Parish Council Notes

Parish Council Notes – Council Meeting 6th April 2022

Countrywide site: District Councillor Nick Maunder investigated the financial viability of Cotswold District Council purchasing the site but there were no capital reserves available which meant that this was not a viable option.

Hotel application 22/00140/FUL at The Grafters, Slaughter Pike (Parish of Lower Slaughter): District Cllr Richard Keeling advised that this application had been refused for a number of planning reasons, including scale, lack of business case, contrary to Local Plan policies and lack of information on highway safety.

Removal of Len Hill Memorial, St Lawrence Churchyard: The work in the churchyard is ongoing as the contractor has highlighted additional work that is required to the wall. Quotes are being sought.

Accessibility Audit: The Audit was completed last October and the resulting Action List highlighted many items relating to Highways which are being passed to Gloucestershire County Council for consideration. Other items included on the Action List are under discussion by the various committees.

Play Rangers sessions: The Council has agreed to continue funding the term time sessions despite rising costs from the provider. The sessions run from 4-6pm at Melville play area during term time.

Dates for May are Wednesdays 4th, 11th, 18th and 25th. There will also be holiday sessions funded by the Thriving Communities Grant – one in May half term, four in the summer holidays and one in the October half term, dates and times to be confirmed.

Platinum Jubilee Event: The lighting of the beacon on Thursday 2^{nd} June was unfortunately advertised in last month's Browser at 7pm but will take place at 9.15pm. A Jubilee plaque will be unveiled on 2^{nd} June at 7pm in the Jubilee Orchard. See page 16.

June Council Meeting: This will take place one week later than usual on Wednesday 8th June to avoid the Jubilee week.

Jubilee Orchard: The Cubs and members of Cotswold District Council's Clean and Green Team will be enhancing the area by planting wildflowers on Saturday 21st May.

Volunteer Litter Pickers: We are fortunate to have a large group of volunteers in the parish. Volunteer co-ordinator Sue Roberts will be contacting the group to confirm that volunteers are still available for this year and to circulate updated information documents.



'I DIDN'T KNOW THERE WERE FOODBANK OUTLETS IN STOW AND BOURTON'

People often express surprise that foodbanks are needed in an area as prosperous as the Cotswolds. But sadly, our area is no exception to the rest of the UK and suffers with rural and local poverty.

North Cotswold Foodbank provides emergency food supplies to people in dire need who often have to choose between essential bills and food. It has its main depot in Guiting Power and outlets in Bourton-on-the-Water, Stow, Moreton, Chipping Campden, Bishops Cleeve and Winchcombe.

Bourton outlet is in the Baptist Church on Station Road and is open Thursdays 10.00 - 12.00. The Stow outlet is in the Baptist Church off Sheep Street in Stow and is open 10.00-12.00 on Wednesdays. All enquiries or visits are treated in the strictest confidence.

Thanks to the generosity of our donors, in addition to a basic food parcel, we also offer clients extras such as fresh bread, eggs, fresh vegetable boxes and meat vouchers.

We also employ a Citizens Advice adviser at all our outlets to help clients examine the cause of their poverty and direct them to grants and benefits. We regard this to be as important as the food parcel itself as it potentially assists in alleviating poverty.

After a two-year wait, the Cardiff Half Marathon was held last week in brilliant sunshine, the effects of which were felt by many of the 15,000+ runners towards the end of the 13.1 miles course, with a long hill thrown-in for good measure.



Jac Underwood, who is a second-claim member of the club, and lives in Wales, was first home for Bourton Roadrunners in a new PB of 1:40:44. Next to finish was Nick Harper, also second-claim member, who had a strong run finished in 2:07:51. Nick had been running strongly throughout the race, but suffered the effects of the heat and the late hill, costing him valuable minutes in the closing stages.

A well-prepared group of Bourton's runners, having trained and run together, under the guidance of sports journalist Tom Knight, enjoyed the experience and their resulting PBs, waving to the crowds whist working hard all the way around the course, much of it together. They were Louise Hamilton-Smith (2:08:41), Allie Quinn (2:13:41), Cath Nesbitt (2:13:28), Rob Williams (2:15:28), Tom Knight (2:15:52), Liz Hulcup (2:31:00), Claire Carroll (2:31:12) and Jeanette Brew (2:42:33). Liz's time was achieved despite taking a heavy tumble over a heavily pitted section of road, and spending half an hour receiving medical attention, and later requiring stitches to her knee.

Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust



'SUPER RESERVE' FOR WILDLIFE IN GOLDEN VALLEY

Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust (GWT) manage several nature reserves for wildlife in Stroud's Golden Valley, however, it is key funding from Biffa Award that has recently enabled them to think outside the box.

GWT staff and volunteers have been focused on teaming up with local landowners to enhance crucial pockets of land in between nature reserves, in order to create a vast, connected haven for wildlife – particularly insects.



Grazing sheep and ponies are a key part of GWT's land management strategy, and essential to keeping the valley's species-rich grasslands free of scrub and encourag-



ing wildflowers to thrive. Not only do the animals help to clear unwanted vegetation that may prevent sunlight from reaching the soil, but they also push wildflower seeds into the ground with their hooves and are perfectly adapted to access the steep slopes of the valley – where human or mechanical intervention would be extremely difficult.

The once-extinct large blue butterfly is just one of the species that will benefit from this connectivity work – with hopes that it will spread out from it's reintroduction site at Daneway Banks and establish additional populations in the valley, improving the resilience of the species.

As well as funding from Biffa Award, this work has also been generously supported by the Royal Entomological Society (RES) and Cotswold National Landscape's Cotswolds Champions programme
