Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council Notes



Notes from the Parish Council Meeting held on 5th March 2025

The Police attended the meeting with Police Sergeant Philippa Moore introducing herself as she has recently transferred to Stow Police Station.

Coach parking, pick-up and drop-off: Updates were received from County Councillor Paul Hodgkinson and GCC Highways. Arrangements for the experimental TRO are still under review by GCC Highways before a decision is made on the temporary pick-up and drop-off arrangements in Meadow Way.

Councillor Hodgkinson met with the Cotswold School and other organisations to move forward with the longer-term coach parking solution at the school which would incorporate a new 3G sports pitch.

Installation of new Sunroom windows and Library windows and doors at the George Moore Community Centre: This work has been completed, thanks to part funding of £10,000 received from Cotswold District Council's Rural England Prosperity Grant. The front of the building now looks much smarter as the old and rotting wooden-framed units have been replaced with double glazed sealed units.





Refurbishment of Rye Crescent play area: Work is due for completion by the end of March, and we hope the new equipment will be enjoyed by all who use it. We plan to hold a small opening event so please look out for the date when advertised. We would like to thank our grant funders who made the project possible - The National Lottery Community Fund, Gloucestershire County Council's Build Back Better Fund and The Rockcliffe Charitable Trust.

Tourist Levy funding: Cotswold District Council approved funding towards a first responder first aid kit and additional railings for the George Moore bridge from the 2024-25 levy monies. The Parish Council is working on a list of projects for 2025-26 which will be the subject of a Cotswold District Council public consultation later this year.

Please bring a hard-boiled white egg if you want to join in.





Bourton Vale Horticultural Society – Your friendly garden club

A week of blue skies and warm temperatures lulled is into thinking that it was spring. Then back came the cold winds and zero temperatures to confirm we are not there yet. But it won't be long now. Buds are definitely swelling on our hornbeam hedge and we have tons of frog spawn in the pond. The less enjoyable sign of spring is the racket made by the rooks nesting in our beech tree.

Our speaker at the March meeting was Ian Sadler who gave us tips about pruning especially not to be feint hearted about it. He takes his lawn mower to "prune" heathers (3 weeks after flowering). For grasses put a bungee tie around them and then cut to ground with hedge trimmer. Makes it much easier to collect up all the trimmings. Buddleia - cut very hard in March. Yew, twice a year in early summer and September – yew will reshoot from the trunk. Wisteria – tidy in July with hedge trimmer and use secateurs to cut back to 2-3 buds in winter. For berried shrubs you need to be selective so as not to cut out all the berries, so take out a few branches and leave the rest. Mophead hydrangeas cut back to fat buds in spring.

Our competition of Flowers in my Garden was jointly won by Lu Webb with a very pretty arrangement and Marie Russell with a beautiful display of hellebore flowers floating in a bowl.

Our next meeting is on Wednesday, 9th April starting as usual at 7.30 pm in the Baptist Church Hall in Bourton, when we will have our Plant and Seed Swop and GQT. The competition will be a Small Display of any Flowering Bulbs.

Christians are encouraged to do three things in Lent, which ends on Easter Eve: to pray, to fast, and to do works of charity. Many people give up alcohol or chocolate, or another luxury at this time. Whilst this is wholesome and good for our self-discipline, Lent provides an opportunity under the heading of 'fasting' to cut out activities which waste time. For instance, how much of the day do we spend gazing mindlessly at our iphones and the TV? By encouraging us to simplify our lives the Church encourages us to make more time for good works: calling on a friend who we know is housebound, taking a neighbour to an appointment who cannot drive, etc. But we are also encouraged during Lent to review our own priorities and the direction of our lives. Here is an opportunity to reboot relationships with family and those whom we find difficult. Do we have a grudge? Lent encourages us to be generous and put differences behind us. But of greater importance still is the need for us all to consider our future, not in a spirit of fatalism and depression but realistically. We will all die, we know not when, whether we are young or old. Have we thought about God? Do we believe in Him? Easter teaches us that there is life after death for us all, but even so, we shall be judged by a merciful God on the way in which we have led our lives. May be the time has come for each of us to find out more about the person Jesus, who, as God and Man, has experienced personally the worst that humans can do to each other, but who rose from the dead and loves each one of us deeply.






Bourton Primary Academy







Coach Parking

Following the excellent report on coach parking by councillors' Len Wilkins and John Wareing, I attended the Parish council meeting on Wednesday 5/3/24 to see for myself. It soon became apparent that although many hours had been spent with the business network there was no intention to discuss the problem with the residents.

After 2 years of rumours, you would have hoped for some transparency and involvement for the residents from the people elected to represent us.

Proposals by councillor Hodgkinson have been rushed through without any scrutiny and are, in my opinion, disruptive at best and very unlikely to help with the problem.

However, my greatest concern is the introduction of potentially 250,000 tourists down the avenue alongside 2 schools and a toddlers' nursery, starting age around 3 years old. This equates to 1800 school children put at a risk that isn't necessary, to expose them to potential harm, including welfare, health, safety, and education, which in my opinion, is unacceptable.

The primary school teachers often escort the children to places like the library, church etc and this proposal will undoubtedly complicate all these activities.

I was informed at the council meeting that if I had any concerns with the proposals I should write to the clerk.

I therefore suggest that if any resident has concerns as to how the problem is being dealt with or proposals on the industrial estate and potential risk to the children please write or email the parish clerk.


