Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council Notes

Notes from the Parish Council Meeting held on 8th January 2024.

The Police will be holding a Police Point session between 10 and 11am on Thursday 1st & 22nd February 2024.

County Councillor Paul Hodgkinson reported that a proposed 5% rise in Gloucestershire County Council's part of the Council Tax was likely to be accepted.

District Councillor Len Wilkins (Bourton Vale) reported that Cotswold District Council were introducing a new Parking Strategy and had statutory responsibility for car but not coach parking. As part of the Levelling Up Act, planning fees would be increased by 25% for householder development and commercial applications by 35%, to be increased annually in line with inflation.

District Councillor Jon Wareing (Bourton Village) advised that there were over 500 comments on CDC's recent budget consultation, some being in respect of coach parking in Bourton.

Periwinkle Bank Resurfacing: The footpath between Station Road and Cemetery Lane is very well used and gets muddy during bad weather. A contractor will be surfacing this path over the next few weeks using funds from the Tourist Levy.

2024-25 Budget and Precept: This is still under review, pending discussion with Cotswold District Council on funding for additional parking enforcement. The Parish Council will meet at 7pm on Monday 29th January to agree final figures.

Coach Parking, pick-up and drop-off: This was discussed at an Extraordinary Meeting on 18th December. Local businesses proposed to provide coach parking for one year on the industrial estate. It was agreed that the representatives of the Parish Council, District and County Councillors and local business owners would have further discussions with the Cotswold School to see whether there was scope for drop-off/pick-up in their coach turning circle. However, at that meeting it was concluded that this option was not viable for many reasons, including safety of pupils and passengers. It was agreed that members of the business community would approach other businesses and land-owners in the village to explore pick-up and drop-off options.

The following Position Statement was published following the Parish Council meeting:

Regretfully there is now no dedicated parking for coaches in the village. The Parish Council has spent many hours in discussions with Cotswold District Council, Gloucestershire Highways, the Police and local businesses without reaching a solution that balances the needs of our residents, businesses and visitors.

The Parish Council's influence over this situation is very limited in that the Rissington Road Car Park is the property of the Cotswold District Council, the ______

Bourton 10k, Sunday 25th February



Bourton Roadrunners hosts its annual 10k road race at 10am on Sunday 25 February.

We're always very grateful to Bourton residents for their patience and tolerance around the disruption this causes to village life.

This year we're expecting around 700 runners and their supporters, so we can expect increased traffic before and after the race. We'll encourage runners to use the main car parks in the village. We'll do our best to manage traffic and discourage people from using residential parking or the leisure centre.

We have permission to close the roads in the inner village loop (Victoria Street, Letch Lane and Sherborne Street) and the High Street from 9.30am to midday. The Rissington Road will be closed from 9:50am to 11.30am (eastbound) and from 10.30 until about 11.30am (westbound).

We'd be extremely grateful if people could avoid driving at these times especially the route from Landsdowne to the Rissington Road. If you do need to leave the village, please follow the instructions of one of the many marshals who'll do their best to help.

For those wanting to watch the race, and some of Gloucestershire's finest athletes in action, we'd recommend walking along the Rissington Road for a longer, uninterrupted view. The middle of the High Street, where the race starts and finishes, can get very congested and we need to keep the route clear for finishers from about 10.30am to 11.15am.

We hope you all had a very happy new year! What a start to term we have had! We were very fortunate to have had artists funded by Kingham Lodge Art in at the beginning of January to do a clay workshop. The children really enjoyed experimenting with the clay & learning different techniques to create a time capsule to open in 10 years' time. We are very grateful to Kingham Lodge Art, as this is our 4th set of workshops that they have funded.

Our Reception children's topic is called 'Off we go' and it is all about journeys around the world, road safety and different types of transport. KS1 children have chosen their topic for this half term and they wanted to learn about 'The Titanic'. We will be looking at this event in history - pulleys in DT to move lifeboats up & down as well as some porthole artwork. 

Don't throw away your empty chocolate tubs, Jubilee Lodge will take them!

The team at Jubilee Lodge is ready to take empty plastic chocolate tubs as part of Greene King pubs' #Tubs2Pubs campaign.

With the festive season now over, most of us have already eaten countless sweets, mince pies and chocolates. If that includes the round tubs of chocolates, you might be wondering what to do with the empty container. While some people can find a use for them as reusable storage, the vast majority will end up being thrown away - a huge waste!

The team at Jubilee Lodge in Bourton-on-the-Water is keen to get involved with the Greene King initiative to collect as many tubs as possible and save them from landfill. Instead, they'll be sent to a reprocessing centre to be shredded. From there, the plastic will be sold on to manufacturers who will be able to reuse the plastic in other products and packaging. These plastics are harder to recycle and not all councils are able to do so yet, so this campaign will help get the tubs to the right facility to make them reusable. Monies raised from the sale will go to Macmillan Cancer Support.

You can take your tubs to any Greene King pub, and or, if it's easier for you, leave them at Jubilee Lodge and we'll take them across to Greene King. We're taking Celebrations, Roses, Quality Street, and similar plastic cheese cracker and biscuit tubs - just make sure they're empty and clean. 


