Parish Council Notes

Parish Council Notes – Council Meeting 2nd February 2022

Budget & Precept 2022/23: Further to the update in the January Browser, the following Statement has been published on the Parish Council's website:

Budget-Precept-Investment Statement 2022-2023

At its meeting on 10th January 2022, the Parish Council approved its budget and precept for the year 2022-23, the precept being the share of money each household pays to the Parish Council to help fund services and amenities provided (eg the local Cemeteries, play areas, allotment sites, Community Centre etc). In 2022-23 the Council approved a precept of £177,932. This money will be collected from the 1,780.3 contributing local households. This means that the amount of money a Band D household will pay in 2022-23 to the Parish Council to maintain its assets will be £99.94 pa. This year's precept therefore represents an increase of 56p a month (over ten months) compared to 2021-22. This money will be collected by CDC for onward forwarding to the Parish Council, and the sum will be shown within the breakdown of taxes on each household's annual Council Tax bill.

The Council's budget for 2022-23 will enable the Council to achieve a wide range of projects during the financial year, including: The purchase of software to enable digitalisation of burial records, to provide part-funding for the Queen's Jubilee weekend celebrations in the village, increased frequency of play area inspections to ensure safety for users, provide funding towards the anticipated election charges that will be levied by the district council from 2023, to enable a burial consultant to search for a suitable site for a new burial ground, the continuation of Play Rangers after-school activities, grants for local organisations and to pay for additional hours for a Civil Enforcement Officer (traffic warden) in the village if this money is not available from the District Council. Also, to ensure the George Moore Community Centre receives any necessary ongoing maintenance, all health and safety requirements are met and to budget sufficiently for the rising utility costs which all consumers are currently experiencing.

The Council is also required, by law, to set aside a certain sum in General Reserves in order to be able to respond to emergencies – the level of funds that must be set aside are reviewed annually with reference to its responsibilities at that time. This is subject to approval by the external auditors. General Reserves have been reviewed and set at appropriate levels for 2022-23.

Election Charges: We have been updated on the proposals for charging to Parish and Town Councils by Cotswold District Council. Cabinet agreed that there would be charges for contested by-elections as follows: (i) from 01/04/2024 - 50% of the cost (ii) from 01/04/2025 - 75% of the cost (iii) from 01/04/2026 - 100% of the cost. This is a change from the previously proposed start date of May 2023.

District Councillor Richard Keeling invited the Parish Council to give feedback to the District Council on the proposals and the response given was

that the District Council should pay for the first contested election cost. If there is a need for subsequent local elections in that year, then these are paid for by the District Council and repaid when Parish can raise the funds from the forthcoming precept.

Play Areas: The contractors who fitted the new equipment at The Naight will be installing hard core and a base along the access track which became very muddy over the winter when the works were being completed.

Message from the Church

One of the things I am enjoying at the moment is the slow sense of reconnecting with family, friends and local community. As restrictions ease and I slowly feel myself emerging from what are now habits of isolation, I am taking time to really appreciate and savour my connections with others. However, I have also realised that I am having to be more intentional about creating times and opportunities for those connections — what used to happen quite naturally, now seems to need thought and planning.

It is worth it, though, as our connections with others support us in body, mind and spirit; as humans we are made to be in community. Loneliness and isolation are proven to be huge health risks, and they are also on the increase, particularly after the shifts of past two years.

One of the ways we at St Lawrence are addressing this is through our **Together**

on Tuesdays lunch club, which provides a soup and cheese lunch by donation and a place for conversation and meeting friends old and new. Begun in January 2020 we enjoyed gathering together around 30 people each week. We are looking to start this again in March/April and would love some new people to join our team. If you would like to be involved in: making soup; helping in the kitchen, or to serve, do please let us know. It doesn't have to be every week — once a month is also fine—it is up to you!

On Sunday, February 27th, 15-year-old Felix Thompson and Neil Teague will be taking part in the Bourton 10km road race that starts in the centre of the village.

Felix, who was born with a genetic condition that affects his physical and cognitive development, will be pushed by Neil in his trusty wheelchair around the course that starts and finishes with loops of the village centre.

The plan is for Felix to push his own chair down the final yards and across the line in the high street. If they succeed, both will have fully deserved the post-race (in Felix's words) "cheeky pasty" that has been the main topic of conversation during training.

They are raising money for The Friends of The Milestone School, the charity that supports the work of the specialist school in Gloucester where Felix has been a pupil for the past decade. The charity helps raise funds to enable access to learning for children with learning difficulties and autism. Neil and Felix have been training since the start of the year, whatever the weather – with locals becoming used to the seeing the flashing lights of the wheelchair with the Captain America wheels flying past!



The event will be a test for Neil too. The 58-year-old has spent the past six years battling back to fitness after surviving a road accident in 2015 that left him with a shattered pelvis, broken ribs and needing a hip replacement.

Neil says: "Every time we go a little bit further and I think I'm getting stronger – although ask Felix and he'll give you a big smile and tell you I'm always feeling knackered!"


