Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council Notes

Notes from the Parish Council Meeting on the 5th of July 2023.

County Councillor Paul Hodgkinson reported that he will be meeting the Deputy Area Highways Manager in the coming weeks and will raise Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) matters. An email from a Parishioner regarding Moore Road traffic is on the agenda for the next Highways Committee Meeting. He said that as the NHS (National Health Service) celebrates its 75th birthday the service faces many challenges. It is important that we retain and if possible, enhance the range of services at Moreton Hospital.

District Councillor Jon Wareing (Bourton Village) reported that Pulhams Coaches are off the table for the provision of extra coach parking. They are looking to increase their own bus services and will need the parking. He will investigate why the Recycling collection was a day late in some parts of village. Where a collection is missed it should be left out for collection the following day.

Parish Council

Parish Council Office: With effect from 1st July 2023, the Parish Council's new office opening hours for in-person enquiries will be Tuesday to Friday 10am-1pm (or at other times by prior appointment only). However, residents can continue to contact the office by telephone or email during staff working hours Monday to Friday 9am-3pm.

Parish Council Office Holiday Closure: 17th to the 21st of July and the 31st.

Locum Clerk: While the Clerk is on leave, we have Linda Morrison Allsopp as our Locum Clerk.

Co-Option of Parish Councillor: Sarita Tapper was co-opted to fill the vacant Parish Councillor position. As the only candidate she was appointed unopposed and welcomed to the council.

Small Grants: We will be considering applications for small grants up to £1,000 during September. Apply at http://www.bourtononthewaterpc.org.uk/community/bourtonon-the-water-parish-council-7919/grants/ . All applications to be submitted by 20th August for consideration. We have taken the decision not to offer any large grants in this financial year, but this will be reviewed for 2024-25.

Library Challenge for children aged 3-12: We are providing, free of charge, the Windrush Room or Salmonsbury Room on four dates in August & September to support the Gloucestershire Libraries Challenge for children aged 3-12.

Parish Council Logo: The Parish Council decided on a logo. Designed by councillors at no cost to Parishioners, the logo will be used for digital purposes such as the website & social media, but also for letterheads and meeting papers when appropriate.







Cotswold Fosseway Lions Club





Organised by the North Cotswold Rotary, Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust and Brio Retirement Living, the route was a mixture of trail and quiet country roads. Bourton Roadrunners had seven runners taking part, with few others supporting the organisers with various aspects of the event.

Rebecca Townsend, also celebrating her birthday, completed the course in 50 minutes and 10 seconds, finishing 3rd senior woman. She was followed by in-form Tom Hill in 53:32 with Chris Dry close on his heels in 54:39. Running together were Samantha Mellor and Tom Knight, establishing a consistent pace and making good progress with the challenging terrain, finishing in 69:25 and 69:27 respectively. Tom also achieved 3rd MV65. Jeanette Brew, running with a work colleague, was in good spirits completing the 10k in77:24, closely followed by Coral Feenan-Hill in 78:37. Coral was also 3rd LV60.

Meanwhile on the same day, Bourton's Andy Peaston ran in the *Evesham 10k*, organised by Evesham Vale Running Club. Following an interesting route around the streets, parks and riverside paths of historic Evesham, Andy finished in a respectable 50 minutes and 20 seconds.

But rest is essential. Without proper rest we are unable to function. We suffer mentally, physically and emotionally, so it is essential to our bodies to find time to be still. As a mother of four children, I well remember how difficult it was to find that 'me time', but I also discovered that if I didn't, things got on top of me and my reaction to situations was not one of peace and calm.

However, Jesus' most famous words about rest are: "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest" Matthew 11:28

Firstly, the invitation is to **all** who are weary. God does not promise us a life devoid of hardship. Jesus saw that we were like sheep without a shepherd and needed someone to turn to so he laid down his life so that we might have life. 



The Cotswold Friends 'Champions' understand that learning to use IT equipment can be a daunting experience and offer support, step-by-step guidance, and assistance to help the charity's older and vulnerable clients feel comfortable and confident in their abilities.

The funds raised by the charity's Crowdfund Cotswold crowdfunding campaign in autumn 2022 have been pivotal to the success of the Digital Inclusion project.

Dedicated volunteers have been trained and are equipped to provide valuable digital assistance to older and vulnerable people in the Cotswolds.

In the future, Cotswold Friends aims to train up even more Digital Champions and provide interactive training sessions for people looking to improve their digital literacy, such as understanding internet routers in the home and their wireless set up.


