Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council Notes

PARISH COUNCIL

BOURTON-ON-THE-WATER Notes from the Parish Council Meeting held on 2nd July 2025

Coach Parking, pick-up and drop-off: County Councillor Paul Hodgkinson updated that the Meadow Way drop-off and pick-up was still not in place as GCC Highways were waiting for SSE to move a cable so the required signage could be put into place. This will enable the Experimental Traffic Regulation Order (ETRO) to be

enforceable. Another four-week wait was anticipated. The coach bay road markings were already in place but not being used by coaches so it was agreed that the Parish Council would write to Pulhams Coaches and Bourton Business Network to ask them to communicate to coach companies that the bay is available for use.

The six-month trial ETRO was originally planned for Easter 2025 but will not now start until August at the earliest. Cllr Hodgkinson will recommend to GCC Highways that the trial covers Spring 2026 to ensure that it can be properly assessed.

The proposed longer-term solution at the Cotswold School is currently not an option as funding is unavailable for their 3g sports pitch so the project cannot be progressed at present.

Co-Option of a new councillor: We are hoping to co-opt a new Parish Councillor at our 3rd September meeting – see separate advertisement for further details. Please contact the Parish Clerk if you would like to apply. The deadline for completed applications is Wednesday 27th August.

VJ Day Commemoration Friday 15th August: Please join us on the Village Green from 9pm for a short ceremony, including the lighting of the beacon at 9.15pm, to commemorate the 80th Anniversary of Victory over Japan, the final end of the Second World War.

Live streaming and recording of meetings: The Parish Council agreed in principle to purchase suitable equipment to enable live streaming of future meetings to encourage attendance by a wider audience. This facility will be advertised when available.

Parish Council Strategic Plan: A draft document was approved and will be the subject of a public consultation. Details to be advertised in the future.

It was agreed to send a request to Cotswold District Council to extend car parking charges at the Rissington Road car park after 6pm to maximise Tourist Levy income. In addition, to keep the Church Room public toilets open after 6pm.

Thames Water work to the pumping station and sewage treatment plant on the Rissington Road will not now be completed until the third quarter of 2026 due to bad weather hampering work last year.

County Councillor Paul Hodgkinson's report included the following:

The Liberal Democrats have taken control of the County Council and Cllr Hodgkinson is now on the Cabinet for public health, communities

(including libraries) and fire services.

The Furrows estate highways and lighting has been formally adopted by GCC Highways so any issues should be reported on www.fixmystreet.com.

Water running down the road at Bourton Hill (The Steeps) has been causing some damage to the road surface. GCC Highways are liaising with a local landowner to get the matter rectified.

The 2012 Traffic Regulation Order banning coaches from the village centre can only be enforced by the Police and not the parking wardens, who can only ticket illegal parking on double yellow lines.

The Parish Council are reviewing issues with the parking warden's work schedule and will send a list to Cllr Hodgkinson for review with GCC Highways Parking.

There has been some missed emptying of bins on the Village Green due to CDC's contractor being short staffed. Residents should report missed collections via CDC's website, see link https://www.cotswold.gov.uk/bins-and-recycling/report-a-missed-bin-collection/.

The Library continues to be very popular and requires additional space.

District Councillor Len Wilkins (Bourton Vale) reported on district council matters, including:

Council Leader Joe Harris resigned as leader of Cotswold District Council and his deputy Councillor Mike Evemy was elected as his successor. Cllr Evemy formally took over as council leader at the Annual Council Meeting on 21st May.

The 4th June Town & Parish Council Summit on local government reorganisation highlighted that the role of town and parish councils was set to become even more important in meeting the needs of local people.

Updates to the National Planning Policy Framework have rendered CDC's Cotswold Local Plan 'out of date', meaning the Local Plan will require a full or partial update.

Have your say on local services: The government plans to reshape Gloucestershire's current structure replacing one county and six district councils with unitary authorities. Your feedback is crucial to show what matters most to residents, how well services are working, and how to make the new system run smoothly. Use the adjacent QR code



to complete the survey or visit https://haveyoursaygloucestershire.uk.engagementhq.com/. Consultation deadline is 9th August 2025.

Police: Acting Inspector Philippa Moore's report highlighted

some incidents of car theft and recommended the use of Faraday pouches to protect keyless ignition fobs, as a preventive measure. The use of fraudulent £20 notes is a big problem, and a money scanner is recommended where possible.

Message from the Church

Over the years we have consistently heard how the church of Jesus Christ in the UK is in decline, that churches are empty and less people are coming to faith. Apart from all the global issues of wars and famines and natural disasters we have crises in mental health, loneliness, health issues but also a loss of hope. Depression and anxiety are often the order of the day. The bible gives us answers to all these things. It tells us all

the things that are going to happen good and bad but in the midst of it all we have a Father in Heaven who sent Jesus to redeem us and his Holy Spirit to live in us so that we can have a deep inner life and strength as we develop a relationship with God.

