Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council Notes

Parish Council notes from the meeting held on 5th April 2023.

County Councillor Paul Hodgkinson provided clarification on highways proposals which had been reported in last month's Bourton Browser. This was in relation to a proposed Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) which could include 'no entry except for access' signs on some residential streets. Funds are available from CDC's Tourist Levy for one part of the TRO and Cllr Hodgkinson will provide match funding to allow for two separate TROs. GCC Highways have investigated restricting access to Lansdowne, although they would prefer not to restrict access if possible but would be in favour of deterring motorists from entering off the Fosseway. Roman Way and other residential roads would also be part of a restricted access TRO. When proposals have been put together the Parish Council will undertake a public consultation.

District Cllr Nick Maunder was pleased that the Rissington Road car park had been reopened in time for Easter but there was a delay in the installation of the EV charging points. Management of the leisure centre has been re-contracted for a 10-year period. Cllr Maunder was thanked for his time as District Councillor for Bourton Village.

Parish Council

Play Rangers: Grant funding of £5,000 has been awarded from the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner and £1,108 from Moore Friends. The sessions continue to be popular and the Co-Op, the Dial House and the Chip Shed provided food for the recent Easter holiday session which was grant funded via Play Gloucestershire.

MUGA at The Naight: Following recent concerns from neighbours on noise, our contractor has provided tools and equipment for regular maintenance to be carried out. All outstanding work in this respect has been completed and it is anticipated that this will address the current problems with noise and reverberation of the panels.

Cotswold District Council's Tourist Levy Funding: Funds totalling £48,463 from parking at the Rissington Road car park have been received by the Parish Council for projects approved by CDC. An additional £6,690 has been approved for repairs to the riverbank and work will be carried out in the coming months. The Parish Council has been asked to create a list of suggested projects for 2023-24 which will be the subject of a public consultation by CDC in June or early July.

Parish Council Elections: We have been advised of an uncontested Parish Council election, with 12 councillors being elected unopposed, leaving one vacancy for co-option, possibly at the June meeting. The new councillors will be Sharon Coventry, Amanda Davis, Bob Hadley, Lynda Hicks, Jonathan Jowitt, Leanne Launchbury, Martin Macklin, Andy Roberts, Madan Samuel, Jon Wareing, Len Wilkins and Bill Wragge. The councillors will officially take up their roles for the next 4 years on 9th May and the new Council's first meeting will be the Annual Meeting on 15th May.

Coach Park Update: The owners of Bourton Vale car park have confirmed that the existing coach park will close on 31st December 2023. The Cotswold School considered taking the coaches, but this may prove impractical and is being investigated. CDC have been asked if an increase in car parking charges would be considered at the Rissington Road car park to counteract the loss of revenue, to enable a coach parking facility. If no coach parking solution can be found, a Traffic Regulation Order will be required to stop coaches entering the village.

Members of the public were asked to report any instances of obstruction to the police on 101 and parking on double yellow lines will be dealt with by GCC's parking enforcement team.






Road Safety: There are 20mph and 30mph road safety stickers available at The George Moore Community Centre for your use if you would like to remind drivers that your road has a speed limit.

North Cotswolds Rotary (NCR) distributed £3,500 to 7 local charities through its Helping Hand grants

In March NCR ran its Helping Hand scheme for the second year. Grants were awarded to address a wide range of needs; from buying play equipment for an educational hub, to contributing towards a short vacation for disadvantaged children who would otherwise not get an opportunity to go on any sort of holiday.

The Helping Hand scheme is aimed at small local charities and community groups that don't have resources for fundraising. The grants of up to £500 make a small but significant difference. Representatives of each organisation complete a simple form. If they meet the schemes requirements, they're invited along to give an explanation of their needs and to answer any questions. This year we were oversubscribed but it was gratifying to be able to help 7 organisations. These were: Art Uplift run by Cotswold Medical Practice, Bledington School Association, Condicote Playgroup and Toddlers, North Cotswold Community Awareness, Stow Community Land Trust, Stow Youth Club and The Cotswold School.



Community activities for older and vulnerable people in the north Cotswold



Community activities provided by charity, Cotswold Friends, are supporting older and vulnerable people to live a life less lonely in the North Cotswolds - with new activities, including Friendship Cafés and a new Community Garden, launching this year.

Almost 400 clients of the charity already attend over 20 different activities, providing them with a chance to meet new people and have a chat, take part in crafts and projects, or just have a friendly cuppa and a bite to eat.

They include the charity's Men in Sheds and She Sheds projects in Chipping Campden, Moreton, Bourton and Northleach, where members are often found busily making planters, bird boxes, hedgehog houses, kindling and more. The 'shedders' always welcome new recruits to come along and share ideas and skills, or simply enjoy the friendly atmosphere.

Cotswold Friends also runs 10 different Lunch Clubs in locations around the North Cotswolds, giving those who may be older, lonely, or isolated the opportunity to get together with others for a hot meal and the chance to socialise. The charity's Kineton Pub Lunch Club has recently re-started and takes place at The Halfway, Kineton near Guiting Power, on the second Tuesday each month.

Cotswold Friends' Walking Football activity has been running since 2017 and is fun for everybody, currently taking place every Friday from 9.30am to 11am at Blockley Sports Field. It's for men and women of all ages, providing fitness and new friends, and you don't need any previous experience.

Meanwhile a new Friendship Café in Stow-on-the-Wold, launched by the charity in March, aims to combat loneliness and isolation over a cuppa. The Stow Friendship Café takes place between 10.30am and 12pm on the first and third Tuesday each month at Brio Beechwood Park. A Friendship Café in Moreton will also be up and running with the charity soon.

Also new for 2023, a Community Garden is being developed behind Stow Surgery for surgery patients and local older residents to use. Cotswold Friends are currently looking for volunteers to help create the Community Garden, which will include raised beds of flowers, herbs and vegetables, accessible paths, seating and a sheltered area.


