Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council Notes

BOURTON-ON-THE-WATER PARISH COUNCIL

Notes from the Annual Meeting held on 7th May 2025 Election of new Chairman: Council unanimously elected Councillor Lynda Hicks as Chairman for 2025-26. Lynda, who has served on the Parish Council for 10 years, takes over from Councillor Andy Roberts who is now Vice Chairman. We would like to thank Andy

for his hard work as Chairman over the past two years. **Committees:** Council adopted a new Committee structure made up of Finance Committee, Community and Services Committee, Planning Committee (incorporating Highways quarterly) and Staffing Committee. Committee members and Chairmen were elected at the Annual Meeting.

Coach Parking, pick-up and drop off: County Councillor Paul Hodgkinson updated on 7th May that the Experimental Traffic Regulation Order for a coach drop-off and pick-up bay in Meadow Way had not been published by Easter as anticipated as it incorrectly showed a 20-minute waiting time rather than 10 minutes. In addition, there were issues on site which prevented the installation of the signage, without which the Order could not be enforced.

Gloucestershire County Council's Deputy Area Highway Manager attended an Extraordinary Parish Council meeting on 12th May and updated that GCC were awaiting a response from the utility company before the signage could be installed. The scheme will run for six months from the eventual start date, during which time feedback will be invited from local residents, organisations, businesses, the Parish Council and County Councillor on the suitability of the temporary arrangements.

At the Extraordinary meeting on 12th May, three Parish Councillors put forward a motion for the Parish Council to "withdraw its support for the Experimental Traffic Regulation Order for Meadow Way given the publicly stated lack of support for the proposal by residents and coach operators". Some residents were given the opportunity to share their concerns and opposition to the ETRO. Following debate, the motion was not carried.

Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) Funding: Council has received a total of £11,919.56 from the development on land at Our Lady of Peace Catholic Church and this will be used for infrastructure projects.

On 28th April, our secretary continued the story of his life and career. Having become very active in designing printing for computers, he was sadly hit

Q

when a German firm sold all its companies including his. Despite this setback he bought an old armament factory in Wetherby and set up his own printing press. He stayed in this business for the rest of his working life but then became involved in shipbuilding and sailing, which has continued to the present day.

This led very conveniently into our talk on 12th May by John Barnett, on Titanic. He reviewed the history of the three White Star vessels, Britannic, Olympic and Titanic and their fates. Then he told us about the Carpathia the boat that saved over 700 of the passengers and crew, before turning to the Titanic. He disabused many of the stories told. It was never described by the company as unsinkable. It is said that there were too few lifeboats - 16 + 4 inflatable ones. This was the maritime recommended number, and nothing at all to do with the White Star Liner Line shipping company. At the time of the sinking, Titanic was travelling at 22 knots through the ice. He described the sinking and the surrounding boats - the California and Carpathia and why the ship California, which was nearer, did not help. Titanic was launched on 10th April 2012 and sank on 15th April. One myth for filmgoers - if you see smoke coming out of the rear funnel of a boat with 4 funnels, that never happens the rear funnel has steps inside for boilermen to reach their accommodation!. All in all, a fascinating and revealing talk.





Our Play Rangers are trained playworkers who bring their skills and equipment directly to children in schools and community spaces. The focus is always on child-led play, meaning the children decide what they want to do. We simply help create a space where fun, creativity, and freedom thrive.

You'll spot us arriving with a van full of kit, setting up our Base Camp—usually an art table with windbreaks—and from there, the adventure begins. Children may get stuck into anything from den building and water fights to art, tag, hide and seek, or even experimenting with special equipment (under Ranger supervision, of course).

Our sessions are designed for school-aged children, but under-8s are very welcome when accompanied by a parent or carer. We love it when whole families get involved—there's something for everyone!

All our sessions are open access, meaning there's no need to register, and children are free to come and go. While Play Rangers keep a watchful eye, we won't stop children from leaving the site and may not always know they've gone.

We encourage children to take responsibility, learn from their experiences, and even work through disagreements. Our team steps in only when absolutely necessary.

At Play Gloucestershire, we believe children need to take risks in order to grow. Outdoor play does carry the possibility of scrapes and bumps, but we carefully manage the environment to keep risk within safe boundaries.



Harry Wells won the **Bourton Mile** and, in a thrilling sprint finish, it was only the shortest of strides that separated him from his friend and former team-mate, Richard De Camps. For Wells, 24, a long-time Gloucester AC athlete who now competes for

Victoria Park Harriers & Tower Hamlets club in London, it meant a Bourton double, coming after his victory in February's Bourton 10km. The pair finished well clear of Western Tempo's Luke Carroll in third but there was no course record bonus as Wells clocked 4min 21.5secs, only half a second in front of De Camps. He said: "The aim was to try and feel comfortable, wind it up through each quarter and any sprint finish was me reacting to Richard coming alongside me in that final stretch." "I know Richard well and he always used to beat me. I thought he might catch me this time so it's nice to get the win."

With three-time winner, Ben Robinson opting not to run, it was Wells' loping stride and impressive pacing that proved enough to secure victory. His times for each quarter mile were 67sec, 66sec, 66sec and 61sec.

The women's race saw a first Bourton Mile win for Abbie Milnes as Weston Tempo secured a one-two. Milnes, an Art teacher from Cheltenham College, crossed the line in only her second road mile in 4min 57.6sec. Her team-mate, Amber Watson took second place in 5min 9.6sec, holding off the chal-

lenge of the fast-finishing Steph Lane from Bourton Roadrunners. "That was my best time for the mile," said Milnes. "I felt good until half-way but I enjoyed it."

