Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council Notes

Parish Council notes from the Parish Council Meeting on 4th October 2023.

The Police highlighted a new link to on-line reporting of non-urgent anti-social behaviour, see Report antisocial behaviour | Gloucestershire Constabulary

County Councillor Paul Hodgkinson is in discussions with Gloucestershire County Council Highways to progress Traffic Regulation Orders (TROs) for coach parking with a potential for an on-street drop off/pick up solution. He will also be meeting with GCC Highways and the Parish Council to progress the other village-wide TROs.

District Councillor Jon Wareing's report highlighted a significant shortfall of £448,000 in Cotswold District Council's budget for this year. This means that the District Council is actively looking to make savings through improved efficiency as well as cost cutting.

Refurbishment of Rye Crescent play area: A successful public consultation event was held during September and the working group continues to progress plans for new equipment.

Tourist Levy Funding: The Parish Council will once again receive monies from Cotswold District Council car parking charges in the Rissington Road for projects in the village. Three projects have been selected for funding by the levy, following a public consultation by CDC on a list of potential projects put forward by the Parish Council. These are: Installation of planters and seating around trees in the area in front of The Willow Pub, resurfacing of the path at Periwinkle Bank and planting around the edge of Clapton Row. Initials cost estimates and plans are being drawn up at this stage.

War Memorial: The Parish Council was awarded a grant of £280 from the War Memorials Scheme to fund 50% of the cost of repairs for the war memorial. It is hoped that the repairs can be completed over the next few months once we receive the appropriate permissions from the District Council.

Hedges, Shrubs and Trees: The Parish Council would like to remind householders and landowners of their responsibilities to cut back any hedges, shrubs or trees that may be overhanging the pavements or footpaths bordering their property. This is to ensure the safety of pedestrians and allow sufficient space, where possible, for the use of wheelchairs and buggies. Please ensure the full width of a pavement is kept clear, ideally with a minimum cleared width of 1.1 metres (3ft 7 inches). Head clearance should be a minimum of 2.1 metres (approx 7 ft). Please check your hedges and shrubs prior to cutting back to ensure there are no nesting birds present.

The Parish Council would like to thank The Wright Signs of Shipston-on-Stour for carrying out works to the signage at the George Moore Community Centre without charge.

Memorial Safety Testing will be carried out at Bourton-on-the-Water Cemetery in Cemetery Lane and St Lawrence's Churchyard in the High Street from January 2024.




Hill Farm Hare

Message from the Church

We are living in very dark days. Conflicts in Israel and Ukraine are stunning us all. After two world wars and many other conflicts that have raged and continue to rage around the world you would think that we would have learned something. Millions of people have died and are dying because we have not learned to live together in peace.

My dad was called into the army at the age of 18 to fight in World War II. He saw many of his friends killed. Dad survived but the effect and the trauma of it all lived on in him. Many veterans today who have been deployed in the more recent conflicts have to live with the images and sounds of death. This in turn affects their families and many break down because it is too much to bear. We

remember with grateful hearts those who gave their lives to defend us but also all those men, women and their families who continue to live with the effects of war.

Yet war is nothing new. Man's inability to live in peace has always existed. Jesus was born into a land occupied by the Romans. The people lived under oppression and violence. Indeed, King Herod was so threatened by his birth he had all the baby boys under two killed.





I have asked for the demand for payment of £100 to be cancelled.

It is ridiculous for the car park entry camera to record details of vehicles visiting only the Co-op and/or the Little Cotswold Laundry. It should be repositioned to record only vehicles entering the car park.

I understand that I am not the only person to have been caught out in this way. How many others have had to argue to get their PCNs cancelled or even been forced to pay because they could not provide evidence of the true reason for their visit?

Urgent action is required to rectify matters.





Bourton Roadrunners



A Bourton Roadrunners' fundraising quiz night has raised more than £3,250 for Parkinson's UK and Cure Parkinson's on a night dedicated to Neil Russell's epic 918 mile run from London to Barcelona.

Neil, a longtime member of Bourton Roadrunners, was diagnosed with Parkinson's in 2018 and maintains that running has helped him deal with the condition. He completed his run in the summer and began the evening by telling the sell-out audience at the British Legion Hall how he often ran in the early hours to combat the extreme heat through France and Spain. Last month, he was named as ITV West Country's Pride of Britain Regional Fundraiser of the Year for 2023.

The general knowledge quiz, raffle and a busy bar meant that Bourton Roadrunners will be able to present the charities with a cheque for £3,252.71. Organiser, Allie Quinn, the club's social secretary said: 'It was a very successful evening put together by a big team of volunteers who were only too happy to do what they could to help Neil's cause.'

Neil's partner, Nicky described the amount raised as 'overwhelming'. She added: 'The money will help greatly to-

wards the job of finding a cure and supporting people with Parkinson's like Neil.

'There were many people who helped put the evening together but we all know that Allie was the force behind its success. The support she gives to the club and all its members is always fun, positive and inspiring.'

Meanwhile, three of Bourton's younger runners headed north for this year's *Chester Marathon*, one of the country's most prestigious events. Eva Shoemark, in only her second full marathon, ran with Tom Hitchman and Alex Pye, maintaining a consistent pace throughout the 26.2 miles. Eva and Tom, finishing together, were rewarded with a superb time of 3 hours, 23 minutes 33 seconds, with Alex just four minutes behind at the in 3:27:45.



On the same day, Bourton's Darren Long and Maxine Emes raced nearer to home, at the *Cricklade 10k*, where Darren finished first-man in the Vet 50 category in a time of 41 minutes and 7 seconds, while Maxine was third woman overall (2^{nd} LV40) in 45:49.

As always, Bourton Roadrunners were out in support of *park-run*, where three of its younger runners led the way at Chipping Norton, with training partners Thomas Harvey and Edward Hare finishing first and second overall in 19:14 and 20:11 respectively; both in the 11-14 year category. Just a whisker behind in fourth place was Douglas Hamilton-Smith in 21:08.

We Want Your Old Hand Tools

Last year Rotary in the Rissingtons collected a mountain of used hand tools to be refurbished in Wales and sent on to Mwanza in Tanzania. Since that time we have been repeatedly asked if we were doing the initiative again .. "I have just found some tools in my shed" .. is the usual comment. Well, we are and have decided to extend our collection into Bourton-on-the Water.

We are asking you to look in the shed and in the dark corners of the garage. We are looking for spades, forks, trowels, screwdrivers, pliers, saws, spanners even sewing machines ... any tool which can be used by local Tanzanian people to build houses and fishing boats, farm the land and make things to sell. They do not have to be perfect as the charity will fix them before they are sent to Africa. Tools in a very good condition may also be sold at the charity shop to help fund their transport costs.

Tools for Self Reliance Cymru is an independent charity based just over the border in Wales that works with other similar charities in the UK. The tools are then sent to four regions in Tanzania where the charity is in the process of developing training workshops to further improve the skills of the locals through the use of the tools.

It is not just on the pitch we are working hard either! Complementing our weekend


