## Parish Council Notes

## Parish Council Notes – Council Meeting 2<sup>nd</sup> June 2021

Police: The Council was advised that PCSO Symes has resigned from the constabulary; PC Ali Palfrey and PSCO John Allen will continue to be the local points of contact until further advice is received from the Police in relation to his replacement.

De la Hayes/Windrush Restaurant: The flooding issues related to the street drain in front of the restaurant have now been resolved by Highways. Potential buyers for this property are being notified of the outstanding legal challenge relating to the seating, so this matter can be progressed with the new owner, after a sale has been agreed and completed.

Litter: New litter bins, some of which will incorporate a recycling element, are due to be installed by CDC around the village centre end-June/beginning July in order to help tackle the increasing amounts of litter being generated. Signage will be added subsequently to raise awareness of the need for visitors to take litter home when bins are full. Bourton Litter Picking Group continues to pick litter in and around the village and grateful thanks are given to these volunteers for their efforts to help tackle this problem. Residents are advised that the Police encourage the reporting of dangerous items (e.g. needles etc) to them on 101 so these can be safely retrieved by their officers.

A-boards: The Council will circulate a letter to local businesses reminding them of the legislation and their responsibilities in respect of the display of advertising boards and the need to keep footpaths sufficiently clear to allow safe circulation of residents and visitors. GCC will be notified of any subsequent problem areas and enforcement will be sought.

Grants: Local groups are reminded they may apply to the Council for a grant, and that the deadline for submitting an application is 20<sup>th</sup> August – the application form/terms and conditions are available to download from the Council's web-site.

Youth provision: Subject to the government removing social distancing restrictions by 21st June, the popular Play Ranger sessions will recommence at Melville Play Area each Wednesday term-time between 4pm-6pm, as in previous years; the first session will therefore take place on Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> June. The Council also approved the purchase of a range of new play equipment to be installed at The Naight and Melville. The equipment will be installed after the summer holidays to ensure the play areas remain open during the period of maximum use.

The Council has now appointed a resident who will be responsible for the regular inspection of Play Areas which will help in maintaining these spaces to the required stan-







## **VICTORIA HALL**

At a public meeting in 1897 it was unanimously decided to build a Public Hall to commemorate Queen Victoria's sixty years on the throne, money was raised locally with the biggest contributor being Mr George Moore.

Building progress was fairly rapid and the Hall, consisting of a Reading room, Billiard room, Committee room and Toilets at the back, on the ground floor, and upstairs an Assembly room containing a raised platform, was opened in December 1898, the Deed stating that it should be forever known as The Victoria Hall

Since its opening, besides the Reading room for the local gentry and Billiards for anyone who could afford the fees, the first function to be held after the opening was an Art and Crafts Exhibition. Since then there have been many changes and improvements and over the years the Hall has been host to the Y.M.C.A., a Bridge Club, Cinema, Bourton Vale Players, Doctors Surgery, Gardening Club and more recent the Rural Cinema, W.I. and Panto Group.

Many local Groups, Churches and Organizations have used the Hall to raise funds as its location is ideal to catch the tourist, but now the Hall needs help from those Organizations and the people of the village, we are in dire need of new Committee members a Committee Secretary and a Booking Secretary, if you are community minded then help us to keep this lovely building alive for the community, if you can help then please ring Annette Lane on 01451 821039.

# COTSWOLD FRIENDS RECEIVES THE QUEEN'S AWARD FOR VOLUNTARY SERVICE



Cotswold Friends, a charity helping and supporting older and vulnerable people in the Cotswolds, has been honoured with The Queen's Award for Voluntary Service, the highest award a voluntary group can receive in the UK.

The charity provides seven key community services to the Cotswold Community including Community Transport, Befriending and Carer Support. With in excess of 450 filled volunteer roles, the services benefit over 2,000 older and vulnerable people.

The Queen's Award for Voluntary Service aims to recognise outstanding work by volunteer groups to benefit their local communities. It was created in 2002 to celebrate The Queen's Golden Jubilee. Recipients are announced each year on 2nd June, the anniversary of The Queen's Coronation.

Representatives of Cotswold Friends will receive the award crystal and certificate from Edward Gillespie OBE, Lord-Lieutenant of Gloucestershire later this summer. Furthermore, two volunteers from the charity will attend a garden party at Buckingham Palace in May 2022 (depending on restrictions at the time), along with other recipients of this year's Award.

