### Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council Notes

BOURTON-ON-THE-WATER PARISH COUNCIL

### Notes from the Parish Council Meeting held on 6<sup>th</sup> November 2024

**County Councillor Paul Hodgkinson** is working with local business owners to get a temporary arrangement in place for coach parking on the industrial estate. It is hoped to get a longer-term solution

in place at the Cotswold School but costings are still being put together by the school and funding would most likely be needed from multiple sources.

**Clapton Row Green:** Cotswold District Council's Tourist Levy funds are being used by the Parish Council for the planting of a Prunus Lusitanica evergreen hedge around the perimeter of Clapton Row. This will be in place of the existing stones and is to prevent vehicles driving over the Green.

**Proposed new bus stops in the village centre:** Gloucestershire County Council Highways have submitted proposals for the design and location of new bus stops, funded by the Community Infrastructure Levy. Members of the Highways Committee are providing feedback on three sites in the High Street; near the Edinburgh Woollen Shop, outside The Willow pub and outside the former Cedars site (opposite the war memorial).

**Grant funding:** The Parish Council would like to extend their grateful thanks to the following:

- The Rockcliffe Charitable Trust for their donation towards the Rye Crescent play area refurbishment.
- Gloucestershire County Council and County Councillor Paul Hodgkinson for the Build Back Better grant of £5,000 towards outdoor gym equipment at The Naight and Melville play areas.
- Cotswold District Council for £10,000 from the Rural England Prosperity Fund to part-fund the cost of replacement windows and doors at the George Moore Community Centre.

A new working group will explore options for ensuring the safety of residents and visitors in the village centre. Following an initial meeting, this group will be open to any resident who wishes to volunteer. Meeting dates will be advertised in the Browser and our website.

**Bourton to Kingham cycle track project:** The Council received an update that this project is still ongoing, with a report from Sustrans expected soon. It is hoped that this project will establish a sustainable route between Bourton and Kingham station and generally reduce motor traffic in the parish.

**Christmas Arrangements:** The Parish Council offices will be closed from Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> December to Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> January inclusive.



### Message from the Church


As we enter December we come to the church season of advent. This is a time of waiting as we prepare our hearts for the arrival of God's most precious gift, his son Jesus.

### **Bourton Primary Academy**





A lovely walk from Adlestrop where Edward Thomas was inspired to write his famous poem 'Adlestrop', when his train made an unscheduled stop and he wrote about what he saw and heard. From there we walk to Chastleton, and Chastleton House, owned by the National Trust. The Jacobean house was used as the Seymours' house in the television series of Wolf Hall. From here we walk on through the remains of Chastleton Barrow fort to the village of Cornwell and Cornwell Manor, a prestigious wedding venue. We head back to Adlestrop via Daylesford, home of Warren Hastings, the first Governor-General of India. Daylesford is now the home of Sir Anthony Bamford of JCB fame and the venue of Boris Johnson's late wedding reception. Bring a drink/snack. Start: 10.00am Adlestrop Village Hall GL56 0YR. OS Map ref: SP 242 272. W3W: sourcing.outfit.exotic.



### Something to Celebrate?

Bourton is excelling again this year with 2019 hours of raw sewage discharged into the Rivers Dikler and Windrush to date, surpassing the 1371 hours total hours in 2023. As the first sewage treatment facility on the Windrush, the system is beyond capacity and has become a significant contributor to the continued decline in the river water quality.

A new citizen science group has started within the Bourton Sustainability Network in the hope of gathering evidence on the continued decline of the River Windrush. The Windrush Action Group, known as WAG, will begin monthly testing in December 2024 at four locations around Bourton. Testing for nitrates, phosphates, and turbidity are key indicators and will result in a better understanding of the chemical health in the Windrush.

The group hopes to invite other groups along the river to join and start testing in the
