Parish Council Notes

Parish Council Notes – Annual Council Meeting 5th May 2021

Election of Officers: Cllrs Bob Hadley and Lynda Hicks were elected Chairman and Vice-Chairman of Council respectively for 2021-22.

Annual audit: The Council has closed and approved its accounts for the year ending 31st March 2021. The period for the Exercise of Public Rights to inspect the unaudited accounts will take place this year between 7th June and 16th July. Further information will be available on the Council's website or from the Council office.

Local Election Results: Paul Hodgkinson was elected as County Councillor for Bourton-on-the-Water and Northleach Ward with 56% of the votes and Chris Nelson was elected as the Police & Crime Commissioner for Gloucestershire.

Face-to-Face Meetings: As of 7th May all meetings of local councils including parish and town councils, their committees and sub-committees must be held as physical face-to-face meetings. Although, the Parish Councillors will meet in person at the Community Centre their meetings will also continue to be held over Zoom to enable members of the public to join the meetings remotely where possible to keep the number of attendees in the building as low as possible until the social distancing rules are changed. If you would like to attend a meeting in person please notify the Assistant Clerk before the meeting to ensure that provision can be made to keep everyone in attendance safe.

Lloyds Bank: Following an annual review, Lloyds has confirmed its intention to continue with its Mobile Branch sessions at the Community Centre for at least a further six months.

Youth Club: Council's youth club sessions, led by Inspire to Aspire, will be held at Bourton Vale Cricket Club launching on Monday 31st May and continuing weekly on Mondays during term time. The sessions are open to 8–13-year-olds and will run from 6.00-7.30pm, however, places will need to be booked in advance. Updates will be posted on the *Bourton-on-the-Water Youth Club* Facebook page.

Planters & Flower Beds: The village planters and flower beds will soon be planted with summer flowers and hanging baskets will be installed alongside the village green.

Bus Shelter – Meadow Way: At the time that planning consent was granted to extend the Industrial Park, the owner of the Park was required by Cotswold District Council to install a bus shelter to improve access to public transport; its use would be dependent upon future discussions with, and agreement from, the local bus service provider to amend the current route. Unfortunately, the Parish Council was not consulted in respect of the bus shelter ______

compliance application and had no opportunity to submit comments on the proposal at that time. The Parish Council's Planning Committee has now discussed the matter and will liaise with GCC and CDC to ascertain whether the planning condition can be reversed. The Industrial Park owner has protected the shelter to prevent its use at present, but the Council will also seek the complete removal and storage of the shelter in the interim to allow discussions to take place without risk of damage or Antisocial Behaviour. Given the shelter is the result of a Sealed Planning Agreement these discussions will obviously not be straightforward, and residents are therefore asked to bear with the Council whilst it progresses all issues.

across the beautiful countryside of the Greystones Farm Nature Reserve? The 10K is open to everyone of all standards aged over 15 and starts at 10:30am. The Children's fun run is around the archaeological hill fort at Greystones and is open to children aged 14 and under and starts at 9:45am.

THOUSANDS OF CARERS IN NEED OF SUPPORT



Do you look after your husband or wife, your parents, a sibling or a friend? If you do, you are a Carer. Thousands of Carers in the North Cotswolds are unsupported.

Covid 19 has increased the number of Carer households nationally. It is estimated that there are 6,000 Carers living in the North Cotswolds. Very few receive support and the numbers are growing rapidly. Carers can suffer from exhaustion, stress, isolation and anxiety and many cannot find time to look after their own wellbeing. Research shows that many Carers, especially married Carers caring for a partner, or children caring for parents, do not identify themselves as Carers and therefore do not come forward to seek the help they need.



Free local services are available to help

There are free local services available to help Carers but there is little service uptake. If you know a Carer who is unsupported, please encourage them to ask for help. They can contact their GP or phone the number below. Message from the Church

The New York Times recently ran an article exploring the emotional state of joylessness and aimlessness that is not quite depression, but it's not quite happiness either, identifying it as the state of "languishing". In doing so, the article sparked a collective jolt of recognition from people around the world; it seemed to be a naming of a collective feeling.

Many of us at the moment are struggling to find motivation, inspiration and joy, even as the opportunity to reconnect with wider life slowly becomes more available. We feel guilty about not wanting to dive headfirst into opportunities and find ourselves wanting rather to dive back under the duvet!

Sometimes we simply need to name it. To name an emotion reminds us that this isn't just us; that it is a shared struggle and that we are walking together through this strange new territory. Indeed, we hear the same emotions and longings in the words of Psalm 6, written thousands of years ago:

St Lawrence

Be gracious to me, O LORD, for I am languishing; heal me, O LORD, for my bones are troubled. My soul also is greatly troubled... ...Turn, O LORD, deliver my life; save me for the sake of your steadfast love. Apparently, the antidote to languishing is 'flow' – the state of being fully immersed in an activity or experience. It doesn't have to be something new or exciting, just fully immersive for you. Finding a little time each day for flow begins a shift. Or perhaps simply pause

a modern psalm by Katy Kooyman: Surprise us once again with your daily graces:

birdsong, a sprouted seed, a laughing child, a cup of coffee. Remind us of your cosmic care, your timeless purpose, the goodness of your promise. You love us, you see us, you keep us. **Rev. Rowena King**

Visiting Crickley Hill, one of Gloucestershire's iconic beauty spots, is about to get even easier, as Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust (GWT) install a new car parking tariff.

