#### Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council Notes

PARISH COUNCIL

**BOURTON-ON-THE-WATER** Notes from the Parish Council Meeting held on 5<sup>th</sup> February 2025 Police update: The mobile police station will be at the Co-Op from 10am to 2pm on 8<sup>th</sup> April. The current team for Bourton comprises PCSO John Allen, PC Frank Ward and new Sergeant Philippa Moore.

County Councillor Paul Hodgkinson reported that Gloucestershire will not be in the super-fast phase of moving to a unitary authority council, it will be in the second phase. The new council is expected to take effect in around 2028.

Ambulance response times in Bourton are very poor and Councillor Hodgkinson is going to meet with ambulance staff to discuss a possible solution.

District Councillor Len Wilkins (Bourton Vale): Government updates to the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) were outlined, including greater emphasis on social rent, affordable housing, climate change and renewable energy. Residents are urged to continue to report missed bin collections, both to CDC and Cllr Wilkins.

District Councillor Jon Wareing (Bourton Village): CDC's budget for 2025-26 was to be approved on 6<sup>th</sup> February with a recommended increase of £5 for a Band D property. The report highlighted concerns about rising costs and timetable changes at the Leisure Centre. A study is investigating strategic growth proposals for Moreton which are part of the Local Plan and Cllr Wareing asked that traffic mobility along the Fosse Way and sewage infrastructure are also considered.

Coach Parking, pick-up and drop-off: The Parish Council endorsed a temporary coach parking solution by a majority vote. The scheme will require formal approval by senior officers at GCC Highways before implementation, with a potential launch date by Easter

Under this temporary arrangement, coaches will be permitted to pick up and drop off passengers in a designated on-street parking bay on Meadow Way, near the junction with Station Road. Visitors will then walk into the village via The Avenue (adjacent to the Cotswold School) and continue to the High Street.

Councillor Hodgkinson emphasised that this is a temporary measure, supported by both himself, Bourton Business Network and the Cotswold School, to ease congestion while a long-term solution is developed. The preferred permanent arrangement remains the establishment of coach parking, pick-up, and drop-off facilities at the Cotswold School.

This scheme will be funded by Gloucestershire County Council and therefore will not result in a direct cost to the parish.

Rye Crescent play area: A reminder that refurbishment works are planned with an anticipated start date of week commencing 3<sup>rd</sup> March, but this is weather dependent. We have arranged with Gloucestershire County Council

Crescent (usually used as parking bays), to be closed during the construction phase. This is to enable contractor access and deliveries to site. We apologise for any inconvenience to neighbours and users of the site during works which are expected to take around three weeks.

VE Day 8<sup>th</sup> May and VJ Day 15<sup>th</sup> August 80-year anniversary: Members of the Parish Council will be forming a working group to plan small commemorative events in the village on these dates.

GCC Highways Consultation on the Traffic Regulation Order for the A429 and A436 Traffic Calming Scheme: The Parish Council raised concerns about the proposals to install bollards without a speed reduction and suggested to GCC



that a 40mph speed limit should be put in place from the top of Whiteshoots Hill and on through Slaughter Pike.

#### **Coach Parking**

At the Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council meeting of 5<sup>th</sup> February the Council voted to accept the proposal by GCC Highways to implement an Experimental TRO (Traffic Regulation Order) in Meadow Way, adjacent to Jubilee Lodge Care Home, to facilitate the drop-off and pick-up of visitors arriving by coach in two coach bays, in 10-minute slots, between the hours of 09:00 and 16:00.

An affirmative decision in support of the proposal, by a majority of 5 for, to 3 votes against (Cllrs Davis, Wareing and Wilkins) with 1 abstention, was taken despite there being:

- No guarantees about the enforcement provisions that, according to Dan Tiffney from GCC Highways, are essential to make the Experimental TRO work.
- An assurance that the pilot TRO can be stopped at any point in the event that it is too disruptive, but there being no mechanism for doing so because there are:
  - No clear criteria for evaluation of whether it is working well or disastrously,
  - No specified means of determining whether it is adding to, what is acknowledged by those advocating the pro posal as, an already heavily congested part of the traf fic infrastructure of Bourton at the end of the school
- · No consideration for the views and feelings of the management, residents and families of residents of Jubilee Lodge (which in case you were unaware, provides individualised dementia, nursing, intermediate and respite care for up to 74 residents.)
- No consideration on the potential negative impact on safety of coach loads of visitors occupying an already busy stretch of pavement used by schoolchildren and parents, often with buggies, at the end of the school day.

- A dependence on coach drivers complying with signage instructions, despite ample evidence suggesting these instructions are likely to be disregarded.
- A preparedness to gamble on the risk of increased congestion causing economic harm to the industrial estate.

Coach parking has been one of the most weighty, time consuming and divisive topics in front of Council in the last few years. One might think therefore that it would merit a thoroughly comprehensive and considered thought process before moving to a vote. Residents, quite justifiably, should have expectations of a high level of scrutiny and debate on issues demanding leadership in the community on their behalf.

In our view, the lack of diligence in scrutinising the proposal and failure to obtain clarity on the above points, prior to a vote, was not only mysterious and surprising, but meant that it was impossible to give it our confident support.

An unfortunate consequence of the way this decision unfolded is to give encouragement to those who perceive Bourton Parish Council to always roll over in the face of tourism business interests.