Despite negativity around church and faith the Bible Society has recently reported that there is a quiet revival in the UK. The decline in church attendance and people coming to faith in Jesus has stopped. There are now over two million more people attending church than there were six years ago across all generations, but the largest increase has been in Gen Z (those born between 1997 and 2012). May this revival continue to grow, and more people come to know and find faith in Jesus. **Rev. Sue Woodley**

Phew what a scorcher!!!

Opening what turned out to be a very busy and hot week, four Bourton Roadrunners headed to the village of Frampton upon Severn for the annual *Frampton 10k* road race. The Bourton team were led home by Alex Pye, looking comfortable

throughout, in a time of 38 minutes and 31 seconds. Close on his heals was Steph Lane, who having finished first female at Evesham 10k the day before, had another strong race but had to settle for third female in a time of 38:50. Kevin Goodwill, had also raced just two days earlier, had a good run in 40:55, ahead of his father Tony in 53:47.

Taking on a the UK's biggest ultra-marathon along the ancient Ridgeway this weekend was Bourton's Danny Hannig at the *Race to the Stone 100k*. This gruelling event saw over 800 runners race towards the 5000-year-old Avebury Standing Stone, with Danny finishing fifth overall in a brilliant time of 9 hours, 48 minutes and 19 seconds.

Dougal Hamilton-Smith took part in the *Dorney Lakes Half Marathon*, finishing first in the under-20 category. Despite finding the going hard, Dougal earned a new personal best time of one hour, 32 minutes and 21 seconds.

A group from the club, together with their friends, travelled to Upton upon Severn for the *Triathlon* and *Duathlon*. Maxine Emes took part in the Olympic standard distance triathlon, comprising a 1500m swim, 42k cycle and a 10k run, where she finished first in the FV40 category and second female overall in a time of 2 hours, 38 minutes and 12 seconds. Also completing the Standard Distance race were Megan Ratcliffe – 3:17:40, Graham Lane – 3:44:20 (MV70/1), Tom Hill – 4:07:04 and Coral Feenan-Hill, who finished first in the FV60 category in 4:19:59. Bourton also submitted two relay teams in the event, comprising Casey Udell (swim), Gillian James (cycle) Lisa Braid (run), who finished first female team, and Jeanett Brew (swim), Jason Braid (cycle) and Allie Quinn (run). Meanwhile, Darren Long took on the Sprint Duathlon, which was a qualifying event for the 2026 World Championships. Darren finished MV50/4 in a time for 1:09:57.

Kevin Goodwill and Alistair Piper travelled to Sudeley Castle for the *Cotswold Maverick*, which offer a range of five off-road distances. Alistair Piper opted for the 45k distance, but despite



finding it 'super tough', finished third overall in a time of 4:47:50. Meanwhile, Kevin took on the 50k distance, battling through 'absolute madness' for a finish in 6:55:37.

Melissa Samuel and Kaz Dean took part in the *Coventry Summer 10k* on Friday evening. With 34-degrees at 7pm in the evening, they both knew that it would tough going. Finishing in 95 minutes and 22 seconds Kaz said it was 'simply the hottest







Birdland – Chirps from the Perch 2025 is becoming a very successful year for us here at Birdland, with many of our species hatching chicks.



One of our successes this year has been our Humboldt Penguins, a species from South America now classified as Vulnerable. We are part of a European Zoo breeding programme (EEP) and this year all 3 pairs have produced chicks, with 4 chicks currently doing well. All our Humboldt's are inexperienced parents, so we have taken 1 egg from every pair to ease the pressure and are hand rearing 2 chicks, with 2 being parent reared.

Birdland now oversees Lapwing species in European Zoos, and we have had

success with 2 species this year. The Blacksmith Lapwing from Africa are rearing 3 chicks (the first for a few years) and we also have the UKs only Southern Lapwing chick (from Argentina). The Southern Lapwings have been unsuccessful previously, so the chick has been fostered by our ever-reliable pair of Masked Lapwing, from Australia.

Also, in our African section we have had 3 Cattle Egrets hatch, as well as 2 Lilac Breasted Roller and multiple Speckled Pigeon. Another pigeon bred this year is the Australian Crested Pigeon, with 2 chicks hatching so far and another nest of eggs at present. In the same aviary our Grey Peacock Pheasants have had a chick for the 3rd year in a row.

Some of the rarer birds to breed this year include the Black Cheeked Lovebird from Africa and the Java Sparrows, recently installed as an EEP.

As I write, we have just hatched our first Greater Flamingo of the year. 2024, with 5 chicks, was our most successful year, however there is potential for a further 21 eggs hatching over the coming weeks. Alistair Keen, Head Keeper
