News from the Parish Council for September

There was no Parish Council meeting in August. Below are updates of activity over the month.

Coach Parking: Joint statement from Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council, Councillor Paul Hodgkinson (Gloucestershire County Councillor for Bourton and Cotswold District Council

Cabinet Member for Parking), Gloucestershire Highways and Bourton Business Network:

The coach parking trial in Bourton-on-the-Water is now under way, and we hope it will help ease congestion in the village and provide a practical, long-term solution.

Coaches are able to drop off and pick up at the designated point on Meadow Way, before parking at a Pulhams site on the industrial estate. Although the signage to formalise the drop-off point has been delayed, it is anticipated that this will be resolved soon. GCC Highways are progressing as quickly as possible to get this final element completed and this will be in place shortly.

In the meantime, the drop-off bay has been marked out, drivers are being asked to use the new arrangements, and parking enforcement is being increased to support the scheme's success.

Coaches should enter Bourton at the industrial estate junction and turn right onto Meadow Way to find the drop-off point by Jubilee Lodge, before turning right onto Station Road and onto the A429 back to the Pulhams site.

We appreciate that it's been a frustrating wait, and we want to thank residents and local businesses for their patience while GCC Highways got everything fully in place. We'll continue to monitor how the trial works in practice and make any adjustments as needed.

Bourton welcomes coaches which park safely and considerately and visitors who come to see our wonderful village whilst respecting local residents.

A second joint statement was issued to all coach companies and coach trade press from Bourton Business Network and Pulhams Coaches to advise the details of the arrangements for the scheme, including a map. The statement can be viewed on our website: www.bourtononthewater-pc.gov.uk/news/





Message from the Church

Once again we find ourselves in September, the month of changing seasons. as we welcome Autumn, the leaves begin to change colour and the harvest is gathered in. A season of next steps and new starts for children as they start school or begin a new term at college or university, and indeed for all those of any age beginning anything new.

New starts often come with a sense of anticipation of what might be ahead. Who might we meet? What will the challenges be? Or even, have we made the right choice?

We would like to welcome all of our new starters to our wonderful school. We hope you all settle in well, whether you are starting your school journey in Reception or joining us part way through your school years.

As we begin the 2025/26 school year, we would like to thank everyone who supported our fundraising efforts to rebuild the school's roundhouse.

Originally built in 2001 to mark the site where the remains of an Iron Age girl were discovered during a school extension excavation, the roundhouse had fallen into disrepair and was no longer safe to use.



In addition to their annual fundraising, FOBS took on this ambitious project—securing grants, leveraging corporate partnerships, and rallying the community through a GoFundMe campaign. With the generous support of The North Cotswolds Rotary, The Free Hospital Trust, 2000 Trees Festival, local businesses, and many individuals, £4,329 was raised to complete the work.

FOBS consulted experts to find the skilled artisans needed. Master Thatcher Dan Quartermain and Coppice Craftsman Anthony Brown worked together to design a structure faithful to Iron Age specifications. Toward the end of term, some children had the unique opportunity to help Anthony mix and apply wattle and daub to the new walls. Over the summer holidays, the restoration was completed.

When the children return this Autumn, they will be greeted by a beautifully restored roundhouse. It will feature in our history lessons, and FOBS plans to invite the artisans back to share their craft, giving the children an even deeper connection to this remarkable project.



We would like to give a special mention for Jenn and Jo from FOBS for putting it altogether and making it work as well as a big thank you once again to our local community for making this possible.







Chirps from the Perch

Onsite Conservation & Gardens & River Fly Training Success

Here at Birdland, we are responsible for the welfare and conservation of over 500 birds, but this month the focus will be for species much closer to home, here onsite with local fauna and flora.

Over the last few months, we have been involved in some local conservation projects and onsite have been focusing on the biodiversity of our woodlands and the part of the River Windrush that flows through the park.

Last week we officially teamed up with Whitney College as a further education partner to have students onsite to support their studies. This partnership has also confirmed an ecological survey of our woodlands to better understand the populations of species that live within them. We already see regular evidence of Otter activity, along with the numerous amounts of woodland birds and the wild Kingfisher. John, our Grounds Maintenance Manager, has also installed several corrugated metal sheets to attract Grass Snakes and will shortly be building some new Bug Hotels ready for hibernation.

Recently, significant progress was marked by Beth and Rob, who completed river fly training with the Evenlode Catchment Partnership in conjunction with the Cotswold River Trust. This training equips them with the knowledge and skills to survey and monitor aquatic macroinvertebrates, an essential metric for assessing freshwater health. Their newly acquired expertise will bolster our capacity to track water quality and monitor ecological changes in this vital habitat and will also add a new education module for schools.

This approach bridges global and local conservation from breeding rare species to safeguarding natural ecosystems. With these new initiatives added to the conservation toolkit, we are stronger than ever in our mission: to protect wildlife, inspire visitors, and champion environmental stewardship across species and ecosystems.
