Parish Council Notes

Parish Council Notes - Council Meeting 1st September 2021

Speedwatch: The Council is appealing to residents interested in, or concerned about, local speeding to come forward to be part of a new Speedwatch team. The data collected by this group through informal speed checks carried out around the village will be very helpful in establishing patterns of driving behaviour, and the team will work in conjunction with Police to help reduce speeding in Bourton. Any residents wishing to be part of a Speedwatch team are asked to contact the Parish Council office.

Play Rangers: After an enforced 18-month break, Play Gloucestershire's Play Rangers' activities were able to re-start at Melville Play Area on 15th September and will continue to take place every Wednesday during term time from 4pm-6pm. Play Rangers' activities take place outdoors in all weathers and are open access. This means there is no registration so children can leave the site at any time. These activities have been very popular in the past, and residents are reminded that activities are aimed at 7–14-year-olds. Under 7s are welcome but must be accompanied by a parent or carer. Activities include den building, arts and crafts, sports and a range of playful games. Children may get wet, hot, cold and dirty so need to wear appropriate clothing and footwear better to wear old play clothes than ruin their best! Please talk to the Play Rangers staff if your child needs additional support to enjoy Play Rangers.

Youth Club: Following a successful bid for funding, Council's youth club sessions led by Inspire to Aspire have expanded to include sessions for seniors. Junior sessions continue to take place each Monday evening for 8–12-year-olds (school Years 3-7) from 6.00-7.30pm at Bourton Vale Cricket Club and are now followed by senior sessions for 13–18-year-olds (Year 8 & above) from 7.30-9.00pm during term time.

Play Equipment: The Council's chosen supplier, Kompan, has confirmed that the installation of the newly purchased pieces of play equipment at The Naight and Melville play areas will begin on Monday 11th October. This is expected to take around four weeks, but will be weather dependant. Residents are advised that the working areas will be enclosed by Heras safety fencing and signage and the areas should not be accessed until the fencing is removed and the play equipment is open for use.

Police: A written report was received by Council in which the police confirmed that although overall crime rates for the area are down, residents are urged to be vigilant and report suspicious activity first-hand and not to inform others to make such calls. Information can be missed and time wasted in passing on this information. Quick responsiveness may prevent further crime. Police are also urging members of the community not to actively patrol on the report of suspicious persons or vehicles. This will put the person patrolling in danger and they do not know who they are dealing with.



A huge thank you to everyone who came along to our September meeting and helped to make such an enjoyable evening, it was heartening to see so many villagers together again. Congratulations to Ruth Manning who won the competition for a single Dahlia.

In early October there is still time to take semi ripe cuttings, it's really easy and, apart from a little compost and a sharp clean pair of secateurs, an inexpensive way to propagate a wide range of perennial plants, such as Salvias, Penstemons, Fuchsias and woody herbs. Many shrubs and climbers can be grown from semi ripe cuttings too and, if you haven't a greenhouse, it's worth trying indoors in a warm light position, until the plants have formed roots, and then hardening off in a cooler position, ready for planting in your garden next spring.

For our October meeting our garden club is joining with the Great Rissington garden club to welcome Pippa Greenwood, TV and radio personality, author and top gardener, who will be coming along to entertain us at St Lawrence Church, 7pm for 7.30pm on Wednesday October 13th with her talk, My Life in Gardening. Message from the Church

On the 14th September, many Churches celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. On this day we recall three historical events: The finding of the True Cross by St. Helena, mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine; the dedication of churches built by Constantine on the site of the Holy Sepulchre and Mount Calvary where the crucifixion of Jesus Christ took place, and the restoration of the True Cross to Jerusalem in 630.

In a deeper sense, at the other end of the year from Holy Week and Easter, Christians are again reminded on this day of the salvation of the whole human race by the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains that on the Cross on that first Good Friday 'Christ took upon himself the whole weight of evil and took away the sin of the world'.

What this means is that the permanence of evil and death was 'nailed to the cross' by Jesus Christ, whom death could not hold, for he rose again in triumph on Easter Day, preparing the way to immortality for us.

Lots of us have crucifixes. Sometimes we wear them on our person, or we have one in our house, even if we are not particularly 'religious'. A crucifix is a cross with the figure of the Lord hanging upon it and the significance of this is that the Crucified Lord was also the Risen Lord. So, a crucifix is a sign of hope, not despair. A cross without the figure of Our Lord upon it is quite meaningless – despite so many funeral service sheets bearing a plain cross. Without the crucified and risen Christ the cross is no longer a sign of hope.