CEO of Cotswold Friends, Amanda Howard, says: "This is an amazing achievement by our volunteers, I am delighted that their hard work has been recognised with this award. I would like to thank all of them for their dedication, commitment and resilience, especially over the past 12 months which have been very challenging. To be recommended and nominated for the award by the community we serve is truly uplifting. ## Message from the Church

The Catholic church of Our Lady, Help of Christians in Bourton is to be closed. There will be a final Mass at 6 pm on Wednesday 30th June. The sad decision is in line with our Bishop's policy that, however well supported, it does not make commercial sense to run two church buildings within one parish, so Our Lady & St. Kenelm, Stow, will be the Catholic 'hub' for both Stow and Bourton.

On the internet can be found an essay by James Rudden about the French Count George de Serionne,'Lay Apostle of the Cotswolds' who, after the First World War, saw a need to cater for French and Belgian Catholic refugees who had no access to Mass. He rented and then bought the old school which is now the Catholic church at Back Walls, Stow and evangelised the area on a bicycle!

After World War II, when transport was difficult and expensive, it was not easy for the increasing number of Catholics in

the Rissingtons and Bourton to get to Mass in Stow and so funds were raised to buy the site at Bourton and build a church. This was dedicated on October 13th 1960, by Bishop Rudderham, of Clifton, Bristol.

However, transport is now much easier, and Stow Catholic church holds over 100 people. Our Bourton and-Northleach parishioners have been very understanding about the change which is taking place.

The final Mass may have taken place by the time you read this article, but if not and you would like to attend the service, please email me at:



## **Dementia Friendly Bourton**





In recent weeks, Bourton has made great strides to become dementia inclusive. As the Village adjusts to reopening for business, we are aware of the needs of both local residents and visitors.

The Dementia Friendly Bourton group has been re-formed to drive forward this work. Early actions have seen Shetland ponies visit Edwardstow Court, thanks to Leanne Launchbury, Bourton Vale Equestrian, and Victorian tricycle ice cream vendor Allan Hymers visit Jubilee Lodge. Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council's mental health project has funded some minor adjustments to George Moore Community Centre, to make it even more dementia friendly.

All those local volunteers who trained with us as dementia link workers in September 2019 are being invited to join in, along with anyone else with an interest in dementia.

Is your business dementia friendly? Would you know? Would you value some support to achieve this and add to your customer experience? Local residents Kathy Chesters, Cllr Bill Wragge and Allan Hymers plan to approach businesses in the village this summer.

Are you a family living with dementia? Would you like some more information on what Dementia Friendly Bourton might mean for you and your family? Would you like to join us to shape what this group can achieve? We have tried to make it a little easier for you to join us by meeting via zoom, and we currently meet fortnightly on Fridays at 9.15am for an hour. Many of us just attend for part of the meeting, and we understand the challenges of living with dementia.

## The Cotswold Cup

The Cotswold District Council has awarded a match grant fund of £4K to The Cotswold Cup, a new community interest company founded by three local mums (Emma Dixon, Jennifer Lanham, and Kirsten Ng), to reduce single cup waste at point of sale. The Cotswold Cup intends to 'make the sustainable choice the convenient choice' when ordering a. takeaway drink. It's a simple concept **Deposit, Drink, Swap or Drop**. Customers deposit £2 when ordering a takeaway drink, then return the empty cup for £2 or swap it when ordering another drink at any participating cafe. It's great for locals who want to help reduce local waste, & ideal for tourists who want to visit the Cotswolds sustainably.

The Cotswolds Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty has a population of 139,000 residents and attracts 38 million visitors per year. Bourton on the Water alone may have up to 10,000 visitors a day and it's impossible to ignore the substantial volumes of single use waste that is generated. Litter and waste has been a historic problem in the village but with the advent of plastic, rubbish and litter has boomed. Bourton alone has up to three bin collections a day and 25 volunteer litter pickers - the endless single use cycle of buy, use, dispose is more than the system can cope with.

However, the single cup waste issue is greater than Bourton and the Cotswolds. The UK sells 7million single use cups per day and the majority are made from virgin wood. These cups are lined with micro plastics to prevent leakage, which are bad for the environment and potentially bad for human health too. Even 'compostable' cups have to be industrially composted due to the plastic liners. And the 'recyclable' ones? Disturbingly 99.75% of cups do not get recycled; the rest go to landfill.

