Parish Council Notes

Parish Council notes from the meeting held on 4th January 2023.

The **Police Report** by PSCO John Allen and PC Frank Ward highlighted that there had been some instances of anti-social behaviour. These should be reported to the police by phone on 101 or on-line at https://www.gloucestershire.police.uk/ro/report/ocr/af/how-to-report-a-crime/. The mobile police station would attend Bourton between 2pm and 6pm on Saturday 4th February, location to be confirmed.

County Councillor Paul Hodgkinson advised that the County Council were setting their budget for the new financial year and a 5% increase was being proposed.

District Councillor Nick Maunder updated on the arrangements for the District and Parish Council elections in May. Changes would be made to postal votes and the rights of EU voters. In addition, photo ID would be required by voters at polling stations and changes would be made to improve accessibility.

Steve Cotton, Village Warden is arranging a networking day for local groups from 10am to 4pm on 13th March at St Lawrence Church. A representative from the Parish Council will attend.

Parish Council

Councillor Co-Options: We hope to co-opt new members to the Parish Council at the February meeting to fill the two current vacancies. However, all seats will be up for reelection on 4th May at which time there will be an increase from 11 to 13 seats to reflect our growing parish. Please contact the Clerk if you are interested in becoming a Parish Councillor at the May elections.

Highways Committee: Gloucestershire County Council approved funding for a Vehicle Activated Sign to help address speeding in the parish. The location for the equipment will be regularly moved to 'hot spots' within the parish as per the recommendations for this type of equipment.

2023-24 Budget and Precept: This was further discussed with a view to minimising any increases from the current year's figures. The final figures will be agreed at an Extraordinary Parish Council meeting on 25th January so will be reported in the March edition of the Browser.

Cotswold District Council Tourist Levy: Final funding from the levy for Parish Council projects was agreed by CDC, following their on-line survey and discussions with the Parish Council. Priorities identified were traffic management, parking, accessibility and landscaping.

Funding will be provided for additional Traffic Enforcement, an annual refresh of the Village Green, the installation of cobbles along the riverbank and a small project budget for the Village Warden. CDC will be continuing to provide the Village Warden and are arranging for the installation of three dropped kerbs and a Cont on p 2 col. 2



Traffic Regulation Order to extend parking restrictions in residential areas and add one new bus stop.

Funding was also agreed for additional Traffic Enforcement during the works to CDC's Rissington Road car park.

Allotments: There is currently one vacant plot at the Springvale site, and interested residents are asked to contact the Parish Council so this can be reallocated without delay. It's hoped that a tenant will come forward before the growing season to avoid the fallow plot getting out of hand.

Environmental Action Working Group: Unfortunately, it was necessary to cancel the meeting scheduled for January and a new date has been set for 6.30pm on Thursday 2nd February in the Windrush Room, The George Moore Community Centre. All are welcome.

New Committee Clerk/Administration Assistant: We would like to welcome Julie Catlow who started with the Parish Council on 9th January. Julie lives in the village and is looking forward to supporting the Parish Council committees — in particular Highways, Youth and Wellbeing and the Village Environment Committee.

which went out on the 17th January to Poland for onward distribution to Ukraine.





Grant Applications Welcome From Small Charities and Community Organisations

Helping Hand is a small grants scheme set-up by North Cotswolds Rotary to help support the amazing work carried out by small charities and community organisations across the North Cotswolds.

Grants up to £500 are available but must be for a specific project or activity. The grants are not available to support day-to-day running costs. Applicants must be based within the North Cotswolds area (defined as from Northleach up to Moreton-in-Marsh and surrounding villages) or carrying out activities that benefit people living in the North Cotswolds.

This is the second year we have run Helping Hand. Last year we awarded seven grants of up to £500. One grant went to Children Achieving Lifelong Movement (CALM) a small charity based in Bourton that provides training and physiotherapy for disabled children. They used our donation towards a cable pull used to strengthen muscles and improve coordination. Millie aged 10 was born with a heart condition called Tetralogy of Fallot. She had open

heart surgery at 5 months old to correct it but had a stroke while on bypass, resulting in a much weaker left side of the body including a paralysed hand and limited use of the arm. CALM provided much needed support & rehabilitation to improve the mobility in her left arm and reduce the winged scapula she was starting to develop. The cable pull allows particular focus on one or more limbs in a variety of ways to ensure each set of muscle groups targeted are worked appropriately. The difference both physically and mentally since Millie started training is huge, making a valuable difference to Millie's quality of life and giving her ownership over a condition she otherwise has no control over.

A short-list of applicants will then be asked to give a 10-minute presentation to a panel of two North Cotswolds Rotary members before the final awards are made.

Navigating this ever-changing world as a young person whose brain has not yet reached full maturity is a challenge. Even for a young person who is growing up in a safe & stable home environment.

