Parish Council Notes

Parish Council Notes – Council Meeting 2nd March 2022

Countrywide site: District Cllr Nick Maunder highlighted that this was for sale and could be sold for housing. He was asked to investigate the possibility of the site being purchased jointly by the District and Parish Councils to avoid it being used solely for housing.

Springvale allotments: Work will take place to clear trees from the top end of the site with a plan to lay this area out for additional allotment plots once this had been completed.

Tree Survey: An additional survey of around 123 trees will cover those trees around the parish which were not included in the 2021 survey. Tree surgeons have been instructed to complete actions highlighted in the 2021 survey.

The George Moore Community Centre was the subject of a Fire Risk Assessment last autumn and Council approved quotes to address many of the items for action on the report to ensure the centre remains safe for its users.

Internal Auditor's Report: This was reviewed and an Action Plan was agreed to address any matters highlighted on the report. The external audit will take place over the next few months.

Platinum Jubilee Event 2nd **to 5**th **June:** The Working Group have been progressing event plans and it is planned that an Information Kiosk will be placed on the Village Green from the Friday to Sunday to sell tickets, deal with competition entries, sell Jubilee mugs and provide event information. A tree with a commemorative plaque will be planted in the Jubilee Orchard. The Working Group was thanked for its efforts to date. **See 4 page "pull out & keep" supplement, in the middle pages of this edition**.

Bourton Circular Walks: Representatives from the Cotswolds National Landscape continue to work on two walks aimed at encouraging visitors away from the very busy centre of the village. The routes will be waymarked from the village centre and the project is due for completion by the end of March.

Armed Forces Covenant: Cllr Roberts was nominated to attend a virtual ceremony to re-sign the covenant on its 10th anniversary in March.

Annual Parish Meeting: A reminder that all residents are welcome to attend the Annual Parish Meeting at 7pm on Wednesday 30th March in the George Moore Community Centre. This not a parish council meeting but an opportunity for residents to meet and hear reports from local groups and organisations, as well as the parish council, on activities over the past year. There will be drinks and nibbles available so please come and join us.





A garden is a friend you can visit anytime



Thank you to everyone who contributed to our annual plant and seed swap and for helping to make such an enjoyable evening, with lots of plants and seeds going to new homes. Congratulations to Marie Russell who won the March competition. The April competition is a small display of spring flowering bulbs, and with a long history and wealth of local countryside experience, champion hedge layer, Robin Dale, will be our guest speaker on Wednesday April 13th.

Spring is here at last, and for plants, gardeners and wildlife, it is a very busy time of year, the days are longer, and although the mornings are still cooler, it is a joy to listen to the dawn chorus, which can be heard 20 times further, than at other times of the day. If you are fortunate to have blue tits nesting in your garden, watch for repeat visits, carrying food into nest boxes, is a sure sign the eggs have hatched. The parents will be busy feeding their young, blue tits need to collect 100 caterpillars every day for each chick and sometimes there will be up to 10 chicks to feed.

Although April should be the time for more butterflies and moths to emerge, over the last 50 years, our butterflies and moths have declined in abundance or distribution by a whopping 76% through climate change, pollution and loss of habitat and, as gardeners, we

can do a little to collectively help with the circle of life for butterflies, moths and birds. Leaving fewer tidy areas creates places for butterflies and moths to shelter. Growing nectar rich plants such as Buddleia, Verbena bonariensis, Lavender, Marjoram and perennial wallflowers helps them find food.

Happy gardening and wildlife watching!



Brother and Sister Earn Black Belt in Tae Kwon-Do.

In less than a year, brother and sister, Blake (14) and Sophia (17) Robinson have earned the prestigious Black Belt in Tae Kwon-Do. The pair began their Tae Kwon-Do journey in May 2012, working their way up the belts in the junior class before developing onto the senior class.





North Cotswolds Rotary

North Cotswolds Rotary Raises £7,000 for Ukraine

On Saturday March 5th members of North Cotswolds Rotary held a street collection in Bourton-on-the-Water. On the day a total of £2,647 was donated. Subsequently we have had several donations from the public including £535 from Stow Rugby Club and £1,000 from Rotary in the Rissingtons. Members of North Cotswolds Rotary have also donated their member subscriptions and with Gift Aid the total amount raised has now reached £7,000.

The money will go directly to support the women and children fleeing the warzone in Ukraine. £500 will be used to purchase long shelf-life food, plus toiletries and medicines. These will be shipped by lorry to the town of Ustron in southern Poland, where a local Cotswolds resident has a house. She is currently working directly with Polish authorities there to ensure that urgently needed aid is given to Ukrainian refugees seeking accommodation and shelter in that town. Donated goods destined for Poland are being sorted by a team of volunteers and boxed up ready for transport at Bourton Vale Equine Clinic.

The rest of the money will go to the Rotary Foundation UK (RFUK) Disaster Response Fund that will provide funds to Rotary clubs and Districts in the countries immediately affected by the influx of refugees e.g. Poland, Moldova, Slovakia etc. Money will also be made available to areas further afield, including some in the UK, that will be taking in refugees in due course.