The Cup is set to launch in July and several local cafes are already on board including: the Den, Kubarn, Stow Town Coffee, Cotswold Baguettes, New England Coffee House, and The Hayloft Café at FarPeak. The more cafes on board, the better the scheme gets and the less disposable cups move through the system. Any takeaway drinks cafes are welcome to join the movement and are encouraged to reach out to

## **CONGRATULATIONS TO MINDSONG**

awarded the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service 2021 (With special recognition – Covid 19)



Mindsong is a Gloucestershire charity reaching people with dementia through music and song, unlocking memories and offering hope and joy in a world where words and thoughts are lost. It works mainly in Gloucestershire (but does spill over the borders at times) providing a range of services for people living with moderate to late-stage dementia or other neurological diseases such as Parkinson's disease. Volunteers help Music Therapists to share music with local residents whether in their own homes, residential care or community hospitals and, in so doing, improve not only their mental well-being but also their physical health.

Around 15 members from the Five Bridges Choir (part of the Bourton & District u3a) joined as volunteers in February, 2018 and, since then, have been sharing their love of music with residents in Bourton, Stow and Moreton.

The work done by Mindsong for the community was very much admired by the independent National Assessment Committee for QAVS, chaired by Sir Martyn Lewis CBE. This year the Committee gave an additional special designation to QAVS awardees that had provided impactful support to the community in response to the pandemic last year - either by managing a significant increase in their usual work or providing extra support in other ways. Based on the information gathered at the local assessment, Mindsong was selected for this designation and will receive a special "thank you" with its award. The charity will consequently receive a slightly modified crystal award with the words 'with special recognition - Covid 19' included in the engraving.

We salute Mindsong for their achievement and note with pride the contribution made by the Bourton & District u3a Choir members who have given of their talents with commitment, generosity and enthusiasm over the past few years.

Following the delay in lockdown restrictions, our committee have decided to postpone our next meeting to September and full details will be in the August Browser, we hope you will be able to join us for a long overdue get together and horticultural evening. After the wettest May on record, the sunshine in June has been so welcome for our gardens, garden visiting and our own well-being. The National Garden Scheme has an extensive programme, of individual or village gardens to visit, with details in the NGS yellow book or on their website. It is a great day out, whilst raising valuable funds for charity, there is always cake and it can be an affordable way to pick up a bargain on the plant stalls.

Watering in new ornamental plants at home, may be costly, reusing grey water after washing up or baths may help. The RHS recommend using the water within 24 hours to avoid contamination and any mild detergent should be filtered by the soil. Edibles however should be watered from a water butt or tap.

If you are planning a wildlife pond, or worried about an existing one, the charity Froglife have a wonderful website giving lots of inspiring details to help us, help our wildlife. A dry April and prolonged wet and cold May has been difficult for many garden birds, especially Blue Tits, trees were late to produce leaves this year and the caterpillars and larvae of moths, vital food for fledglings, washed from tree leaves by the May rains. If you are fortunate to have other bird species visit, keeping birdbaths and feeders topped up all helps our feathered friends.

# Cotswold Fosseway Lions Club

Lions Clubs have five Global Causes, the Envi-

ronment is one, as mentioned last month, and another is Hunger. For a number of years the club have supported the North Cotswold Foodbank, taking donations that have been collected in Northleach fortnightly to their distribution point at Guiting Power. As the Covid pandemic hit and the UK went into lock down in March 2020, we started to do these runs weekly.

During the period April 2020 to March 2021, the North Cotswold Foodbank saw an unprecedented number of people in need of support. April 20 was their busiest month ever with the number of 3-day emergency food parcels handed out being 145% higher than in April 19. By the end of September 2020 they had handed out more than 40% more food parcels compared with the previous year.

Thanks to the generosity of the community around Northleach, since the end of March 2020 we have delivered over 1,338 Kgs of goods to the foodbank, and only recently returned to fortnightly deliveries.

As you can see, there is more to Lions Clubs than just fundraising and Hunger is just one of our core causes. Future reports will focus on some of the others and how the Cotswold Fosseway Lions have contributed to them.