All young people can benefit from the safe & stable adult relationships offered at a youth club to help them build resilience. Resilience is the ability to bounce back from difficulties & thrive in situations where you wouldn't be expected to.

A youth worker is a unique relationship for a young person. Youth workers want the best for the young person & can support them to achieve their potential, however, Youth workers are not parents, teachers or other authority figures & work in non-judgemental ways. This means that some of the barriers to difficult conversations are removed.

Youth workers give young people information in order to make good choices in life.

Youth clubs therefore help all young people to build resilience through safe stable relationships & a safe place to explore the ever-changing world.





FREE Mental Health Support for Girls and Young Women

Girls and young women in Gloucestershire and South Gloucestershire can benefit from a FREE mentoring ser-



vice: Gloucestershire Mentoring Programme. It's being offered by a collaboration of seven trusted organisations, and it's for 11 – 25 year olds whose life circumstances suggest they're at risk of becoming involved in crime. This can be because they've had Adverse Childhood Experiences or live in environments that are known to put them more at risk, or because they've become linked to criminal activity, either as victims of crime or through relationships with offenders.

Gloucestershire Mentoring Programme is hosted by The Door and funded by CHK Foundation, and offers these "at risk" young people the chance to form a long-lasting relationship with a trained volunteer mentor. Having a relationship with a trusted independent adult is something that's often missing in their lives and can be life-changing. It helps them build resilience and grow in confidence, and, over time, empowers them to have a more positive future.

If you know a young person who might benefit from the support the Programme offers (or you are that young person), you can visit gloucestershirementoringprogramme.co.uk to apply.

If you have a heart for understanding and supporting young people, a little spare time and would like to become one of the Programme's volunteer mentors, the providers would love to hear from you. Bourton 10k Sunday 26th February

Bourton Roadrunners hosts its annual 10k road race at 10am on Sunday 26th February.

We're always very grateful to Bourton residents for their patience and tolerance around the disruption this causes to village life.

This year, we're expecting around 700 runners and their supporters so we can expect increased traffic before and after the race. With the Rissington Road car park closed, we'll encourage runners to use the other main car park in the village. When that's full, we're planning to direct race traffic to park in the areas around the industrial estate. We're working with the parish council and local businesses to see if they can help. We'll do our best to manage traffic and discourage people from using residential parking or the leisure centre.

We have permission to close the roads in the inner village loop (Victoria Street, Letch Lane and Sherborne Street) and the High Street from 9.30am to midday. The Rissington Road will be closed from 9:50am to 11.30am (eastbound) and from 10.30 until about 11.30am (westbound).

We'd be extremely grateful if people could avoid driving at these times especially the route from Landsdowne to the Rissington Road. If you do need to leave the village, please follow the instructions of one of the many marshals who'll do their best to help.

For those wanting to watch the race,

and some of Gloucestershire's finest athletes in action, we'd recommend walking along the Rissington Road for a longer, uninterrupted view. The middle of the High Street, where the race starts and finishes, can get very congested and we need to keep the route clear for finishers from about 10.30am to 11.15am.

Darren Long and Maxine Emes joined over 300 other runners at the *Woodcote* **10k**, organised by the Rotary Club of Pangbourne; the route comprising of 6Km downhill followed by 4Km uphill, making it a tough race. Keeping up with tradition

Coronation of King Charles III on 6th May 2023

Here in the UK and across the world we revere traditions. The recent death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth highlighted the importance we place on traditions on such momentous occasions. They are an important part of our culture where they help to generate community spirit and help us to gather to commemorate an occasion.

One such tradition is the ringing of bells; this has taken place for thousands of years ever since the first bells were made. At first this was the single toll of a bell to mark events or to call people to meetings or services. This evolved into change ringing - the sound we associate with weddings, church services, funerals and special occasions such as the Platinum Jubilee and other Royal events.

Change ringing is a fascinating hobby which originated roughly 350 years ago in England. It has something for everyone — dashes of music, physical exercise, meditative concentration, a sociable team sport, and a little maths (optional) all put together. Groups of people co-operate to change the order in which they ring their bells according to a precise pattern.

Here in Bourton-on-the-Water, there is a small band of bell ringers (or to give it its proper name Campanologists). As with any group activity new members are always welcome, they will be shown how to control the bells and explained what the different sequence of ringing

entails. It is a hobby that is both mentally and physically stimulating plus it can be a simple or as complex as you wish. It is an activity that can be enjoyed by all age groups from teens to retirees and all inbetween. There are safety guidelines in place for young ringers.

We urgently need to recruit more ringers if we are to answer the call to 'Ring for the King'.

If you would like to join us to be part of this 'tradition', please come along to a practice night and give it a try. It's tricky to start with, but very rewarding. As a ringer – you would always be wanted!


We're just getting over Christmas and everything's gone quiet, a bit flat
