortality for us.

Lots of us have crucifixes. Sometimes we wear them on our person, or we have one in our house, even if we are not particularly 'religious'. A crucifix is a cross

Shorter days and cooler autumn nights trigger a change in deciduous leaf colour, as the dominant green pigment, we see in spring and summer produced by chlorophyll slows down and eventually stops when trees prepare to shed their leaves. The yellow and orange colours of carotenes are revealed beneath the fading green, and if we are fortunate to enjoy an autumn with dry, bright sunny days and cold nights, this mix of weather produces increased sugars in the leaves to reveal the anthocyanin hues of red and pink too.

The best places to see this magical sight are the Westonbirt and Batsford arboretums, Blenheim Palace and Hidcote all bookable in advance this year and the wilder woods at Foxholes, Guiting Power and Chedworth or further afield in the Forest of Dean. Escaping to autumnal woodlands is not only a fantastic uplifting sight, a little tree hugging or forest bathing is good for the soul. In this unusual year, our gardens, allotments and wilder spaces have been invaluable to all of us, just watching a tree, plant, insect or wild creature, letting nature bring some calm in amongst the craziness even for a few moments recharges us for another day.

Two Cotswolds School pupils Poppy and Johnty have presented their musical selections in the evening, alongside Henry Yates's jazz. Overall, an exciting start to our pledge to make the airwaves available to the next generation.

At lunchtimes, Sian read poetry and Cider with Rosie to start daytime broadcasting. Led by Kathy and Richard, Quiz Nights raised listener numbers to record levels to become the core of our fundraising commitment.
