Parish Council Notes

Parish Council Notes – Council Meeting 6th October 2021

Large grant for Bourton Rovers Football Club: The Club Chairman attended the meeting to outline details of their grant application for £7,336 which was around 70% of the project costs to demolish the old concrete garage and provide a new metal structure to replace it. With nearly 200 youth members as well as three senior teams and veterans the Parish Council voted to approve the grant for payment next year. District Councillor Nick Maunder advised that Cotswold District Council have grant funding available through the Crowdfunding Cotswold scheme and the Club will investigate this as an alternative source of funding.

Cotswold District Council are running an on-line 2022/23 budget consultation until Friday 19th November and residents are invited to contribute here <u>https://www.cotswold.gov.uk/about-the-council/having-your-say/budget-consultation/</u>.

Bollards at Rissington Road – the District Council has installed a line of wooden bollards on the grass verge opposite the Rissington Road car park. This work was funded by the Cotswold District Council Tourist Contribution from car parking and was agreed following a survey of residents on how the funding should be used.

Village Warden – The new warden, Steve Cotton, started on Monday 11th October with funding from CDC's Tourist Contribution. The post will be managed by CDC and Steve's role will be to liaise with residents, businesses and visitors, and monitor and report matters, which will contribute to the smooth-running of the village.

The Rissington Road car park – the District Council will be undertaking a refurbishment over the winter which will result in closure for around three months. Included in the scheme will be installation of electric car charging points.

Air Quality Surveillance on traffic pollutants was carried out by the District Council and the village was shown to be within statutory limits so no further investigations are planned.

Cotswolds National Landscape (previously Cotswold AONB) have provided funding to work with the District and Parish Council to plans two walks around Bourton, one of which will be fully accessible. The aim is to encourage residents and visitors out of the centre of the village.

Accessibility Audit – An audit of the village is scheduled to start on 22nd October, also to be funded from the Cotswold District Council Tourist Contribution. The aim is to highlight any areas within the centre of the village, residential areas and Greystones that require improved accessibility.

New Play Equipment – The installations at Melville and The Naight will now start one week later, on Monday 18th October. Additional items for both sites were approved, including surfacing under the zip wire and fencing around the new equipment on both sites. The additional costs are to be funded from new grant funding

London Marathon 3rd October



Last weekend witnessed the return of the London Marathon for the masses, following the 2020 event being limited to an elite-only field, held within a restricted area, due to Covid-19. Bourton's five, covering the full agerange, were proudly representing their club and a range of charities, all testing their bodies over the 26.2 mile route, supported around the course by the crowd, plus friends and family.

First home for the club was Darren Long, who has a PB of 2 hours 52 minutes, finishing comfortably in a time of 3:18:37. Next to finish was Jennie Glass in a time of 3:59:47. Liz Hulcup (LV65) had a brilliant run in 4:31:05, just ahead of Amy Hallam who finished in 4:34:20. Rob Williams, who is more accustomed to shorter races, showed amazing resilience proudly representing his charity in a time of 6:16:30; well done to Rob.

Gardening Club Bourton Vale Gardening Club

Planting your own wildlife friendly hedge helps to create places of forage, shelter and nesting spots for the birds, insects and creatures that bring our gardens alive. Planting bare root hedges from November to March, the dormant season, is the cheapest way to create any hedge. Even a tiny hedge with spring blossom and autumnal berries, could attract beautiful pollinators and birds to your garden.



Putting up new bird boxes and insect hotels or cleaning old ones in the autumn, gives our wildlife somewhere to shelter in the coming winter months. Gentle autumn tidying, leaving piles of leaves for hibernating hedgehogs, frogs and insects and instead of pruning perennials to the ground, waiting until spring protects the plant from late frosts and could make a cosy home for overwintering ladybirds who are masters at eating pesky aphids. Keeping bird feeders topped up and water available for thirsty visitors, benefits our garden visitors and us, as taking time out in our day to nurture nature is good for our own mental health too.

Soil is improved by letting leaves lay in borders, allowing worms to naturally recycle. If you do burn leaves please dou-

Although not a regular attender at church services, Jeremy was very much a part of the church family. I remember him, many years ago, bringing his elderly mother to our services. But in more recent years, it has been through his attendance at Open4U that Jeremy became special to us. He was always first there to set up, and was incredibly generous with his contributions towards lunch and with the time he spent keeping our garden tidy for us. 'I'm a 39-year-old teacher with a grown-up daughter, an 11year-old stepson & a two-year-old son. In 2018, my partner & I were told that our baby had abnormalities. Our relationship suffered & I felt very lonely, anxious and disappointed. After the baby arrived, my anxiety & loneliness became unbearable. I went online & found Home-Start Cotswolds who sent Lynn to meet me. She then matched me with Trish, a volunteer who started visiting us once a week at home. It meant the world to me that someone would give up their time, voluntarily, to help me. Knowing I had Trish coming round meant I could plan things that I didn't feel confident to do on my own, like going into town to have my son's feet measured or doing a supermarket shop. She gave me great advice, was interested in my family and me, & was totally non-judgmental. I looked forward to her visits each week & always felt so 'light' afterwards – like a burden had been lifted. Most importantly, Trish was paramount in my journey to becoming a less-anxious, more competent mum to all three of my children.'

Why singing? The bond of singing together can help reduce feelings of loneliness and isolation. Singing is not only enjoyable, it is also good for health, helping to improve posture and breathing. It enables us to engage and to reconnect with our younger selves and our memories. On top of all those benefits, it is great fun!

Who are the groups for?

Sing 2 Remember groups are for:

- Someone with dementia living at home and those that care for them
- Someone who would benefit from a regular singing group which also offers advice and help from community support workers

What is the format of a Sing 2 Remember singing group?




