Notes from the Parish Council Meeting held on 28th May 2025 Co-Option of a new councillor: Council noted the resignation from the Parish Council of Jon Wareing, who will remain our District Councillor for Bourton Village. We are hoping to co-opt a new Parish Councillor at our 3^{rd} September meeting – see separate

advertisement for further details. Please contact the Parish Clerk if you would like to apply.

Parish Council Committees: Following Councillor Wareing's resignation, Councillor Sarita Tapper was co-opted to the new Community and Services Committee, Councillor Len Wilkins to the Staffing Committee with Councillor Lynda Hicks becoming Chairman of that committee.

Coach Parking, pick-up and drop-off: There were no updates from Gloucestershire County Council Highways on the implementation date for the six-month Experimental Traffic Regulation Order in Meadow Way. However, some coaches have been observed turning left off Station Road into Meadow Way and stopping to drop passengers by Station Meadow, which has caused an obstruction. The Parish Council agreed to ask GCC Highways to review whether current signage on the Fosse Way, to direct coaches in via the industrial estate entrance, will be adequate.







Rye Crescent play area re-opening: A ceremony took place on Saturday 7th June to mark the official re-opening of the refurbished site. Parish Council Chairman, Councillor Lynda Hicks made a speech, cut the opening ribbon and thanked our sponsors and all who had been involved in the project. Children enjoyed playing on the equipment and we were pleased to see that the grass is greening up following a period of very dry weather after the turf was laid.

On Tuesday evening, Bourton WI members were entertained by "Racing" Richard Phillips of Adlestrop Stables.


Richard's love of horses began when he was a young child growing up near Epsom Downs and he decided at the age of 7 that he wanted to be part of the racing world.

Springvale Allotments: A new seven-year lease has been signed to enable the Parish Council to continue to lease the land from Cotswold District Council for provision of allotments.

Holm oak on the Village Green: Extensive works were carried out to this tree in the centre of the Green to enable it to remain in place for some years. The Council agreed to seek advice on the most suitable type of succession planting for the future of the Village Green.

Police update: Police Inspector Simon Ellson will be transferring to a new role in Stroud after six years in this area and his replacement will be Acting Inspector Phillipa Moore.

Bourton to Kingham cycle route: A design summary report commissioned by Cotswold District Council has been produced by SUSTRANS. The report outlines concept designs for a greenway along the former Banbury and Cheltenham Direct Railway route. It is understood that Cotswold District Council will be appointing a Sustainability Officer to progress this project.

Hedges, Shrubs and Trees: The Parish Council would like to remind householders and landowners of their responsibilities to cut back any hedges, shrubs or trees that may be overhanging the pavements or footpaths bordering their property. This is to ensure the safety of pedestrians and allow sufficient space, where possible, for the use of wheelchairs and buggies. Please ensure the full width of a pavement is kept clear, ideally with a minimum cleared width of 1.1 metres (3ft 7 inches). Head clearance should be a minimum of 2.1 metres (approx. 7 ft). Please check your hedges and shrubs prior to cutting back to ensure there are no nesting birds present.

County Councillor Paul Hodgkinson has become Cabinet Member for Public Health, Communities and Fire. Gloucestershire County Council's new leader, Councillor Lisa Spivey is the first woman leader in its 135-year history, and she is joined by new Chief Executive Ms Jo Walker.

District Councillor Jon Wareing's report highlighted CDC's commitment to maintaining the two public toilets in Bourton due to the high number of visitors. Information has been requested on the business case for each of the facilities should they be offered to the Parish Council as part of the local government reorganisation and devolution.

Councillor Wareing is seeking to engage with the District and County Councils on 'over-tourism' and visitor and traffic management as well as with GCC Highways on the time taken to initiate TRO activities in relation to white lining and yellow lining in the parish.

Message from the Church

I was very touched when both the local Church of England clergy sent me an email when Pope Francis died on Easter Monday. 17 days later Cardinal Prevost now Leo XIV – was elected Pope by the College of Cardinals. Many of you will have seen the film Conclave. Cardinal Vincent Nichols, Archbishop of Westminster, reports that the reality of a Conclave was nothing like Edward Berger's film. He writes: 'With 133 cardinals present, there was no rancour between us, nor any kind of politicking by which someone might have tried to promote themselves or block someone else. It was marked by fraternal unity and prayerful discernment'. Cardinal Nichols added that they were in total isolation from the outside world as they began the process of election; no mobile phones, computers or electronics and even his electric toothbrush was inspected by the officials! The prayerful discernment' worked: within 24 hours Cardinal Prevost received the 2/3rd majority needed.

The new Pope is an American but served in Peru as a missionary in remote areas for many years. He speaks several languages, is a scholar, he exudes calmness and reassurance and wept with emotion in his first public words to the World's 1.4 billion Catholics. His first words were: 'Peace be with you.' Cardinal Nichols adds: 'Above all Pope Leo has a very gentle manner, although he thinks clearly and can be decisive. I have seen him resolve difficulties without leaving enemies behind him.'

Popes are appointed to be the Chief Shepherd of the Catholic Church, but in a way, to all Christians, following in the steps of St. Peter. He is called to 'bring the hope of the Gospel into the 'waters' of the world, to sail the seas of life so that all may experience God's embrace'. We priests are called to help him.



We are, at the moment, in consultation with the council regarding whether we need planning permission to have a Memorial Bench placed by the river in Lansdowne. We have found a company, TDP, who make plastic benches that are a sustainable choice made from 100% recycled plastic and we think look excellent. We are thinking of the 2000mm size bench so that you could seat 4 people, with either an engraving and/or a plaque in memory of George and Mildred. We may also need to consider having a bin sited beside the bench.

Once we know the final cost associated with the bench, including engraving, planning and installation costs, we can consider the best use of the remaining donated money. If there is sufficient left, one thought is to have one of the electronic 'Slow Down' signs installed where the RTA occurred, in the hope of preventing future accidents. 




