News from the Parish Council for November

There was no Parish Council meeting in October, but updates on activity can be found below:



Christmas Tree in the River

Bourton's much-loved Christmas Tree in the River Windrush is a festive tradition led by Bourton-on-the-Water Parish Council. Each year, a dedicated group of volunteers and councillors work together to plan and deliver this special display.

This year's tree will once again be supplied by a specialist nursery and installed in November by a team of volunteers. Thanks to generous support from local businesses, the cost of the tree has been fully covered. Bourton Vale Parking Ltd has kindly contributed £500, and the owners of Manor Field car park have offered to donate the remaining £400.

Hacklings Transport will assist with delivery and installation, and CN Baldwin Electrical will dress the tree with lights, continuing their support at a discounted rate. The tree will be removed in January, with Hacklings also helping with dismantling and storage.

The Parish Council is extremely grateful to all those involved, including our local businesses, volunteers, and councillors, for making this cherished tradition possible.

This year's Christmas light switch-on will take place at **5.30pm on Friday 28th November**.

sessions are suitable for school aged children, although under 8's should be accompanied by a parent or carer.

Parish Housing Survey: Gloucestershire Rural Community Council is undertaking a survey to identify the affordable housing needs in Bourton-on-the-Water on behalf of the Gloucestershire Rural Housing Partnership, which includes Cotswold District Council. We encourage anyone living in, working in, or with close family ties to the parish to fill in and return the survey, which has been posted to all households, in the freepost envelope provided. The survey will be open until mid-November.

Remembrance Day Parade from 10.30am on Sunday 9th November: A reminder of this event which includes wreath laying at the War Memorial. There will be road closures in the centre of the village from 10.30 to 11.30am so please plan any journeys to avoid these.

Thames Water Rissington Road Closure: Over the past 18 months, Thames Water has been undertaking major upgrades to the wastewater infrastructure in Bourton-on-the-Water, including improvements to the Sewage Treatment Works, Pumping Station, and the installation of two new sewer mains pipes.

As part of this essential work, they now need to excavate a section of Rissington Road to connect the newly laid gravity sewer pipe to the Pumping Station. Due to the nature of the excavation, there will be a full road closure with no vehicular access between Bourton and the Rissingtons for the duration of the works.

Thames Water has requested a road closure from Gloucestershire County Council Highways for five weeks, from 17th November to 22nd December 2025, although they are optimistic that the work will be completed sooner. A diversion route will be in place throughout the closure.

Thames Water requests residents' patience and cooperation as they carry out these vital improvements.

Date of next meetings: 7pm on Wednesday 5th November 2025 and 7pm on Wednesday 7th January 2026 in the Windrush Room at the George Moore Community Centre.


We still hope to be open until the 30th November, but it would be as well to buy what you can while stocks last!


If any of the shop fittings are of particular interest, please let us know, but we will probably need to keep them until the end.

Message from the Church

Some years ago, I lived in Hong Kong with my family. The weather was hot and humid with blue skies every day. The sun was always shining and Christmas on the beach always felt strange. Occasionally there would be a sudden change and a typhoon would blow in with torrential rain and fierce winds. I would often reflect on the change of seasons in the UK. It was one of the things I missed most but also a reminder that life can shift suddenly from calm to chaos, like summer turning into an unexpected storm.

Solomon was a very godly, wealthy man full of wisdom but who made mistakes. He wrote:

"To everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven." At the end of his life he concluded that life without God is pointless.

This month, we will take time to thoughtfully reflect on some of the darkest periods in our history and the cost to so many. We should also reflect on current wars around the world but Sunday 30th November is the first Sunday in Advent. It begins a season leading up to Christmas when the light of Jesus Christ was preparing to break into a world full of darkness. No matter the season you are currently in why not take time this advent season to reflect on the miracle of Christmas and the hope that life with Jesus brings.





We officially opened the roundhouse in September and were so grateful to the 2 skilled craftsmen (Dan and Antony) for coming back to talk to us in assembly all about how



Burial Space in Bourton-on-the-Water: Appeal for Suitable Land

The Parish Council would like to update residents on the current status of burial provision within Bourton-on-the-Water Cemetery, located on Cemetery Lane off Station Road. The available burial space at this site is now extremely limited and nearing full capacity. Unfortunately, expansion of the existing cemetery is not feasible as the adjacent allotment land, owned by the Parish Council, lies within a Scheduled Ancient Monument (SAM) site, meaning any development there would likely be prohibited due to the potential impact on archaeological heritage.

