### Parish Council Notes

Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council Notes from the meeting on 6<sup>th</sup> July 2022.

#### **District Councillor Nick Maunder reported**

- The owners of Bourton Vale car park have announced their intention to cease coach parking provision from 31<sup>st</sup> December. The district council are arranging a meeting with the car park owners and have asked for the parish council's input to find an appropriate solution for coach parking in the village.
- The Sustrans report concluded that the redevelopment of the old Bourton-on-the-Water to Kingham railway line into a walking/cycle route is a viable project so the district council are looking for grant funding to develop plans.

**Councillor Resignation:** The Parish Council received the resignation of Councillor Piers Millett due to a change in circumstances and he was thanked for his hard work during his time on the Council. We hope to be in a position to co-opt a new councillor by the September Parish Council meeting. Please see the separate notice for further information.

**Hedges, Shrubs & Trees:** The Parish Council would like to remind householders and landowners of their responsibilities to cut back any hedges, shrubs or trees that may be overhanging the pavements or footpaths bordering their property. This is to ensure the safety of pedestrians and allow sufficient space, where possible, for the use of wheel-chairs and buggies. Please ensure the full width of a pavement is kept clear, ideally with a minimum cleared width of 1.1 metres (3ft 7 inches). Head clearance should be a minimum of 2.1 metres (approx 7 ft). As we are currently in bird nesting season please check your hedges and shrubs prior to cutting back to ensure there are no nesting birds present.

**Platinum Jubilee Event:** A final report was received from the working party and it was agreed to make donations to a range of local organisations with some of the profits. The remainder to be retained whilst a suitable project is identified as a permanent commemoration of the event.

**Zero Waste Declaration:** The Council adopted a <u>Zero Waste Declaration</u>. In addition, an Environmental Action Working Group will be formed to work through a number of proposals. The group will report into the Village Environment Committee.

**Allotments:** The allotments will be entered into the Moreton Show competition again this year with judging taking place during August. We wish our allotment holders all the best.

**Next Parish Council Meeting**: We have changed the day of the August meeting to a Tuesday, so the next meeting will take place **on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> August** at 7pm in The George Moore Community Centre. #### Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council Co-Option of Parish Councillor

A casual vacancy has arisen following a recent resignation by Piers Millett. This vacancy has been advertised by Cotswold District Council to give residents the opportunity to call a by-election. If a by-election is not called then Council will be given the authority to co-opt a resident onto the Council.

As we do not have this information to hand at the time of going to press, and in order not to lose time in recruiting a replacement, we would therefore ask residents interested in joining the Council to confirm this interest to the Council in writing.

Residents who meet the qualifying criteria, namely those who are an elector over the age of 18 and who have lived, or had their primary place of work, in the village for the past 12 months, are asked to register their interest in writing to the Clerk, Parish Council Office, The George Moore Community Centre, Rd, Bourton-on-the-Water, Moore Gloucestershire GL54 2AZ or email clerk@bourtononthewater-pc.gov.uk by noon on Friday 19<sup>th</sup> August. If an election is not called, applicants will then be invited to meet with Councillors later in August, with the aim of confirming an appointment at the Council meeting on Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> September. Applicants are asked to provide brief details of their background and give reasons why they would like to be considered. If you have any questions about the role or its responsibilities, please contact the Clerk who will be happy to answer them.

It is hoped there will be a good response to this appeal for an additional councillor as we do need to be at full strength in order to take forward the many projects and issues being progressed.

