Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council Notes

BOURTON-ON-THE-WATER PARISH COUNCIL





The Over 65's flu/Covid vaccines are available to book free of charge for certain categories. Those eligible are urged to contact their doctor's surgery or pharmacy. Flu vaccines are also available for over 18s on a paid-for basis at pharmacies.

Sewage issues in Roman Way during recent bouts of heavy rain have been resolved by Thames Water. Residents are urged to report non-emergency issues using www.fixmystreet.com, otherwise use the GCC Highways Emergency number 08000 514514 or the government's Floodline on 0345 988 1188.

District Councillor Jon Wareing's (Bourton Village Ward) report highlighted that CDC approved the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) bid for a GCC Interchange Hub at Bourton. Cabinet approved the bid on the understanding that the funds for the bus stop opposite the war memorial would not be released until GCC reached an agreement with the Parish Council on the final design and layout.

District Councillor Len Wilkins (Bourton Vale Ward) noted that there were ongoing issues with waste collections being missed.

Coach Parking, pick up and drop off: County Councillor Hodgkinson arranged a meeting with Parish Councillors, officers of the county and district councils and members of Bourton Business Network. Cllr Hodgkinson noted that there were some positive developments to take forward, although use of the Rissington Road car park has now been discounted on cost grounds due to the amount of remedial work that would be required to the drainage and car park surface.

Remembrance Day Parade, Sunday 10th November: There will be a parade at 10.45am from the Royal British Legion down to the War Memorial on the Village Green where a service of commemoration will take place. All are welcome to attend. Please note that there will be a road closure in place from 10.30 to 11.30am in the High Street at the junction of Moore Road to the junction with Victoria Street. In addition, on Sherborne Street from the junction with the High Street to the Mill Bridge.

Christmas Lights switch-on Friday 29th November: We are looking forward to having a Christmas tree in the river as usual this year. There will be a small event on the Village Green to mark the switch-on of the Christmas lights. Children from the Primary School will sing carols in front of the Victoria Hall at 4.15pm with the lights switch-on at 4.30pm. It is anticipated that some local
