Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council Notes

Parish Council notes from the meeting held on 1st March 2023.

County Councillor Paul Hodgkinson confirmed that Gloucestershire County Council voted through a council tax increase of 4.99%.

District Cllr Nick Maunder advised that CDC are working to complete the refurbishment of the Rissington Road car park prior to Easter. The number of spaces will increase with an additional 6 spaces to include 16 EV car charging spaces.

Plans are being progressed to reclaim the Bourton to Kingham disused railway line as a cycling/walking/riding route with funding being secured for a more detailed feasibility study and stakeholder consultations.

Steve Cotton, Village Warden reported that he will be starting his summer season hours of 30 per week from 1st April and hopes to spend time working with parish councillors on local matters, along with his many other duties in the village.

Members of the public raised the matter of on-street parking by visitors. The Chairman advised that a possible Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) is being discussed with GCC Highways which could include 'no entry except for access' signs on some residential streets. The Parish Council have paid an additional fee for increased monitoring of parking by GCC's enforcement team.

The proposed TRO would also restrict access into Lansdowne by bringing traffic in via Station Road and GCC have started a consultation process on the impact of this.

Gigaclear will be installing underground cabling in the public open space adjacent to Croome Gardens. The contractor has yet to advise on dates for this work.

The Coronation Working Group confirmed that the Bourton Big Lunch will take place on Sunday 7th May from 1.30-4.30pm on the field between the Primary School and the Cotswold School. This is a free event with music and entertainment and those attending are asked to bring their own picnics.

Parish Council Elections: A reminder that the deadline to apply for a seat on the Parish Council closes at 4pm on Tuesday 4th April. Nomination papers must be submitted in person to the Returning Officer at Cotswold District Council's Trinity Road offices. Nomination forms can be downloaded from their website here https://cotswold.gov.uk/about-the-council/elections-and-voting/current-and-future-elections/. We have an increase in seats from 11 to 13 from the May elections, so please put your name forward if you would like to make a difference for your local community. Please contact the Parish Clerk if you would like more information on the role of Parish Councillor and how you can help.

Bourton Roadrunners




