The 'Getting Connected' short course at Moore Road Community Centre, introduced me to a tutor and a bevy of friendly, savvy volunteers who were glad to answer confusing questions and bring light on the subject. The whole idea for the course came from a local resident who could see it was needed.

Best of all, was the sociable encouraging feeling amongst everyone who had come to get a bit more independence with a laptop, a tablet or a smart phone. After all, we get told, "Oh, a 7 year old could fix that!", but you know there is never one around when you want one, is there? Not everyone has a grandson who will drop everything to help Gran or Grandpa.

As soon as I started the course people were comparing their experiences, having a cup of coffee and feeling how nice it was not to be the only one wondering which button did what and why. Being able to ask any question at all without feeling stupid was great, and each session ended with volunteers coming round to offer one to one help.

I suppose my main impression of this course was that I always went back home feeling very cheerful! I think that came from improved confidence and independence, but also from talking to a

really nice lot of people. What's more, like my fellow learners, they were nearly all my sort of age (I'm 76). Linda Clark

#### **Bourton Mile**

Win Completes Hat Trick for Robinson There was a thrilling finish to the Bourton Mile when Ben Robinson beat his training partner, Richard De Camps by less than a stride to win the Gloucestershire county title in Bourton-on-the-Water. Robinson, from the Bristol & West club, who had already won the Berkeley 10km and mile only four days earlier, led from the start and maintained his advantage to cross the line in 4min 31sec.





There was no greater endorsement than that offered by the inspirational 16 year-old Felix Thompson, a regular in the mile, who stepped out of his wheelchair for the finale of the race with mum, Christine. 'That was great,' said Felix. 'I think I've beaten my time from last year and I'll be back to do it again next year.'

The event - which saw 176 finishers - was a triumph for Bourton Roadrunners, who took over the organisation from Norm and Ali Lane, who stepped down after establishing this road mile

more than 20 years ago. Race Director, Gill Carrick said: 'It's an honour for the club and the village to host the county championships for the mile and we were treated to a very good race. We hope the best athletes from Gloucestershire and beyond will keep coming, to chase fast times and even break some records.
