Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council Notes

BOURTON-ON-THE-WATER PARISH COUNCIL

Notes from the Parish Council Meeting held on 8th January 2025

County Councillor Paul Hodgkinson drew attention to the government's English Devolution White Paper which contains proposals to move from the current two-tier county and district council to unitary councils. This will affect town and parish councils who may

be given devolved powers if the proposals are taken forward in Gloucestershire. A decision is awaited from central government.

Cllr Hodgkinson was thanked for his support by providing a grant of £3,000 from the Build Back Better Youth Fund towards the Rye Crescent play area refurbishment project.

District Councillor Len Wilkins (Bourton Vale) - the report gave further details on the government's devolution proposals. Cllr Wilkins expressed concerns that the loss of district councils could lead to the needs of rural Gloucestershire communities being sidelined.

District Councillor Jon Wareing (Bourton Village) – data was requested from CDC on the use of the car charging points in the Rissington Road car park, especially overnight. Cllr Wareing is concerned that residents are not accessing this facility which was created for their benefit.

Cllr Wareing also highlighted how the proposed devolution could give the opportunity for the Parish Council to take on a wider role in the community.

Coach Parking: County Cllr Hodgkinson outlined proposals from Gloucestershire County Council Highways to create a temporary pick-up and drop-off point in Meadow Way, adjacent to Jubilee Lodge. This would involve pedestrians walking from Meadow Way into the village. The temporary arrangements would be implemented via an Experimental Traffic Order for an initial period of six months at no cost to the Parish Council. Parish Council were due to meet in late January to debate proposals to determine if they have the support of the Parish Council.

The longer-term option for coaches parking at the Cotswold School remains under consideration.

Village Green Refresh: Our contractors will be carrying out extensive re-turfing works on the Village Green at the end of January. This will be partly funded by the Tourist Levy to ensure the Village Green looks at its best for the forthcoming spring and summer seasons and can be enjoyed by residents and visitors alike.

Rye Crescent play area: The refurbishment works are planned to take place following Spring half term which means that the facilities will be unavailable for a few weeks. We apologise for any inconven-

Unitary Authorities and Devolution

A major shake-up of local government is on the cards and I wanted to share the detail with you.

Just before Xmas the Government issued a White Paper proposing 'devolution' and 'unitary authorities' across England. In Gloucestershire we are currently the only area within the West of England to have 'two tier' councils i.e. a county council responsible for certain things like roads and social care and a district council responsible for things like bin collections and planning. Under those are parish/town councils who look after functions in their area like village greens, playgrounds and cemeteries.

The Government has proposed that all parts of England will move to 'unitary' councils – one council carrying out all the functions which our current county and district councils do. This would happen by 2028 latest.

It would mean that the current county and district councils are abolished and are replaced with a unitary authority. At the time of writing there are two options for this being mooted:

- -a county wide Gloucestershire unitary council
- -two unitary councils: East Gloucestershire and West Gloucestershire.


The benefit of one Gloucestershire-wide council is that it is simpler, you have less staff and less councillors but it is more remote from people and very big. A smaller unitary council would be closer to people but would need to divide services between it and the other one in our county.

At present things are moving very quickly and so it is not clear exactly what will happen.

The most important thing is that any new council is efficient, sufficiently close to residents and has simple and easy to understand structures so that we can all deal with it as easily as possible when we need to.







On January 13th we had a very informative and interesting talk on Rudyard Kipling. He is always, in most people's minds, associated with India and the Raj, but in fact, he only spent a short while there. He was sent to a school in England when he was 5, where he was badly treated and rescued by his Aunt, who was married to the painter Edward Burne-Jones. He returned to India and at the age of 16 and became an editor of a local newspaper and began publishing short stories. He left India at the age of 24, via a world tour. In London he had several short stories and poems published and met Carrie, an American, whom he married. They lived in Vermont for a while, where the Jungle Book was written, but came back to England when he was 31, finally settling in Rottingdean near to the Burne-Jones family and later, Bateman's, now a National Trust property. He was very famous by now and lived a comfortable life, writing stories and poems and buying expensive cars until his death at the age of 72. Two of his children died, but his widowed wife and daughter lived on for many years looking after all his works.

First stop, the Chemist

We have been asked by the NHS to seek help at the chemist if a health problem is not an emergency. I took that advice, as for two weeks I could not get rid of a hacking cough. Armed with that information he knew what to prescribe. He said that the mucus must be cleared from my chest and prescribed cough mixture to be taken four times a day. Within four days my cough eased and then slowly went away, but it left me with no energy for about a month. As I was at the chemist I also asked if I could have a flu jab and that was given.

One morning recently I woke up not able to lift my arm, making it very difficult to dress. I paid another visit to the chemist and saw the same dispenser, again he checked what medication I was taking and then diagnosed that I had an inflammation of a muscle under my shoulder blade. He prescribed a cream to use twice a day for a week and all now seems well.

I have since thanked the dispenser for all his help and advice.

Next time you are under the weather try making your first stop the chemist. They certainly helped me without contacting a GP.