#### Community Speedwatch

The Parish network of "Safe-speed" ANPR cameras continue to monitor traffic flow and speed 24/7. The speed of all passing vehicles is captured and reviewed regularly to identify persistent transgressors. Following a recent software enhancement, the way that warning letters are sent to drivers has been streamlined and the number sent out greatly increased. The Road Traffic division at Glos. Police HQ coordinate letter sending and will also follow up and take action as necessary for persistent offenders. The ultimate aim is to encourage drivers to slow down and stick to the speed limits. Speedwatch volunteers will also be out from time to time to record traffic volumes and also use the speed gun to monitor speeds. This provides a visual deterrent as well as supplementing the ANPR enforcement procedure. Warning letters will also be sent out to drivers that are caught. Again, the aim is not to try and catch as many speeders as possible but to educate and encourage drivers to obey the limits. Speeding wastes fuel, creates more pollution, raises stress levels, and makes the roads less safe for other road users, including passengers. Lower speeds help other people feel safe to walk, bike, or travel with children. Please keep below the limits and make Bourton's roads safer. 20mph along the village centre roads and 30mph elsewhere. The road signs are there please obey them. Thank you.

#### **Bourton One Mile Challenge**



Athletes of all ages and abilities wait, alert and poised for the start of the 20th and final running of the Bourton One Mile Challenge towards the mass of spectators on the High Street on the evening of July 1st.

Norm and Ali Lane created this race back in 2002 to run in conjunction with the Bourton Victorian Evening in December. At that time the Victorian Evening was a new concept for the local residents, with the Panto Group, shop keepers and local celebrities appearing in Victorian garb, performing and offering mulled wine, mince pies etc. Whilst the race was a success, it was quickly realised the main problem was picking out the individual runners in the dark, so the race was moved to the summer! From this it grew and grew in popularity and it is therefore with great sadness expressed by many athletes, some of whom travelled 4 hours to take part, and the organisers, that it's time has come to an end.

With a donation from sponsors Cotswold and Vale Electrical and F&M Plumbing each year, the race has raised many thousands for Gloucestershire Arthritis Trust and it was fitting that Steve Morton of GAT actually took part in our final race, commenting on the fantastic atmosphere and encouragement by all levels of runners.

This year's race was won in the 3rd fastest time ever, as William Stockley of Belgrave Harriers stormed over the line in 4.13, closely chased in by Simon Bone of Swindon Harriers 4.14 and Richard De Camps, Gloucester AC in 4.17.

#### Update: Digital technology help for older people

In case you missed news about this in the July edition of the Bourton Browser, a course is being planned to enable older people to learn and feel comfortable with digital technology. It now has a name - it's called 'Getting Connected'. It's currently under development but will be organised as a class located in Bourton with a tutor. There will also be volunteers to support people individually within the class. It is still in the planning stages and has the support of various organisations in the county that already help people of all ages and from all walks of life with digital skills.

Digital technology includes computers, mobile phones and other devices which connect to the internet. So if you are an older person who is struggling with today's digital world, this course is aimed at helping you.

We are hoping to start the course in September/October. It is likely to be for two hours once a week over several weeks. As plans advance, more information will become available. In the meantime, we are asking for expressions of interest by asking you to do the following:

- Write a note, no longer than a page, giving your name, age, address, phone number (and email address if you have one).
- Describe briefly your current level of skill (if any) with digital technology and what brand name, if you do use it (Apple, Samsung, etc).

- Describe what type of help you'd like.
- Place your note in an envelope addressed to 'Getting Connected' and deliver to the Parish Council office at the Community Centre in Moore Road by 17th August. If closed, use their letter box at the side.

There's no obligation to take part by sending it.

#### Volunteering: Would you like to share your knowledge of digital technology skills?

Plans for 'Getting Connected' - a course to help older people with digital skills are underway. Hopefully, this will start within the next two to three months and already, many people have expressed an interest in attending.

A very important component of the course will be our group of volunteers. Arrangements are yet to be finalised, but what we do know is that we need people of any age who have some knowledge of how to use a computer and other devices - and patience!

Can you cast your mind back to what it was like when you first learned how to use a computer? It probably felt rather daunting. Our tutor will be there to teach our ten participants but we also need several lovely volunteers to provide extra support to help guide our participants 1-1 as they learn in class.

The day and the times are soon to be decided but each class is likely to be for two hours a week over the course of ten weeks
