Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council Notes

Parish Council notes from the Parish Council Meeting on 7th June 2023

County Councillor Paul Hodgkinson reported that the A429 will be resurfaced either side of the Northleach traffic lights over the next 6 weeks and further resurfacing will also take place between Bourton and Northleach. Please report any potholes online at https://www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/highways/roads/your-highways-report-it/

Work has started on the new road at the Air Balloon roundabout, although actual construction work will not start until September. The Cheltenham to Seven Springs road remains closed for works until September.

Cllr Hodgkinson has been elected as Cotswold District Council's Cabinet Member for Health, Leisure and Culture. Bourton Leisure Centre now comes under his remit, so please send him any comments or concerns.

District Councillor Len Wilkins (Bourton Vale) reported that Joe Harris has been reelected as Council Leader and Mike Evemy as Deputy Council Leader. Councillor Wilkins will sit on the Audit Committee.

District Councillor Jon Wareing (Bourton Village) said that he'll be sitting on CDC's Overview and Scrutiny Committee and Short Term Lets Committee. Cotswold District Council has been asked to consider using the Rissington Road car park as a potential solution for coach parking. There will be a further meeting to discuss the coach park in July.

Paintwork refresh: The Cemetery's Lych Gate and the Baptist Cemetery gate have had a new coat of paint, along with some of our benches in the village, and they are all looking very smart!

Rye Crescent Play Area: Plans are being progressed to refurbish the site with new equipment. Residents will be invited to attend a meeting at the play area to give input and discuss ideas for new play equipment design.

Getting Connected Digital Technology Course for Older People Time to apply?

Our next course, in which people over 55 years of age learn how to manage a computer and/or smartphone, is expected to start in September.

A tutor leads the sessions and our dedicated volunteers help people with 1-1 teaching. We also have a programme of visitors attending. In the last course, our visitors included a Fraud Protection Officer who taught us how to be safe online and a bank manager who helped with questions about banking online.

We have some openings available for older learners on our next course. It's advisable to express your interest as soon as possible as there are only eight places. Each course takes place on Tuesday mornings in Bourton-on-the-Water, with weekly sessions over twelve weeks.

Message from the Church

On 4th June we celebrated Trinity Sunday. On this day we reflect on the Church's teaching that God is one God, but three persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit; a seemingly irrational statement.

When we speak about God, we will always find ourselves struggling because he is inexpressible. Beyond our finite, earthly minds to grasp fully.

The late Pope Benedict explains in his book 'Introduction to Christianity', that the description of God as a 'Trinity' is not so much an attempt to define God, as to draw together historical experiences of him.

When we read the Old Testament we are able to see that the writers focused almost entirely on God as the father figure of the Hebrew peoples.

In the New Testament God reveals and defined himself in a completely unexpected and different way: He took human form, confining himself to the limitations of this present world; this life of mortality. Whilst in this world He speaks to his heavenly Father, to God.

The Father-Son relationship is confirmed at Jesus's baptism. St. Matthew recounts the voice from heaven: 'This is my beloved Son with whom I am well pleased.'

After Jesus's Ascension, God's presence among us was revealed in a third way: as God the 'Holy Spirit' who works in our midst today: through Scripture; through the seven Sacraments, through the ministry of the Church, through prayer, and who dwells within each one of us, who guides us, who inspires us, who speaks to us through our consciences, through our will, through our intellects.

It is useless to speculate on how God can be both three and one, because God stands beyond definition, beyond the capability of the human mind to comprehend. He stands above singular and plural, male and female. He bursts all categories.
