I would like to introduce myself as your new Parish Clerk. I started in the role in July and am looking forward to getting to know local residents and familiarising myself with current local issues. I live locally at Upper Rissington and have previously clerked for parish councils in the Cotswolds and Oxfordshire. Outside of work I enjoy yoga, cycling and trips away in my touring caravan.

New bins on the Village Green: We are pleased to report that Cotswold District Council have now installed new and larger bins for general waste and recycling which we hope will ensure there is sufficient provision for residents and visitors.

Replacement Christmas Tree Lights: Although it seems a long way off at present the Council have approved the purchase of 12 new sets of Christmas tree lights and the tree will be displayed in the river as usual this year. There will be a date set soon for switching on the lights.

There will be a raffle and refreshments and our monthly competition will be a single Dahlia stem, and we hope you will come and join us for a long over due horticultural get together. Members and non-members are all very welcome.

In gardens at home, August is a time to reap rewards, vegetables and fruit are ripening, ready to pick and enjoy. All of the earlier work, creating new beds, or preparing the soil, sowing seeds, planting and nurturing, should be coming to fruition in the last of the summer months. Harvesting your own produce, plot to plate is a special treat to savour and, with luck, a sunny August too.

For repeat flowering plants, deadhead, to ensure there are plenty of blooms through the rest of summer. For others such as Poppies, Rudbeckias, Heleniums, Echinops and Nigellas leaving the seed heads on gives structure in the borders, adding teasels to a wildlife garden may be especially rewarding and attract seed eating goldfinches, little flashes of colourful joy, over the cooler months. August is a good time to save some seed for sowing next year too.

If you are cutting hedges, double check, in case of late nesting blackbirds and thrushes, ensuring plenty of food and fresh water will help the parents. By August many birds will be looking slightly worse for wear as they shed or moult their breeding feathers and grow new ones, ready for the coming Autumn.

There has been some speculation on social media about the capabilities of the cameras.

The Parish network of "Safe-speed" ANPR cameras monitor traffic flow and speed 24/7. The speed of all passing vehicles is captured and reviewed regularly by the Neighbourhood Police team to identify persistent transgressors. Warning letters are issued where considered appropriate and enforcement action may follow if warnings go unheeded. Over 500 letters have been issued to date and there has been a significant reduction in the speed of traffic at the camera locations. For example, at the Rissington Road site alone, the average speed of passing traffic has reduced from a baseline of 33.7mph in May 2018 (as recorded by GCC Highways) to 27.1mph in May 2021.

Drivers, please remember that the speed limit through the centre of the Village is 20mph and other areas 30mph. Please keep below the limits and make Bourton's roads safer.