As holders of public office, we should be open and objective, taking decisions impartially, fairly and on merit, using the best evidence and without discrimination or bias. It is in the spirit of openness that we take this opportunity to shine a light on legitimate concerns that remain unaddressed.

The jubilant tones struck in some of the media coverage trumpeting a solution to "coach-parking hell" following the vote, seem both ill-judged and premature. Simply moving the pinchpoint of unbearable visitor coach congestion to another unsuitable location in the village is not a solution. It manifestly does not address the root cause of the problem and there is no assurance that it even addresses the symptoms. But it will involve GCC spending public monies at a time when council budgets are under enormous pressure.

It bears repeating. Bourton does not have the road infrastructure to cope with the excessive volumes of visitor vehicles (coaches and cars) that we experience throughout the year. A park and walk solution on the periphery of the village, off the Fosse, is the only practical workaround to address this (unless miraculously fewer visitors decide to descend on Bourton).

Such a solution would have the distinct advantage of permitting residents to park in the village centre on the occasions when they wish to use their local services and shops in a way we can only dream of as things stand. Who knows? Were this to happen, we might also see a few more shops retailing things that local people want to buy!

#### Coach parking - news at last

The village has had no designated coach parking since early last year after Bourton Vale car park decided to end coaches parking in it. This led to a summer of frustration for residents as some coaches dropped off passengers in unsafe locations.

Now a solution has come together which will give coaches a specific drop off and pick up point away from the village centre plus a longer term solution centred on the Cotswold School.

In February, Bourton Parish Council voted to back a Gloucestershire Highways proposal which will see coaches use a new drop off and pick up bay on Meadow Way between 9am and 4pm where there are spaces for 5 cars to park currently.

Having worked with Gloucestershire Highways, Bourton Business Network, Pulhams Coaches and the Parish Council over the last few months I'm delighted that we have finally reached a solution which will start solving the frustrations everyone has felt on this thorny issue.

Under the proposal, which Highways have designed, coaches will not enter the main village but will enter via the A429 at the Industrial Estate and drop off and pick up passengers for 10 minutes maximum on Meadow Way. After this they turn right onto Station Road, back to the industrial estate and will park at Pulhams coaches site. This means that coaches will not cause traffic issues in the bus stop outside the Cotswold School nor around the centre of Bourton or the Rissington Road. This scheme will be piloted by Highways for 6 months and should start in the Spring to cover this year's tourist season. It will be reviewed regularly within the trial period.

There will be signage for tourists to follow to get to the village via The Avenue and for coaches to follow too.

Longer term, the Cotswold School is looking at ways to improve its own parking on site, create better sports pitches and enable coaches to park too which will then provide a permanent coach parking solution. I'm actively supporting the School in achieving that.







Well it hasn't got any better has it? Dull, grey, wet, cold – but spring is really trying with snowdrops shooting up everywhere and hellebores putting on a lovely show and even a few primroses appearing.

Our speaker at our February meeting was Mandy Bradshaw a journalist for many years writing articles for Cotswold Life on Cotswold Gardens. Her topic for us was "Through the Garden Gate - Cotswold Gardens" and, Mandy who is also a photographer, supported her excellent talk with some beautiful slides.

She introduced us to many gardens, some well-known and some new to us. From Highnam Court with 40 acres and 3 lakes to a small semi-detached house in Cirencester where the owner had over 400 day lilies. In between we visited the formal gardens of Stowell Park to informal planting at Astall Manor designed by the Bannermans who also worked at Highgrove. The Walled Garden in Worcester had been abandoned for 50 years but is now a famous herb garden planted on the Victorian footprint. In Evesham, Harolds Hardy Plants a nursery and garden was created by two sisters (a teacher and a nurse) from an acre of wasteland. There were also gardens created around some businesses - Reed Training Company in Long Compton, and hotels - Barnsley House (now The Pig hotel) and Whately Manor nr Westonbirt and even a Wildlife Park at Burford where the planting often matched the homeland of the animals, so lots of tropical plants.

Our competition for a small display of snowdrops was won by Sue Davis.

Our next meeting is on Wednesday, 12<sup>th</sup> March, 2025 starting as usual at 7.30pm in the Baptist Church Hall in Bourton when our speaker will be Ian Sadler talking about Formative, Restrictive or Renovation Pruning. The competition will be "Flowers in my Garden".



#### **Bourton Probus Club**

At our AGM on 27th January, our current committee was re-elected en bloc, with Ian Leppingwell remaining as Chair. For several members this was going to be their last year on the committee and an appeal was made for new volunteers.



On 10th February we had a talk on "The Rise, Fall, and Rise of the English Country House" by John Hancock. He started in Tudor times, with the dissolution of the monasteries and gifts of houses made by the monks, and then moved to the Golden Age in the 18th and 20th centuries until 1914. He gave us examples of several days visiting, with favourite games, shooting, parties and walks. During the 1st world war many country houses were used as hospitals and convalescent homes. After the war several hundred country houses were pulled down or had major parts destroyed, representing a major fall. Again during the 2nd world war country houses were used as hospitals and some had other uses, such as Bletchley Park and the Enigma code. Some were used as luxurious prisoner of war residences for senior German captives (where they were spied on for any relevant war information!). After the 2nd world war many became hotels and conference centres, or apartments. Some were saved by films and television, notably Highclere Castle used in 'Downton Abbey'. All in all, a fascinating and well received talk.