In this, the biggest Bourton Mile ever staged, there were 50 entrants for the Junior Mile, with the boys' race won in 5min 3.1sec by Jack Taylor of Witney Roadrunners and the girls' race won in 5min 34sec by Lily Sienna Hodgeson from Chepstow Harriers.

A total of 179 runners completed the mile along the flat course which starts on Rissington Road and ends in the centre of the village.

Race Director, Gill Carrick said: "It was a fabulous evening for running fast and that was reflected in the times in a top-quality race. We'd like to thank everyone who turned out to support the runners."



HARTWELLS THE IRONMONGERS

Many of you will now have heard that Hartwells will be closing towards the end of the year, because our lease is expiring and my landlord does not wish to renew it.

I understand that the business has been in Bourton since about 1805 – the year of the Battle of Trafalgar. Originally in another building, and in the present building since about 1880.

The business comprised the existing shop, (which used to have a petrol pump outside), a branch in Chipping Norton, (which was also a hardware shop) and the garage in Broadlands, which dealt in the sale & maintenance of agricultural machinery. It provided employment for quite a lot of people in the village, and some of their families still live here, such as the Cyphus, Minchin & Mosson families.

In the early 1930s, during the depression, the Hartwell family sold the business to the Galloways, who then lived in what is now the Dial House Hotel. For many years, the Bourton shop was run by Ron Penny.

I purchased the business in 1993, and have run it since then, with a <u>huge</u> amount of help from Bridget Cullimore (who has worked here since 1971!!), Erin Holden (who has worked here since 1998), and, more recently, Ken Lamacraft, who started 4 years ago.

I am very sad that the long connection of Hartwells and the village of Bourton is coming to an end, but it has been a very special thing to me, to have been able to run a useful shop in such a wonderful location. We have had our "moments" over the years, and as all the residents will know, Bank Holidays in Bourton can be quite a trial, but I want to say a very big "thank you" to all those of you who have supported us so well for so long. **David Barker**

District Councillor View on the Extraordinary Parish Council Meeting of 12th May

An Extraordinary Parish Council Meeting was held on 12th May in order to consider the following proposal

"We propose that the Parish Council withdraws its support for the Experimental Traffic Regulation Order (ETRO) for Meadow Way (for a coach drop-off and pick-up bay) given the publicly stated lack of support for the proposal by residents and coach operators."

This was put forward by Cllrs Wilkins, Davis and I because, at the time of the previous vote, Councillors were not fully aware of:

- The legitimate anxieties of residents about the scheme. In particular, their public health and safety concerns.
- The concerns of some coach operators about the safety and workability of the scheme and subsequent withdrawal of some coach services as a direct consequence. (Who described it as "ill-thought-through and could be prone to operational disasters." and "The site that they have chosen is right at the junction so it's not safe.")
- The nonsensical, baffling and frankly self-defeating negative impact of the scheme on the visitor experience.

Cllr Paul Hodgkinson (GCC) had said that he would not push this scheme without the support of the Parish Council which was duly given by a majority vote of 5 to 3 at the parish Council Meeting of 5th Feb, 2025

Given that Parish Council support was required to progress this scheme (developed without consultation with the Parish Council or residents) and that the opinion of our residents should be intrinsic to the decision of the Parish Council, we believed that we needed to create the opportunity for residents to have their say. Especially as the proposal was rushed through at the February meeting without any full discussion or debate by Council.

I'd like to put on record my appreciation for residents who took the trouble to voice their concerns about the Meadow Way ETRO. There was a solid body of correspondence and a good showing in person at the 12th of May meeting.

Residents who spoke up did a great job in expressing their deep reservations about and also their opposition to the scheme.

In the end, disappointingly, the views of residents fell on deaf ears and made no difference whatsoever to the prevailing view of the majority of councillors to give the scheme a try. A named vote was requested. Those in favour of withdrawing Parish Council support for the Meadow Way ETRO were Cllrs Wareing, Wilkins and Davis; those voting to continue support for Meadow Way ETRO were Cllrs Hicks, Hadley, Wragge, Millington and Macklin. Cllr Coventry abstained

The lack of acknowledgement of the concerns of residents was, in my view, a poor reflection on the Council's new Mission (that was approved at the April Council meeting) which is: "Working together to ensure community is at the heart of everything we do." Neither did it seem congruent with one of the three primary objectives of Council which is "To be representative of residents' interests whilst managing their expectations. Focused on the wellbeing of the community."


This was a golden opportunity to demonstrate that this is a Council that listens to the people who it is supposed to represent. Instead, it reinforced the perspective of residents who believe the Parish Council is unrepresentative of their views and that there is no point trying to voice their concerns.

There is no official or formal monitoring of the way this scheme will work, so it is up to local residents to keep an eye out and report to the Parish Council and Gloucestershire Highways any issues once the scheme goes live.

Finally, let me say that I have no issue with being part of a collective decision if the process to arrive at the outcome has been thorough, taking into account all the relevant information and perspectives, and weighting these accordingly. In my view this has not been the case and such is my deep dissatisfaction with the entire way this ETRO has been handled, I confirm that I have resigned my position as a Parish Councillor. Not an entirely easy decision to make given the importance of work the Council needs to progress, but a principled decision nonetheless.

I will explore if there are other means, alongside my position as District Councillor, of serving the community, listening to residents and making a positive impact in reversing the degradation of our social, natural and economic environment, to build a stronger, resilient and more sustainable community.








COTSWOLDS RADIO BORN TO BE HERD
