Parish Council Notes

Parish Council Notes – Annual Meeting of the Parish Council & Meeting on 4th May

Re-election of Chairman and Vice Chairman: Councillor Bob Hadley was re-elected as Chairman and Councillor Andy Roberts as Vice-Chairman.

A full schedule of council and committee meetings for 2022-23 is available on our website here <u>http://www.bourtononthewaterpc.org.uk/community/bourton-on-the-water-parish-council-7919/meetings/</u>. It was agreed to add an opportunity for the public to speak on all future committee meeting agendas. Residents are always welcome to attend any of our meetings.

The Annual Governance and Accountability Return and End of Year Accounts 2021-22 were approved. The dates for public inspection of the accounts will be Monday 13th June to Friday 22nd July, although documents will also be available to view on our website.

District Councillor Nick Maunder advised that four electrical car charging points were being installed in the Rissington Road car park.

Steve Cotton, CDC's Clean and Green Village Warden raised concerns that pedestrians were unable to cross the High Street safely and suggested installing a pedestrian crossing. A request is being passed to County Councillor Paul Hodgkinson who was unable to attend the meeting.

Highways: It was recently reported in the April minutes of the Highways Committee that initial ideas had been put forward by the Tourist Action Group (TAG) and the Parish Council's Highways Committee about managing traffic flow, parking and air quality. We would like to reassure residents that discussions are still in the very early stages and that the aims are to stop visitors parking in residential areas, to get better traffic flow on the High Street and to direct cars to the car parks. A priority will be to ensure that local residents have free access to the village centre, for example a free parking period, whilst visitors pay for parking in the centre after an initial free parking period. Any proposals will of course be subject to public consultation before being progressed.

Local shops are to be encouraged to provide better disabled access facilities. A proposal is being passed to Gloucestershire County Council Highways to move the disabled spaces by the Church Room further towards Moore Road to allow a bus pull-in bay to be created.

Platinum Jubilee: We are all looking forward to the village events in June and the Parish Council will be providing commemorative mugs to the children at Bourton Primary School. The mugs will also be available to purchase during the events and from the Parish Council office between 9am & 3pm weekdays at a cost of £5.

Swifts

My aunt, 76 years old, very suddenly passed away in January this year. Her house has just had a new roof that blocked off the entry nesting point for the returning swifts. I bought "In Memory of Marion" (as she waited eagerly each year for the birds return), 18 swift boxes, to give to people who knew her. I have just seen a swift come out of one of the three boxes, that the roofers kindly put up for me on her house.

If you are a swift lover, new builder or renovator, (renovations, often without people realising it, block off access to the nest sites), please give thought to these birds whose survival depends on our help. Contact swift conservation, who will give you simple advice on how you can, with the addition of swift bricks / nesting boxes, provide places for them to nest and raise their young. www.swift-conservation.org / mail@swiftconservation.org

Last year the Common Swift was added to the endangered list. These birds are very vulnerable, and conservation bodies say loss of suitable nesting sites is one of the major causes for decline in these birds whose numbers have dropped by over 60% Joan M Plater in last 25 years.

Message from the Church

Connection is a theme being talked about a lot at the moment, as we begin to truly recognise the importance of our relationships with each other and the ways they sustain us, even down to our physical health. Apparently, loneliness is one of the biggest risk factors in disease. Yet, for many of us the last couple of years have taken a great toll on our relationships - our habits of connecting with each other have been broken and now need to be rebuilt. Some of us have moved to the village during this time and haven't had the chance to make friends. Others of us have found ourselves more reluctant to get out and socialise as we have felt less safe to do so, or we simply don't feel confident meeting new people.

Despite all these challenges, we are made to live in community: to support and sustain and to look out for each other. Bourton's Jubilee Celebrations

We're only a couple of days' away now from the long bank holiday weekend and hope that residents have all now received a copy of the programme delivered to them by Royal Mail. An Information Kiosk will be located on the Village Green from Thursday through to Sunday so if you have any queries, come down and one of our team will help.

The celebrations will formally kick-off with the beacon lighting at 9.15pm on Thursday 2nd June as part of the national beacon lighting event. <u>Residents are asked to note the change of venue for this ceremony</u>. Do also take the opportunity to take a look inside St Lawrence's Church if you can - it will provide a floral display over the weekend with a theme of royal palaces and castles.

The Sunday Fun Day will close the celebrations and hopefully there'll be something for all ages to enjoy. There will be no charge for any of the activities on offer – costs are being funded by grants, donations and income from the concert ticket sales – so we hope to be joined by lots of residents enjoying the fun.

Residents and businesses are reminded that sections of the High St (Between Moore Rd and Station Rd) & Victoria St will be closed between 9am and 9pm – please ensure you're aware of these restrictions in advance to minimise problems on the day itself.