As there is no additional land currently allocated for cemetery use within the parish, the Parish Council could be unable to accommodate future burials within the parish within the next 8-10 years unless a new site can be found for this purpose.


The availability of burial space is a matter of concern for the whole parish. Being able to lay loved ones to rest within their local community is a valued tradition—one that offers comfort, continuity, and a sense of belonging. To preserve this option for future generations in Bourton-on-the-Water, it is essential that we begin planning now.

To address this, the Parish Council is appealing to landowners and residents for assistance. Council is seeking a parcel of land approximately 1 acre in size that could be considered for use as a future burial site. Ideally, the land should meet the following criteria:

Located within or close to Bourton-on-the-Water Relatively level and accessible

Bourton Vale Horticultural society your friendly garden club

What a strange year – I'm desperate to plant my bulbs but my pots are looking almost as good as they did in the summer so it seems shame to empty them. But it has to be done.

Our speaker at the October meeting was Philip Aubury and his subject was Ponds and Water features. Philip began his career as a student at the Birmingham Botanical Gardens and then studied at Pershore college. After a few years with the City's Park Department in 1987, he returned to the Botanical gardens as a Director where he stayed for 20 years before retiring in 2007. He has always had a passion for ponds and showed us how to build a pond, the best plants, that a gravel "beach" is essential to allow birds to drink and frogs to get in an out and how important it is to have the right pond in the right place. So, in a formal setting close to the house, a square/rectangular shape is best. Also a pond should have 60-70% leaf cover but also important to control the size of plants. Lots of very interesting and helpful advice.

Surprisingly we only had two entries for the competition of three dahlia stems and this was won by Pauline Chaplin.

Our next meeting is on Wednesday, 12th November, starting at the usual time of 7.30 pm in the Baptist Church Hall in Station Road, Bourton when our speaker will be David Fisher who will be giving demonstrations and advice on "Garden Equipment Maintenance". If you have any tools that need sharpening bring them along, you might be lucky and have yours sharpened or at least be told the best way to sharpen them.

The competition will be a Display of Seed Heads.



WI was given a very interesting insight into the running of the British Legion and the Poppy Appeal by Mike Marshall.

Mike spoke about how the poppy was adopted as an emblem after World War One when the mud of the Flanders battlefields was transformed as disturbed poppy seeds grew and flowered.

The British Legion helped soldiers and veterans of the First and Second World Wars and it is still helping soldiers injured in Korea, The Falklands, Northern Ireland, Bosnia, Iraq and Afghanistan.

By the 1950's there were 5500 units of the British Legion in the UK.

Many Volunteers were lost during Covid either succumbing to the disease or needing to shield with a loved one.

Some of the larger supermarkets help by taking the collecting tins into their Finance Departments and sending the money collected directly to the British Legion.

The British Legion helps veterans and their families in many ways; assistance for the homeless and the disabled, providing artificial limbs and hospital help and also dementia care and support.

22,000 veterans were helped in 2024 and that is why donations are so important. Next time you see a Poppy seller, don't cross the street to avoid them think of the important work that they are helping to fund. June

Supporting the Seabirds of Punta San Juan, Peru



In September I spent 16 days at the Punta San Juan Program in Peru, home to millions of breeding seabirds as well as Fur Seals and Sea Lions due to its location on the nutrient rich Humboldt Current. The reserve has been a protected site since 1909. However, the area is facing many issues that threaten these populations, including El Nino, Avian Influenza, Overfishing, Pollution and the effects of the Guano Harvest (digging bird poo for fertiliser).

Our main task was the construction of artificial nests for 2026. The population are not producing enough chicks so the hope is that by building 100 nests, adding to the 90 on site already, this would increase their success. Many nesting Humboldts were on the surface and vulnerable to Vultures, Gulls and exposed to the Sun, so the nests should provide some cover.

We also had to monitor the effects of the Guano Harvesting on the Penguins. Two volunteers were looking for any disturbance from the harvest & this was all put into a database going back several months.

We did a daily walk of the coast looking for tagged sea lions, and any fatalities, any interactions with rubbish and also recording any 'unusual bird species'.

My absolute favourite experience at PSJ was the day I got to join one of the biologists out on his rounds checking hard to access nests. These were in caves, you had to toss stones in first to make sure no Sea Lions were present. We were able to observe many nests and even some very small chicks, as well as Vampire Bats.

It was an incredible experience and we will continue to support PSJ and will be setting up donation points in the park.