Perched high above the city of Gloucester, Crickley Hill offers tremendous views over the Severn Vale, strolls through leafy beech woodland, wildflower spotting among limestone grassland and is a much loved wild place. The wildlife found there has gained national recognition, with more than 1,300 species on record - from rare birds and butterflies, to reptiles and toadstools.

Following feedback from local residents and visitors to Crickley Hill, the charity plan to not only improve the parking tariff structure currently in place, but will also be installing signal-boosting equipment to improve the mobile signal to the parking machines, as loss of signal has been a common issue in the past.

From 7 May the car parking rates at Crickley Hill have changed to a single ± 2 all day rate. Visitors will be able to come and go as many times as they like during the day, and pay at any time before, during, or after their stay using a variety of different methods – including the parking machines, RinGo app and over the phone.

EU citizens. Protect your right to live in the UK

If you are an EU, EEA or Swiss citizen living in the UK, you and your family must apply to the EU Settlement Scheme to continue living in the UK after Brexit. If you have applied for yourself, you may still need to apply for your children, even if they were born in the UK.

The deadline for applications is 30th June 2021.

Unless you apply for EUSS by 30th June 2021, you and your family will lose:

- your right to live, work and study in the UK
- access to education and healthcare
- access to public funds and pensions
- the right to apply for British citizenship.

How do I apply?

The EU Settlement Scheme is open to applications, and you will need to apply online. To apply, you will need to have been living in the UK by 31st December 2020, and you will need:

- a valid identity card or passport
- your national insurance number if you have one
- an email address and phone number

Go to <u>www.gov.uk/settled-status-eu-citizens-families</u> for information. Once you have read that you can start your application at <u>www.gov.uk/settled-status-eu-citizens-families/applying-for-</u> <u>settled-status</u>.

If you have lived in the UK for 5 continuous years or more, you will be eligible for settled status (indefinite leave to remain). If you have lived in the UK for less than 5 years, you will be eligible for pre-settled status (temporary leave to remain), which you can convert to 'settled' status once you have lived continuously in the UK for 5 years.

- How to apply and help applying
- What documents you will need to apply
- What type of status you are eligible for.

The Environment is one of the Core Causes for Lions Clubs and this is an objective that our Club

are fully engaged with. For the past 5 years we have worked with the Northleach & Eastington Town Council to arrange an annual litter pick around Northleach, with the last one taking place on 24th April. Thankfully, the weather was good for all that volunteered.

This will go a small way towards the Lions Challenge of collecting at least 2022 bags of litter between March 21st and the start of the commonwealth games on the 26th July 2022. Northleach have now collected 22 bags of rubbish towards that target and it is hoped that a future litter pick in the town will be just as successful.

There are other Environmental Initiatives that the Club have taken part in. We helped Introduce Terracycling to Northleach, where yellow plastic bins were placed in the Black Cat Café and the Northleach Primary School for the collection of plastic packaging such as crisp packets. The local coordinator for Terracycling has retired from this but the club will carry on with the yellow bins in Northleach, however, all can be involved with recycling these items, as Tesco in Stow and Cirencester will now recycle these into new packaging, reducing the amount going to landfill. They will accept,

Crisp packets, Bread bags, Cling Film, Pet Food Pouches, Baby Food Pouches, Salad Bags, Fruit and Veg Packaging

The Club has recently been made aware of another recycling opportunity. Working with the Cotswold Pharmacy in Northleach we shall be starting recycling of the foil and plastic strips that tablets come in. Once in place the Pharmacy will be able to accept these blister packs which the Lions will collect and pass on.

As you can see, there is more to Lions Clubs than just fundraising and the Environment is just one of our core causes. Co-op stores have switched sales of compost to peat free, as peat extraction contributes to greenhouse gas emissions and climate change and damages the unique and fragile lowland peat bogs, which support wild plants and wildlife. The RHS website have a very helpful page - Peat Free Growing Media, advising how help our planet and recommend several brands, including RHS endorsed Melcourt, available at Batsford Arboretum and the Burford Garden Company.

If you decided on a No Mow May, leaving lawns to grow wildflowers, Plantlife also recommends a mix of shorter growth too, with a monthly cut and leaving taller areas of wildflowers to "Let it bloom in June".

Over the last 75 years, 97% (7.5 million acres) of our wildflower species rich meadows have been lost; the meadows not only support wildflowers and wild grasses but are a vital habitat for birds, animals and insects too. The Coronation Meadows Project, commemorating the Queens Diamond Jubilee, led by Plantlife in partnership with The Wildlife Trusts and the Rare Breeds Survival Trust, are seeking to protect the remaining fragments and have especially designated wildflower meadows for each county, one of the two Gloucestershire meadows is very close by at Hyde Hill Meadows, near Stow, the other at Highgrove, Tetbury.

The Cotswolds AONB project Glorious Cotswolds Grasslands, reports in the 1930's 40% of the Cotswolds were covered with wildflower meadows and today less than 1.5% remain. If you would like to volunteer or learn more about wildflowers, the Glorious Cotswolds Grasslands project are looking for volunteers as they aim to restore 100 hectares of land to species rich wildflower meadows, details on the Cotswolds AONB website.
